) signed have been
duly appointed by the counties of Ellis
and Navarro, and by the County courts
of said counties respectively, J. P. H. Nease
by the County Court of Ellis County and
D. E. Green by the County Court of Navarro,
and have duly qualified according to
law, to meet together at Robt W. Postle's
house on the west bank of the Trinity
River for the purpose of running out
and ~~establishing~~ ascertaining the true
boundary line between Ellis and Navarro
counties; and whereas we have met and
after due discussion and investigation
have wholly failed to agree as to the begin-
ning point of said line on said Trinity
River, we have formed the following issues
and articles of disagreement for the pur-
pose of submitting them to the commis-
sioner of the Land Office for his
decision as provided in sec 8 of the
act of April 22nd 1879. (appdx R.S. sec 8
page 29 & 30).

Issues.

1. Navarro County contends that the County of Ellis was properly and legally notified to send a surveyor to meet the

Surveyor from Navarro County on the
27th day of May 1882, at Pointe Bluff,
to run and ascertain the line; and that
on said day the Surveyor from Navarro
County did go to said Pointe Bluff, and
failing to meet the Surveyor from Ellis
because he did not come from Ellis,
proceeded to run said line, measured
it, put up mile posts at every mile, con-
nected said line with the other existing
surveys, made his report to the County
Court of Navarro County, and that a certified
copy of said Report was sent to the Land
Court Officer; and that the act of April 22nd
1879 was in all things complied with,
and that this action of said Surveyor of
Navarro County legally and finally settled
and established the line between the counties
of Ellis and Navarro. A certified copy of the
Report of said work accompanying this
and is marked exhibit "A".

II Navarro County contends that even
if it should be decided that Ellis County
was not legally notified to meet the
Surveyor from Navarro County at
Pointe Bluff on the 27th day of May
1882; or if for any reason it should be de-
termined that the line run and marked

by the Navarro County Surveyor at that time is not conclusively and legally established as the boundary line between Ellis and Navarro, that the true Beginning point for said line is one mile measured north in the direction and west to get to the west bank of the Trinity River; that is that the said point is where a parallel of latitude one mile north of Porters house intersects the west bank of the Trinity River. Navarro contends that this is the point indicated in the act of Jan'y 28th 1850 defining the boundaries of Navarro County (R.S. art 866).

III. Navarro County, contends that the true construction of the act of July 31st 1876 places this point at precisely the same place as the act of 1850. (R.S. art 771.) That one mile northwardly by the meanders of the river from Robt B. Porters house on the west bank of the River, properly construed, signifies that the difference of latitude between Porters house and the corner of the counties must be one mile; and that the words "northwardly" and by the meanders of the river merely meant to signify that the point thus defined

was not due south of Porter's house,
but was west as well as north.

IV. Navarro contends that if the corner
of the counties was one mile north on
the meridian, and where the parallel
of latitude which is this distance from
said house intersects the west bank of
the Trinity River under the act of Jan'y
28th 1850 that the act of July 31st 1876 could
not change this corner and place it
further south or nearer Porter's house,
because the effect of that would be to
cut off territory from an existing county,
(Navarro) and attach it to an existing
county (Ellis) without submitting the
matter to a vote of the people; and this
is in direct violation of sec 3 of art 9
of the Constitution of 1876.

V. Navarro contends that the line
was run and established by the
Commissioners appointed to cut off Ellis
County from Navarro under the act
of 1848, while Navarro now claims it;
and where his surveyor ran it in
May 1882; that said line was recog-
nized and known as the true line
between the counties until the act of
July 31st 1876 was passed; that prior

undersigned County Surveyor of Navarro County
and Surveyor appointed by your Honorable
Body to ascertain & fix the boundary line
between Ellis and Navarro Counties under
the provisions of the act of the Legislature of
the State of Texas, entitled, "an act," establishing
and prescribing the manner of ascertaining
the boundaries of Counties approved April
22nd 1879 having qualified according to law
and performed the duties set out in said
act respectfully submits the following.

1st That he proceeded on the day appointed
by your body after notice given to the County
Judge of Ellis Co., to Pantar's Bluff, to wit: on
Monday the 27th day of May 1882, and was then
present all that day, and for two days thereafter
that the Surveyor from Ellis Co. did not make
any appearance on said day, nor at any
time, theredfter whilst he was engaged in
running the line.

2nd That finding no Surveyor from Ellis County
he proceeded to establish and run alone
the line dividing the Counties of Ellis and
Navarro as follows.

