Dear Sir:

I have - at the last meeting of the Commissioners - been appointed to represent Potter County in running the County boundaries from the 100<sup>th</sup> meridian to the south east corner of Potter and wish your opinion as to the proper method of correcting for the curvature of the earth. Whether to allow for the excess, caused by the divergence of the meridians, from the north line of the Pan-handle to this latitude by lengthening our line; or to consider there will be two lines of corners between each tier of counties; or that the west boundary of each county should be parallel to the 100<sup>th</sup> meridian is right. As the Statute provides for no correction ~~some~~ I am undecided as to what method is correct but think the intention of the Statute is that the boundaries shall be in parallels and meridians and that the corner of one county shall be the common corner of all counties adjacent.
