The County Courts of both Tarrant and Parker Counties have appealed to Jerry Sadler, Land Commissioner of the State of Texas, to aid in the settlement of a long standing dispute over the location of the boundary line between the two counties. Sadler agreed to honor their requests and establish a boundary line that would be fair and equitable to all concerned which would be based as near as possible on the original survey line between the two counties.

Sadler in accepting the problem pointed out that it was his desire to be as helpful as possible in solving this long standing problem. Sadler stated that Licensed Land Surveyors employed in the Land Office working under his supervision could establish sufficient key points that would enable the establishment of a boundary line that would be fair and just for the benefit of all concerned. The location of a definite line would make it possible for property owners to determine which county their property is in.

Both Commissioner's Courts have agreed by letter to honor Commissioner Sadler's final ruling and expressed confidence in his judgment.

GENERAL LAND OFFICE July 21, 1965

Texas Land Commissioner Jerry Sadler today mailed a description and plat of the long disputed location of the county line between the North Texas Counties of Parker and Tarrant to the Commissioner's Courts of each county. Sadler stated that the description was released only after an intensive study was made of all facts and records pertaining to the location of the line and a survey of the line made on the ground.

Sadler said that the General Land Office became involved with locating the line when the Commissioner's Courts of both counties asked him to settle the dispute by locating the proper line on the ground for them. In accepting the responsibility of locating the line on the ground, Sadler aided the Commissioner's Courts and made it possible for the citizens and taxpayers of Parker and Tarrant Counties to determine the exact location of their property in reference to the county line.