3rd He began on the spot on which the
house of Robert H. Pantar stood as pointed

out to him by old citizens, and run a line
thence due West one mile carefully measuring
the same, and from this point due North one
mile (var. of needle 9° East) which fixed a
point on the North bank of the Trinity River
one mile North of Robt. H. Porters house
that is to say the point thus ascertained is
at a point on the West bank of the Trinity
river where a parallel of latitude one mile
North on the meridian from Robert H. Porters
house intersects said West bank of Trinity
river. He found at this point the old and
original corner of the two counties to wit:
the N.E. corner of Navarro and the S.E.
corner of Ellis. marked on a large box
elder tree and a large live oak. He then
ran S 60° W. following very nearly one old and
plainly marked line for two miles or to
the edge of the prairie passing about 200
yds North of Mrs Neale's place. carefully
measuring the line, at 21 miles and 1100 yds
he came opposite the mouth of Mill Creek
and was 640 yds N 30° W. of the same which
necessitated a connection of the line in
course of 11 minutes. he then run on the
line S 60° W. (a variation of 8° 50' E. which is the
true variation of the needle as near as the
same has been ascertained for this point.)

and at 34 miles and 900 vs he came
opposite the corner of Hill County as es-
tablished by Wm. Vaughn in 1881. Surveyor
of Hill County came out 40 vs N 30 W of
the cedar post erected by him for a mon-
ument. He then went back, and having
procured Basswood posts at Rice four
feet long, and 4 inches at least square
he erected these at every mile putting the
same two feet in the ground and two feet
out cutting in deep letters "E.C." in the North
and "N.C." on the South side of each one, pla-
cing these post on the line as corrected. He
also made connections with all the surveys that
the true line as thus established intersects, and
has calculated the number of acres of each sur-
vey so intersected in each County, as will be
seen by exhibits A & B & C hereto attached
and made apart of this report, all of which
is most respectfully submitted this the 15 day of
August AD 1882

Field notes of the Ellis & Navarro County line
Beginning at a point on the west bank of the
Trinity River, where a parallel of latitude one

- mile north on the meridian of Rкт H. Parsons house intersects said West bank a post 2 feet high and 4 inches square with Letters E.C. on North side & N.C. on south side for monument and Box Elder 18 inches dia. & Burr oak 20 in dia. marked as pointers. Thence $1\frac{1}{2}$ M. S $60^{\circ}50'W$ at 1900 yrs. or one mile just Boid' are post 2 feet high & four inches square mkl'd as above.
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ M. At 1900 more on same course 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile post stands in past oak timber in a low place not far from and opposite to Mr. Sands farm, monument same as $1\frac{1}{2}$ & same marks
- $3\frac{1}{2}$ M. At 1900 yrs more on same course 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile state inside of Mrs. Neals pasture in a meadow quite flat (on this mile passed about 175 yrs N 30 W. of Mrs. Neals House) monument same as above and same marks
- $4\frac{1}{2}$ M. At 1900 yrs more on same course 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile Post in a cotton field on the North side of a Bais' D'arc hedge monument same as above and same marks
- $5\frac{1}{2}$ M. At 1900 yrs ^{more} on same course 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile Post in the bed of a ravine and unbroken front of field monument same as above and same marks.
- 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ M. at 1900 yrs on same course 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile Post in a field not far from the fence. monument same as above.

- 7th M. Mile at 1900 was on same course set 7th mill post in bed of a branch whence an Elm 5 in dia. bxs N 47 E 1 yard & do 8 in dia N 56 1/2 W 8 varas. monument same as above.
- 8th M. At 1770 enter Mearchams pasture (at 900 on his line crossed the west line of T. J. Chambers 8 league 4200 vs. N 42 W from his extreme S.W. corner and T. M. Rawa C line 170 vs S 42 E from his N.E. corner) at 1900 was set post in Mearchams pasture. monument same as above.
- 9th M. At 1208 crossed Houston & Texas central R.R. at 1028 we crossed M. Jones East line 400 vs N 30 W from his S.E. corner & 70 vs. N 30 W from T. M. Rawa to corner at 1900 was set mile post in prairie. monument same as above.
- 10th M. At 400 crossed Jones West line. at 600 was crossed East line of J. O. Smith 400 vs S 30 E passes his N.E. corner at 1900 was mile post in his west line S 30 E 400 vs from his N.W. corner. Post stands in A.C. McGreens field 10 vs. south of branch monument same as above.
- 11th M. At 1900 was 11th mile post stands 100 vs N 60 E from timber of Cummings Creek monument same as above.
- 12th M. At 100 vs enter timber of Cummings Creek

crossing said creek at 700 vns crossed
West line of John Wood and East line of
Blevins. At 1900 vns. Mill stake in, ardene
field in West line of Blevins survey 300 vns
N 30 W. passes his S.W. corner in east line of
Geo B. McKinstry. This stake N 60 E 50 vns
passes a Rais' & arc. hedge monument as above,

13th M. At 1900 vns. stake in Desser's field field, about
200 vns. N 60 E of a branch in the head of
which stands a lone pecan and another pecan
bxs. S 30 1/2 E 125 vns. (this is a lone pecan
standing on a hill) monument same as above.

14th M. Mile at 1900 vns cross oak branch at 900
vns enter timber of Waxahachie Creek stake
in low swampy bottoms. monument same
as above.

