County of Montague * Be it remembered that on this Monday, the 12th day of May, 1902, a regular term of the County Commissioners Court of Montague county was begun and holden at the Court House in the town of Montague, present and presiding the Honorable W. W. Cook, County Judge, J. F. McKee W. L. Snapp, C. C. Cooper and J. M. Singleton, County Commissioners, John W. Raines, Sheriff, and S. P. Strong, County Clerk and exofficio Clerk of said Court, when and where the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

#600. County Boundary * In the County Court of Montague County, Texas,
Survey and Marking of * May 14th, 1902.

It appearing to the satisfaction of the County Court of Montague county, Texas, that the boundary between said Montague county and Jack County is not sufficiently definite and well defined: It is hereby ordered adjudged and decreed by the County Court of Montague county, Texas, that W. A. Morris be and is hereby appointed to ascertain by actual survey the entire boundary between the said counties of Jack and Montague: the same being described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the northwest corner of Wise county, thence due west with the north line of Jack county and the south line of Montague county four miles (4) to the southwest corner of Montague county. Thence due north with the west line of Montague county to an intersection of the south line of Clay and the north line of Jack counties as said line between Jack and Clay is now established and to mark and establish the said line and corners in the manner prescribed by law.

The said W. A. Morris is further herein and hereby ordered to begin and commence said survey on Tuesday the 10th day of June, 1902, at the northwest corner of Wise county and to run, survey, mark and establish said line and corners as above described.

It is further herein and hereby ordered that the county clerk of Montague county, Texas, be and is instructed to make a true and correct

certified copy hereof and cause the same to be properly addressed, stamped, posted and mailed to the County Judge of Jack County, at Jacks boro, Texas, on or before the 17th day of May, 1902, and the said Clerk shall note in the Minutes of this Court immediately following this order, the day and hour of his compliance herewith.

It is ordered by the Court that George Spiller an experienced and competent practical surveyor proceed on the 16th day of June, 1902, to assist W. A. Morris, appointed by the County Court of Montague county in running and establishing the boundary line between the counties of Jack and Montague.

To the Hon. County and Commissioners Courts of the Counties of Montague and jack, State of Texas:

Whereas there was a certain order promulgated by the County and Commissioners Courts of the county of Montague, Texas, authorizing and directing W. A. Morris to run and establish the boundary line between Montague and Jack, which order is duly recorded in Minute Book "F" on page 256 of the Minutes of the Commissioners Court for Montague County, Texas, a copy of which order is hereto attached and marked Exhibit "A".

And Whereas, a copy of said order was duly and legally served on the County and Commissioners Courts of Jack County, Texas, as required by Article 802 of the Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, and the said County and Commissioners Courts of Jack county, Texas, acting upon said notice and order, passed and entered an order which is duly recorded in Minute Book 8 on page 73, of the Minutes of the Commissioners Court for Jack County, Texas, and a copy of which order is hereto attached and marked Exhibit "B" authorizing, appointing and directing George Spiller to proceed at the time and place specified in said order issued by the said Montague county to assist in running and establishing said line as required by law:

Therefore in obedience to the said above described orders, we W.A Morris and George Spiller met at the appointed place to-wit: The north-west corner of Wise county and proceeded to run, survey, measure, mark and establish said boundary line between the said Counties of Montague

and Jack as required by law and specified and designated in said above named orders, and now beg leave to submit to said Courts the following report:

FIELD NOTES.

Beginning at the northwest corner of Wise county as now established 3 stones set in the ground, the center one marked N.W.cor. W. and a mound of rock piled around the three stones, from which corner a ten inch P. O. bears N 53°E 12, 1-2 varas, and a 8 inch P O bears S 5°E, 12½varas. Thence west at 250 vrs. a dry branch, course north, and at 490 varas a rocky dry branch course north, and at 816 varas a drain course southeast, and at 1395 varas cross the lower Bowie and Jacksboo road, and at 1744 varas cross the west line of Section No. 50 E. T. R.R. Co. 325 varas north from the S.W. Corner of said Section No. 50 E.T. R.R.Co. and the same distance north from the south east corner of Section No. 49, E. T. R.R.Co. and at 1900 varas a stone set for the first mile corner: the said stone marked on the east side T.W., and on the north side M and on the south side J, and a mound of stone piled around this corner stone, from which corner an 8 inch P.O. bears S 78° 15' W 14, 142 varas and an 8 inch B.J. bears N 72° 15' W 9 1/5 varas.

north, and at 1744 varas cross the west line of Section No. 49, and the East line of Section No. 48 E. T. R. R. Co., 295 varas north from the S.W. Corner of Section No. 49 and the S.E corner of Section No. 48. E. T. R. R. Co. and at 1900 varas the second mile corner, a stone set for corner; the said stone is marked on the east side \text{M} and on the north side M and on the south side J and a mound of rock piled around the said corner stone, from which corner stone an 8 inch P.O bears S 44° 45' W 12 varas, and a 12 inch P.O. bears S 58° 30' E 12 varas.

Thence West on the third mile, at 80 varas a deep dry rocky

branch course northwest, and at 355 varas cross the head of a small rocky drain course northwest, and at 497 varas a dry rocky branch course north, and at 1234 varas a small drain course north and at 1324 varas a small drain, and at 1744 varas the west line of Section No. 48 and the east line of Section No. 47, E. T. R. R. Co., 170 varas north from the S.W. Corner of the said Section No. 48 and the S.E. corner of the said Section No. 48 and the S.E. corner of the said Section No. 47 E. T. R. R. Co. and at 1900 varas a stone set for the third mile corner; the said stone marked on the east side and on the north side M and on the south side J and a mound of stone piled around this corner stone, from which a 12 inch P.O. bears N 68°W 4, 1/2 varas, and a 15 inch P.O. bears N 5°W 13 varas.

Thence West on the Fourth mile at 180 varas pass the head of a short ravine course north and at 210 varas a ravine course north and at 763 varas cross the Newport and Crafton road, and this also being the east line of the John Lott survey 1357 varas south from the north east corner of the said John Lott survey and is also 130 varas north from the south line of Section No. 47, E. T. R. R. Co. as now established, and at 1000 varas the southwest corner of Montague county, a stone set for corner, and the said stone is marked S W Cor M, also marked J and a mound of stone piled around said corner stone, from which a 12 inch P. O. standing in a thicket of bushes bears S 23°W about 40 varas, another bears S 38°W about 40 varas.

Thence North at 112 varas a pile of stone heretofore made for the southwest corner of Montague county. thence north at 963 varas cross the Newport and Crafton road and at 1245 varas cross the north line of the John Lott survey and at 1724 varas cross the north line of Section No. 47 and the south line of Section No. 46, E. T. R. R. Co. 694 varas east from the northwest corner of said Section No. 47 and the southwest corner of the said Section No. 46 E. T. R. R. Co. and at 1850 varas cross a ravine course east, and at 1900 varas a corner here-tofore made for the first mile north on the west line of Montague coun-

ty, a stone 3, 1/2 feet long and nine inches square set in ground.

Thence north at 1724 varas cross the north line of Section No. 46, and the south line of Section No. 41, E. T. R. R. Co. 620 varas east from the northwest corner of the said Section No. 46 and the southwest corner of the said Section No. 41 E. T. R. R. Co., and at 1900 varas a bois d'arc post heretofore set for the second mile north on the west line of Montague county.

Thence north 418 varas to the southeast corner of Clay county, and the most western northeast corner of Jack county as has been heretofore established between Jack and Clay counties.

We also attach hereto a plat of the said line marked Exhibit "C".
