It appearing to the Court that the boundary line between Reeves and Presidio Counties is vague and indefinite, therefore.

It is the order of the Court that the County Surveyor of Reeves County be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to survey, mark and establish said boundary line as required by law, and that the place <sup>and time</sup> of beginning said survey shall be at Warilo Spring on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1887.

The Special Bond of E. P. Hail County Surveyor for the faithful performance of his duty, as required law in surveying the boundary line between Reeves and Presidio Counties was this day examined and approved in open Commissioners Court.

On this day came E. P. Hail County Surveyor of Reeves County Texas, heretofore appointed by this Court to survey, establish and mark as required by law, the boundary line between Reeves and Presidio Counties, and report<sup>ed</sup> to

the Court that said line had been surveyed as required by law; and after being duly sworn, stated on oath, that the distance actually and necessarily run, and charged for in establishing said line is  $77\frac{1}{2}$  miles; and that the number of monuments established and charged for is 36; And it appearing to the Court that said line had been established as required by law, therefore,

It is ordered by the Court that he have his warrant for (\$412<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub>) that being the full amount of his claim for said services, Provided however, that the County Clerk shall issue said warrant or warrants, in said amount, when the field notes of said survey shall have been properly filed, and not until then.

Beginning at a stone mound on  
the western edge of Parilo Spring.

Thence N. 52.° W. 1 mile to a stone mound  
marked 1, two miles to a stone mound  
marked 2, Three miles to a stone mound  
marked 3 Four miles to a stone mound  
marked 4. Five miles to a stone mound  
marked 5, Six miles to a stone mound  
marked 6, Seven miles to a stone mound  
marked 7, Eight miles to a stone mound  
marked 8, Nine miles to a stone mound  
marked 9, Ten miles to a stone mound  
marked 10. Eleven miles to a stone mound  
marked 11, Twelve miles to a stone mound  
marked 12. Thirteen miles to a stone mound  
marked 13. Fourteen miles to a stone mound  
marked 14.

At fourteen miles and 1100 Varas a  
large stone mound, marked 9. T. 10. 55. B.  
56. bears N 14° 20. E. 340 Varas distant.

Fifteen miles to a stone mound marked  
15. and is situated at the foot of the  
mountains.

Sixteen miles to a stone mound marked  
16. at sixteen miles and 1250 Varas. a  
mound of earth and stone, set on the  
east side of the road from Toyah Creek  
to Fort Davis. Seventeen miles to a stone



mound marked 17. Eighteen miles to a stone mound on the eastern edge of an Arroyo, called San. Salomon. Nineteen miles to a stone mound marked 19.

At Nineteen miles and 800 varas at Phantom Lake bears S. 48° W 600 varas distant. Twenty miles to a stone mound marked 20. Twenty One miles to a stone mound marked 21. Twenty Two miles to a stone mound marked 22. Twenty three miles to a stone mound marked 23.

Twenty four miles to a stone mound <sup>marked</sup> ~~24~~ 24. and situated on the East side of the road from Phantom Lake to San. Martin Spring.

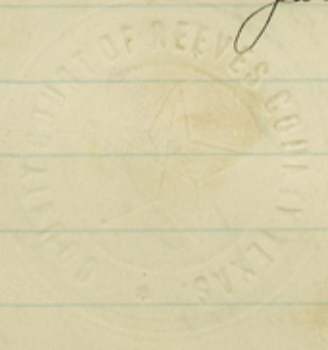
