I have now fully sketched the following lines which may be of some benefit to the Draftsmen in compiling the maps of Jasper & Newton. I commenced opposite the mouth of Village Creek on the East Bank on the River River thence East through the stream 1600 rods to the high bank & land at 3000 rods wide at 3640

The Beaumont and Jasper Road, at 5620 a Gully at 6950 vs Nix's Ferry Road at 7230 vs ten mile Creek wide at 9410 vs

a creek road wide at 12100 was Katsay Lenney's S.E. corner is due North at 420 was due at the end of Lavaux Grange South line 138

line 19630 was North of the line at 9630 was an old Road at 19.885 was it at 1040 was South to Coler or Sheep Laborat 21630

21632 was a Branch 21 rods wide at 21800 was Cow Bayou marsh at 21800

23250 was the west bank of Cow Bayou West fork at 23350 was to the east or main fork at 23680 was the corner of Jasper & Newton at a cluster of Sweet Gums marked X & Hacks

I continued this line 1200 was from the Bayou but did not find John Collier's corner I then ran the line between Newton & Jasper

line between Newton & Jasper this line is marked with one ¹²⁰⁰ Hack on each side of the tree line trees with blaze marks below, on the Orange line all the marks are blazed, Beginning at the 5 Gums then North 57° E at 240 vs to Cow Bayou 8 rods wide at 1000 was grove of small Pines at 1900 & Pine mhd 1.M at 3802 was a Black Gum in Newton marked 11.M at 4000 was a White Oak mhd four notches at 5703 vs a Pine in Newton mhd 11.M at 7000 was a Red Oak 18 inches diam line tree mhd with seven notches at 7603 a Magnolia in Jasper & a Holly in Newton both mhd 14.M at 8000 was

a 10-inch Pine Oak marked with eight notches at 9000 was
Black Gum 2 foot diam marked with 12 notches & at 9504 was a Hickory 1 foot in diam on the Jasper side of the
line marked 11. At 10,000 was a small Pine one on each
side of the line marked with 10 hacks at 11,000 was a live
Oak in Newton & a Pine in Jasper marked with 11 hacks
at 11020 ¹¹⁷⁶⁰ at 11,160 was across a small Branch & was wide leaf 11.160 was on

this line from Cow Bayou to this point. It has been a

E 1155 - 103 and 101m 155 was a line running East with the
same variation as the line below
leaving it at corner Burnham. This is same variation 7° 30' as the line below
is 7° 30' and will not make the Newton Surveyor run all his
line at 2015
I found two old lines at this variation at 2015 was a
corner made by Burnham a Stake from which a Pine 1 foot diam
brs N 79° W 3⁰⁰ was & a Pine 2 foot diam brs N 52° W 3⁰⁰ was dist from
this corner a line run East with the same variation East 2035 was
a Post for corner from which a dead Pine 40 inches diam brs
S 67^{1/2} E 8⁰⁰ was dist marked H T & a Pine 4 inch diam brs N 36^{1/2} E
(Newton County line)

North & there is then no line running East, but there is
a plainly marked black line running West this I follow 1
mile & find a line running North but no line West or
South. I then return to the Black Gum & White Bay corner

 & an Oak stump bns. S 88 W 130 & an Oak stump bns. S 38 W 25
 was dist no bearings standing here & I could not get the field
 notes to see what the bearings are, I continue the line East
 and Gathries South line & arrived at 451'E at 1883 was corner
 Pine markd X bns. N 67 W 5 rods dist 3 feet Pine S 82 W 9 rods dist, no line
 running South East at 340 was the Kenton & Orange Road at ⁵⁴³
