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TO THE HONO RABLE COUNTY COURT OF MITCHELL COUNTY, TEXAS.

Comes now, H. W. Stoneham, Special Surveyor for County Lines Lines duly appointed, gualified and acting as such, **matcheness** at the July 1907 Term of this Court, to make a survey of the Boundary Line between Mitchell and Coke Counties, Texas, and begs leaves to report as follows with reference to that part of said order referring to boundary line between Mitchell and Coke Counties, --

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(1)

That in accordance with said order a duly certified copy of the order of this court made July 15th 1907 was mailed to the County Court of Coke County, Texas, and that a sufficient time intervened between the date of adjournment of this Court and to convening of the County Court of Coke County to give the notice of said survey in the manner provided for by law. That in accordance with a request from the Surveyor of Coke County, the time of beginning the survey as fixed by said order of this court was delayed for a term of one week in order to give Coke County's Court time to make the order at their regular term; that said time having passed as per request, we got together a crew and was at the old South east corner of Mitchell County and South-west corner of Nolan County one week after the date fixed by the order of this court and waited for the appearance of a surveyor to represent Coke County one day before proceeding with the surveyment of the line as indicated and ordered by this Court.

That a reasonable time having elapsed and no one appearing to represent the interest of Coke County I proceeded to run the boundary line between said Coke and Mitchell County as directed by Articles 799 et seq R. S. Texas 1895, and the field notes of the same are hereto attached.

That said survey only fixes in a legal manner the boundary line established in March 1891 by Pattesin, surveyor, representing Coke County the line I report being a renewal and retracing thereof:

## DESCRIPTION AND FIRLD NOTES OF BOUNDARY LINE

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#### between

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## COKE AND MITCHELL COUNTIES. TEXAS.

Magnetic Declination 10 East -- Angle from Polaris 1 24' in Western Elongation

BEGINNING at a Large stone monument about 4 feet high and 3 feet in diameter, located on top of a high mountain, and marked S. E. M. Co. and S. W. N. Co., 1907--Sept. 9th 1907.-- from which a large stone mound around a large cedar tree bears due South 52.8 varas, a Large Flat Stone marked "S. W. N. Co., and S. E. M. Co. Sept., 1907---S--W. S. --- is N. E. b varas---a large stone on the East side of Silver Peak bears South 37 West; the South end of a long mountain bears South 32 East; the most southern of three peaks bears South 58 Hast; the 25th mile-stone on the North line of Coke County(going west) is due West 50 varas. This corner is situated upon the North-west Quarter of Survey No. 255, Block la of the Houston & Texas Central Railway Company surveys at a point about 344 varas South and 400 varas East of the North-west corner thereof.

Thence West along the North line of Coke County at 50 varas pass over a large Flat Stone on the West brink of a high mountain, marked N. L C. Co. 25 Mi W, at 1950 varas a large set stone marked N. L. C. Co. 26 M on North side and S. L. M. Co. W 1 Mi on South side. (crossing the west line of Survey No. 255, Block la Houston & Texas Central Railway Company surveys at a point about 340 varas South of its North-west corner).

Thence West at 1550 varas cross West line of Survey No. 230, Block 1 a Houston & Texas Central Railway Company surveys at a point 350 varas South of its North-west corner, at 1845 varas cross Little Silver Creek, at 1900.8 varas a large set stone on the west side of Little Silver Creek marked N. L. C. Co W. 27 Mi and S. L. M. Co. W 2 Mi.

Thence West entering the Sallie C. Savage Pre-Emption survey, crossing a divide and entering a mesquite flat, in all a distance of 1900 8/10 varas to a large set stone marked N. L. C. Co. W 28 Mi and S. L. M. Co. W 3 Mi. from whence Silver Peak bears South 58 East.

Thence West at 465 w ras crossed the East boundary line of Survey No. 3 Block No. 15 of the Southern Pacific Railway Company surveys, at a point 18 varas South 35 West of the North-east corner thereof, at 1100 varas crossed a sandy creek, at 1900.8 varas found set stone marked N. L C. Co. W 29 M and marked it S. L. M. Co. W 4 Mi. (This marker was made in to a large stone monument and is located in the East bank of a creek from whence a large China tree in sand hill bears South 88 West; a house on the west side of the Colorado River bears South 8 West; Silver Peak bears bears South 68 30' East East point of mountain on west side of Colorado River bears South 13 East.

Thence West at 165 varas cross Walnut Creek, at 1125 varas cross the North-west line of Survey No. 3 Elock 15 of the Southern Pacific Railway Company surveys at a point 250 varas North 35 East of its South-west corner, at 1750 varas cross the West line of Survey No. 4 Block 15 of the

Southern Pacific Rail way Company surveys at a point 300 varas North 35 W.

of its South corner, at 1900.8 varas a set stone in a sandy valley marked N. L. C. Co. W 30 Mi and S. L. M. Co. W 5 Mi. whence a gin and a house in line with it bear South 20 30'East, the point of a mountain on West side of Colorado River bears South 19 30' East.--South point of a mountain on East side of Colorado River bears South 58 30' East--Silver Peak bears South 71 30 East.

Thence West at 1750 varas cross North-west line of Survey No. 13 Block 15, Southern Pacific Railway Company surveys at a point about 800 varas North 35 East of its West corner, and crossing high sandy hill and a rocky point, in all a distance of 1900.3 varas to a large set stone in a valley, marked N. L. C. Co. W 31 Mi and S. L. M. Co. W 6 Mi. from whence Peter L. Ranch Headquarters (Elwoods) bears South 63 West, the East point of a mountain on West Side of Colorado River bears South 7 30' East; a small mesquite marked X bears North 46 West 23 varas, a 2 prong mesquite marked X bears South 72 30' West 12 varas.

Thence West at 1100 varas cross North-east line of Survey No. 15 in Block No. 15 Southern Pacific Railway Company surveys at a point 750 varas South 55 East from its North corner, at 1900.8 varas a large set stone in Colorado River bottom marked N. L. C. Co. W 32 Mi and S. L. M. Co W 7 Mi from whence a red bank bears North South 40 15 East.

Thence West at 425 varas cross the Colorado River at a point where the North-west line of Survey No. 15, Block 15 Southern Pacific Railway Company surveys crosses the same, and continuing west crossing and recrossing a small deep creek in all a distance of 1900.8 varas to a large set stone marked N. L. C. Co. W 33 Mi and S. L. M. Co. W 8 Mi, from whence a marked mesquite bears South 49 15 West 12 varas, and a large cat claw bears North 37 East 11 varas;

Thence West crossing and recrossing a small creek and a small divide between two small creeks, and crossing another small creek in all a distance of 1900.8 varas to a large stone monument set by J. R. Pattesson in March 1891 for N. W. corner of Coke County, being also the N. E. corner of Sterling County and marked N. W. Cor Coke Co. March 11 th 1891, N. E. Cor. T. G. Co. from whence a cedar mountain bears South 59 East about 3 miles; another mountain bears South 24 30' East; a mesquite 6 inches in diameter bears South 37 30'"East 64 varas. from which corner the North corner of Survey No. 2°, Block 15 of the Southern Pacific Railway Company surveys bears North 9 05' West 1042 varas and Southern corner of same bears South 9 03' East 1644 varas.
