Field notes of a Survey of the Boundary line between the
Counties of Glasscock and Reagan by virtue of an order
of the Commissioners Court of said Counties

Sept. 1st 1904 1st mile Beginning at the South East corner
of Midland County a large Sand Stone three feet high
and ten inches square mkd S.E. Cor. M.C. On top face
and S.W. Cor. G. Co. On East face and Nov. 1901 On its
West face whence S.E. corner of survey No 14 Blk N 37
T P Ry Co lrs 85° 45' E 519 var.

We determine in true meridian by observation on
polarus Magnetic Variation $10^{\circ} 49'$ East the 2nd mile
stone on East line of Midland County bears North One mile
Thence East over firm level prairie 1900.8 varas Set a
stone in ground marked R. Co. 11 from which a wind
mill bears South $00^{\circ} 25'$ West about 300 Varas
2nd Mile Thence East over firm level prairie 1900.8 Varas
to a large Circular Earth mound

3rd. Mile Thence East over firm prairie 1900.8 Varas to a
large circular Earth mound

4th Mile Thence East at 182 Varas cross a fence and at
a point from which old stone mds bis 300¹⁰ varas, set a large circular Earth
mound capped with stone

5th Mile Thence East over firm prairie at 1351 varas pass
a pile of stone on East side of road 1900.8 varas large
earth mound from which Moore's wind mill bears
North $10^{\circ}, 15'$ East

6th Mile Thence East at 348 varas cross a fence 1900.8 varas
Set a stone mkd. R. Co. 4 ME on South face and G. Co. On
North face

X Determine true meridian by observation on polarus
Magnetic Variation $10^{\circ} 42'$ East

Sept 2nd 1904

7th Mile Thence East over firm prairie 1900.8 varas Set a

Stone mkd. R. Co. 7 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face from which wind mill bears South $84^{\circ} 35'$ East another wind mill bears North $48^{\circ} 20'$ East another mill bears South $41^{\circ} 35'$ East

8th mile Thence East passing on north side of Burries house and through field 1900.8 varas to a stone set in a basin mkd. R. Co. 8 M. E. on South face and G. Co. on North face

9th mile Thence East over firm mesquite prairie 1900.8 varas set a stone mkd. R. Co. 9 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

10th mile Thence East at 487 varas cross Burries East fence 1900.8 varas mkd. R. Co. 10 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

11th mile Thence East over firm rolling mesquite prairie 1900.8 varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 11 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

12th mile Thence East over firm rolling prairie 1900.8 varas to a stone set in lake basin mkd. R. Co. 12 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

13th mile Thence East over firm rolling mesquite prairie 1900.8 varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 13 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

14th mile Thence East over firm mesquite prairie and crossing a plain road corre N.E. 1900.8 varas to a stone mkd. G. Co. on North face and R. Co. 14 ME on South face

Sept. 3rd 1904

15th mile Thence East passing about 400 varas South of a lake and 1320 varas cross the tiles and garden city Road at a stone set in ground and mkd. Co. L i N E at 1900.8 varas set a stone mkd. R. Co. 15 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face.

16th mile Thence East over firm level mesquite prairie 1900.8

Varus to a stone mkd. R. Co. 14 ME on South face and G. Co. on north face from which a meast. 4" in dia. brs. S. 10° 10' E. 39 $\frac{3}{4}$ Varus.

17th mile Thence East over firm prarie and crossing a fence and passing on North edge of a lake 1900.8 Varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 17 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

18th mile Thence East passing through heavy Mesquite brush 1900.8 Varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 18 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

19th mile Thence East through mesquite brush 1900.8 Varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 19 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

20th mile Thence East at 1290 Varas Bagarts west fence and enter small farm 1900.8 Varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 20 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

21st mile Thence East through heavy mesquite brush at 1240 Varas cross fence on the South boundry of the T. & P. Ry Co. 80 miles reservation in West edge of a small lake 278 Varas from the South West corner of Survey No. 48 Block No. 34 at 1900.8 Varas set a stone mkd. R. Co. 21 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

22nd mile Thence East through thick mesquite brush 1900.8 varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 22 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face.

Sept 4th 1904

23rd mile Thence East through thick brush 1900.8 Varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 23 ME on south face and G. Co. on North face

24th mile Thence East at 220 Varas cross an opening cut through brush 1900.8 Varas Set a stone mkd. R. Co. 24 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face

25th mile Thence East 1900.8 Varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 25 M.E. on South face and G. Co. on North face

26th mile Thence East at 920 Varas pass 40 Varas South of Fisks house 1900.8 Varas Set a stone in a stone mound mkd. R. Co. 26 ME

On South face and G. Co. on North face.

27th Mile Thence East at 1093 Varas point from which the S. W. corner of No. 92-lbs. North 52 Varas at 1200 Varas pass set Stone 1900.8 Varas Set a stone mkd. R. Co. 27 ME on South face and G. Co. On North face from which a mesquite 5" in dia. lbs. N. $65^{\circ} 35' E$ 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ Varas Pucks Wind mill lbs. N. $88^{\circ} 15' W$

28th Miles Thence East over open prarie and crossing a fence and a drain corse south 1900.8 Varas to a Stone marked R. Co. 28 ME on south face and G. Co. On North face 29th mile Thence East 1900.8 varas to a stone mkd. R. Co. 29 ME on South face and G. Co. on North face from which a mesqt. lbs. N. $71^{\circ} E$ 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ Varas Hs. lbs. S. $18^{\circ} W$. 53 $\frac{3}{4}$ Varas A Wind mill lbs. N. $11^{\circ} 45' E$.

30th Mile Thence East at 1074 Varas cross fence 1900.8 Varas to a large lime stone five feet long set in the ground for the S.E. corner of Glasscock County and the North East corner of Reagan County Said stone is marked STERLING CO. LINE SEPT. 5. 1904 on its East face and S.E. Cor. G. Co. | N. E. Cor. R. Co. On West face from which a mesquite 6" in dia. lbs. N. $44^{\circ} W$. 154 $\frac{1}{2}$ Varas a double mesquite lbs N. $89^{\circ} 10' E$. 223 Varas