15th M. Mile at about 600 vns cross Waxahachie
Creek about \$50 vns below the mouth of
Oneon Creek (at 600 vns on this mile crossed
the West line of McKinstry and East
line of Raft Ray. 2100 vns. S 30 E. 2350 vns
spans the N.W. corner of McKinstry & N.E. of
Ray surveys. At 1900 vns. mill stake in
low swampy bottom. monument same
as above.

16th M. At 1700 vns crossed a large lake course S 30 E
1900 vns. stake in Cedar Creek bottom about
200 vns. South West of said creek monument

same as above in low flat.

17th M. At 1225 we crossed the West line of Roht Ray and East line of Jas Garwood surveys 2800 yrs from the N.W. corner of said Ray. at 1900 yrs stake in low marsh South 30° E of a lake monument same as above (this stake or monument stands N 30 W. 83 1/2 yrs, & N 60 E 160 yrs from where it belongs, the point is accessible from high water)

18th M. At — we crossed the West line of James Garwood and East line of Chas Frazier 1800 yrs, S 30° E of N.W. of Garwood & N.E. of Frazier surveys a stake in mesquite flat near east edge of Chambers Creek bottom in a pecan thicket whence an Elm. 12 in mld x lbs N 60 E 5 yrs. monument same as above.

19th M. At 1900 yrs stake in mesquite flat in North edge of Chambers Creek bottom stake on a Prairie Forks stone. has N. 600 yrs monument same as above,

20th M. At 625 cross West line of Chas Frazier and East line of W.H.C. Cameron survey. S 30° E 450 yrs from the N.E. corner of said Cameron. at 1900 stake in West edge of ravine & in North edge of Chambers Creek bottom in Goodwins field about 30 yrs. West of a Pecan thicket, monument same as above.

⁸ 21st M. At 625 yrs cross the West line of W. H. Caw
eon, and last line of the No. 8 A.C. Cage survey
S 30 E 450 vs from the N.W. of Cameron & N.E. of
Cage at 1900 vs stake in low flat bottom,
monument same as above.

22nd M. At 1100 yrs came to the mouth of
Mill Creek.

23rd M. Commencing at the mouth of Mill Creek
thence S 60 W. (variation 8° 50' E.) at 1900 vs
stake N 30 W. 500 yrs from the North. line
of the G. A. Giddings survey. Stake between
Chambers & Mill Creek.

24th M. At 1900 yrs stake stands N 30 W. 100 yrs from
the North line of the Alex Bond survey at 1900.

25th M. At 1900 yrs stake in Mill Creek, bottom on
North side of Creek monument same as above.

26th M. At 910 yrs crossed Mill Creek. vs East
at 1900 yrs stth. in low bottom. Elbow 5 m. line.
N 75 E 3 yrs & Elbow S 12 E. 2 yrs. monument
same as above.

27th M. At 1235 yrs, passed the N. W. corner of M. Whit
aker. N 30 W. 100 yrs from same & crossed N. N.
Dalton line S 30 E 90 yrs from his N.E. corner
at 1900 yrs set stth. in pasture S 60 W. 50 yrs.
of a round monument same as above.

28th M. At 1900 yrs stake in Armstrong's field N 60 E
490 from a large tank about 4 or 500 yrs
N 29 W. of his house. Monument same as above.

that the action taken by the
County Commissioners Com-
of Navarro County toward
establishing the boundary lines
between said counties, was
void and of no effect.

First: Because the jurisdiction
and power to ascertain such
boundaries is by law conferred
upon the "County Court" and
not upon the "County Com-
missioners Court;" See, Acts-1879-Chap.
129,-Page-137. Also Atty General's letter construing
this act. Hereto attached and
marked Exhibit A.

Second. Because if said Court
had such power. The order
made by said Court does
not comply with the law regula-
ting the establishing of County
Boundaries. Said order recites
thus "D.E. Green, the County Surveyor
be and he is hereby authorized
to proceed as soon as the
proper notice is given to the
County Surveyor of Ellis County,
Plumas, the law provides

That said Court shall appoint an
experienced and ^{competent} practical surveyor
to perform such work, and
further provides that said Surveyor
shall before entering upon
such duties take the oaths of
office prescribed for County Surveyors
and shall give Bond &c.

And it further provides that
the Court making such order
shall cause a copy of same to
be sent to the County Courts
of the Counties interested in
such boundaries, stating the
time and place when and where
said survey shall begin, &c.,
Now the court made by the
"County Commissioners Com-
of Navarro County" recites that
"the work shall be done when"
"the County Judge aware is"
which is in contravention of
the law. Said court fails to
remit when and where said
survey shall begin. For these,
and many other failures to com-
ply with the law, this County holds
that she is not bound by said
acts of Navarro County.

Ellis County claims the right to
begin on the West bank of the
Trinity river, at a point which
by the meanderings of said
river, will be one mile north
wardly from Robert N. Parker's house,

opposite the mouth of Mill Creek.
Because to go one mile North
from said Parker's house, on
a straight line would carry
you to a point East of said
River and in Kaufman
County. In conclusion Ellis
County asks to be instructed
at what point said survey

is respectfully submitted.


