

Tuesday the 9th day of June 1846
Order No 69.

Whereas the County lines of Motley County are now in confusion. and whereas the Commissioners Courts of the Counties of Hall, Floyd and Childress have appointed their respective County Judges as their agents to define their respective County Lines. It is therefore ordered by the Court, that Motley County act with all Counties interested, to request the Commissioners of the General Land Office to appoint a competent surveyor to define the lines of Motley County, and all other Counties interested. And Motley County hereby agrees to pay Pro rata of the expenses in defining said County Lines of Motley County. And the County Judge of Motley County is hereby empowered and authorized, to carry out the business mentioned in this order.

September 16th AD 1891

Order No 122.

Ordered by the court that J. P. Bagley County Surveyor of Moiley County Texas, be and is hereby instructed to go to Ula Ford Co Texas. Thru to meet one Mr G. A. Millington a surveyor sent out by W. L. McLaughlin, Commissioner of the General Land Office to define the boundary lines of all counties interested. And to proceed and assist said Mr Millington in defining Moiley's County line.

Order No 124

Ordered by the court that the County Judge of Moiley County Texas, be and is hereby authorized to notify all adjoining counties concerned that Moiley County will proceed to define her boundary lines.

November 11th AD 1891

The Boundary line between Dickens and
 Motley Counties as surveyed by Ira Milling-
 ton State Surveyor, E. B. Ross Deputy Survey-
 or of Dickens County, and J. P. Bagley
 Surveyor of Motley County, Texas, by approval
 with the following exceptions. Grapevine
 creek is erroneously named Wolf Creek,
 should be Grape Vine, Rustler Creek is
 named Grapevine should be Rustler. Wolf
 creek is the main stream from the mouth
 of Grapevine West, this is Wolf creek proper
 The above named creeks as showed upon
 the Boundary Line map as sketched by
 the aforesaid surveyors corrected by the court.

March 22nd A.D. 1842

Whereas the The Great Ruler of the Universe
 in His infinite wisdom removed from
 our midst our worthy and esteemed
 County Surveyor J. P. Bagley. and Whereas
 the intimate relations held during a
 long business life by him with the mem-
 bers of this Court. makes it fitting that we
 record our appreciations of him. There-
 fore Resolved that with deep sympathy
 with the afflicted relations and friends of
 the deceased. We express our earnest hope
 that even so great a bereavement may be
 overruled for the highest good, moved that
 the Court adjourn with respect until
 to morrow morning at 9 O'clock

January 20th 1892

Order No 167.

Ordered by the Court that the bond of E. B. Ross as Deputy Surveyor of Motley County be, and the same is this day approved in open Court.

March 23rd AD 1892

Order No. 222.

Whereas the office of County Surveyor has been declared vacant by the death of J. P. Bagley, It is ordered & decreed by the Court that E. B. Ross be and is hereby appointed County Surveyor of Motley County Texas, and the said E. B. Ross shall take the oath of office and give bond as is required in Article 3830 Revised Statutes to be approved by the Commissioners Court

April 7th AD 1892,

Order No 242,

It is ordered by the court that Mr E. B. Ross Mailey County Surveyor be and is hereby instructed to proceed and to define the boundary lines of Mailey County. To be accompanied by the surveyors of adjacent Counties. The said defining to be done as the law directs. Said E. B. Ross to be empowered to hire teams wagons and hands and to buy provisions compensation for all work to be reasonable. And the surveyor to be paid \$3⁰⁰/₇₂ Three dollars a mile as the law directs. all pay to be in County warrants. and all accounts to be O. K. by E. B. Ross before being presented to the court for pay ment.

June 27th 1892,

Order No 282

It is ordered by the court that the East North and West boundary lines of Mailey County as defined by E. B. Ross County Surveyor be accepted.

Order No 283

It is ordered by the court that E. B. Ross County Surveyor be and is hereby instructed to go to Austin Texas with the maps and field notes of the East North and West boundary lines of Mailey County and to answer questions and to explain to H. L. McLaughlin any thing concerning said boundary lines.

Wednesday the 11th day of Nov 1892
Order No 146

Ordered by the Court that a warrant be
drawn upon the Mealy County Treasurer
for \$150 ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ One hundred and fifty dollars
in favor of Ira Millington an Jay meah
of defining the boundary line between
Dickens and Mealy Counties

Saturday the 19th day of Nov 1892
Whereas the South Boundary line of Modoc
County. the same being the north boundary
line of Dickins County. has been defined
approved & adopted and applied by this
Court. and the Commissioner of the General
Land Office. and whereas E. B. Ross County
Surveyor agrees to establish said line by
putting three feet in the ground, and two
feet out of the ground. Hewn, Cedar, Cypress
or Bois d'Arc at least eight inches in
diameter and five feet long. To be
hereafter agreed upon by the said E. B. Ross
and this Court. and the following letters to
be branded by burning in the posts
M. C. L. and figures to denote each mile
post. the said E. B. Ross to purchase the
posts of wood aforesaid:
