

At a term of the County Commissioners Court, held in and for Refugio County, at the Court House thereof in the town of Refugio, beginning on the 11th day of May 1891, and ending on the same day, Hon. James O. Coffey County Judge, Presiding. The following proceedings were had and done, to-wit:—

Report of M. D. O'Sullivan County Surveyor to the Hon. Commissioners Court of Refugio County, Texas.

I have the honor of submitting the following report for your consideration, in accordance with a decree of the Court; On the 2^{3rd} day of January I proceeded in company of J. E. Elgin of Aransas County, to run off the boundary line between the said County of Aransas and Refugio as aforesaid. We began at a rock the N. corner of the Labalatrier survey, offset to Bay 32.9 vrs. Thence with the meanders of Espirita Santo Bay S. 60° E. 222 vrs. S. 61½ E. 74 vrs. S. 66½ E. 374 vrs. S. 80 E. 246.9 vrs. S. 50 E. 100 vrs. offset West 6 vrs. and south 28.9 vrs. for cor. of this survey. Thence south 200 vrs. offset East to avoid Lake, 210.06 vrs. Thence with meanders of Bay S. 43 E. 105 vrs. S. 34 E. 183 vrs. S. 12 E. 472 vrs. S. 14 W. 200 vrs. S. 22 W. 200 vrs. S. 31 W. 500 vrs. S. 5 W. 688 vrs. S. 17 E. at 28 vrs. offset S. 73 W. 6 vrs. S. 17 E. at 1080 vrs. offset back N. 73 E. 20 vrs. S. 17 E. at 1560 vrs. Change course, S. 5 E. 1075 vrs. S. 9.40 vrs. set a stake from which a rock for supposed corner of Salburg survey bears N. 9 W. 93.6 vrs. — — — Not being satisfied with the foregoing meanders, we went back to the rock we started from

and run up the Flores and Reynolds surveys,
N. 56 W. 527.6 vs. offset, N. 14.3 vs. Thence N.
66 W. 227.3 vs. N. 60 W. 488 vs. N. 56 W. 523.3
vs. N. 52 W. 255 vs. on this course we passed
J. Ayres house N. 54 W. 379.3 vs. N. 45 W. 156.4
vs. N. 48 1/2 W. 729.9 vs. N. 31 W. 268 vs. Thence
S. 15 W. 20.3 vs. to a stake and rock set for the
lower cor. of Collier survey on Ayres Bay.
Next went to the N. E. cor. of the Jones
survey on Espirita Santo Bay, a rock from
which a Live oak 3 in. in diam. bears N.
7 1/2 E. 728 vs. Thence N. 6 1/2 E. 307 vs. offset
S. 83 1/2 E. 6 vs. Thence N. 6 1/2 E. 245 vs.
offset S. 83 1/2 E. 60 vs. Thence N. 6 1/2 E. 124.4 vs.
a stake S. 83 1/2 E. 120 vs. for N. E. cor. of the
South Duval survey. Thence N. 31 1/2 E. with
line of North Duval survey, 288 vs. offset N.
58 1/2 W. 20 vs. N. 31 1/2 E. 502 vs. offset S.
31 1/2 E. 20 vs. to the line of survey of upper
Duval, Thence S. 87° 45' W. 27.2 vs. a rock
for N. E. cor. of upper Duval survey, from
which a Hackberry marked L bears S. 69 3/4 W.
74 3/4 vs. Thence N. 42 E. 780 vs. N. 45 E.
524 vs. a stake from which a rock set for
the Wigginton N. E. cor. bears N. 88 1/4 E. Thence
N. 57 E. 407 vs. E. 211 vs. N. 20 E. 109.9 vs.
N. 15 E. 184 vs. N. 5 W. 100 vs. to a rock supposed
to be set by Winsor for County Corner. Began
at said Rock and run West with a variation
of N. 7° 30' E. 553 vs. set a stake at 882 vs.
set another in open glade, about 1/2 pass W of
young timber, at 1240 vs. enter black jack
timber, at 1900 vs. a stake and blaze 2 black-
jack trees, on S side of line, at 3286 1/2 vs.
set a stake, and continuing W. at 3700 vs. leave

timber, at 3818 vs. a blackjack apparently
 marked 11 and correct distance from the N.W.
 Cor. of the J. Newcomb survey, at 3862 vs. set
 a stake. Thence S. 520 vs. enter the timber, at
 750 vs. leave timber and continue S. at 950 vs.
 Change course and run E. 30 vs. a stake, and
 continued E. 80 vs. and thence N. $39\frac{1}{2}$ vs. to
 a stake, then return to stake on E. course 30 vs.
 E. of the point where we changed course, and run
 N. 335 vs. a large rock, corner of Duke, bears
 S. 72 vs. at 445 vs. put a stake for the N.
 W. corner of the Wigginton survey, Thence N.
 and at 18 vs. cross old Mid line supposed
 to be the back line of said Wigginton survey.
 Total Westings to this point 4277 vs. Contin-
 ue N. and at 1094 vs. set a stake on line of
 Meyers and Maine survey, at 1343 vs. set a
 stake for three miles from Bay in a glade
 just N. of the road running from Dukes
 to the Bergantine Creek or Nyles Pen. at
 2343 vs. set a stake for the Meyers and
 Garrett survey in a line oak glade just N.
 of a young live oak (no tt. at 3223 vs.
 set a stake for 4 miles, at 3888 vs. the
 S.E. corner of J. Nyles W. windmill is N.
 14 vs. at 4512 vs. Bergantine Creek. Come
 back on line at 4400 vs. offset S. 2120 vs.
 Then continue N. and resuming distance 4400
 vs. at 4620 vs. Smiths fence, offset 360
 vs. set stake, then continue N. at 5133 vs.
 set a stake for 5 miles, at 5240 vs. offset
 S 312 vs. to Bergantine Creek, and S.E. Cor.
 of the Nitcher survey, Thence N. at 5560
 vs. offset N. 200 vs. to avoid Bergantine
 Creek and continuing N. at 7023 vs. set
 stake for 6 miles, at 7140 vs. set a stake for

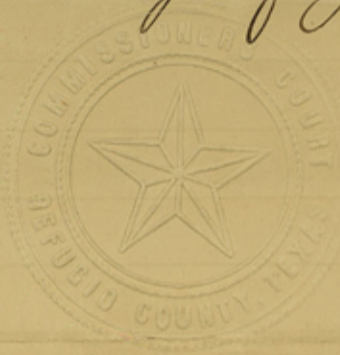
the W. line of the Kitchie survey, at 8923
 vrs. set a stake for 7 miles, at 9791 1/2 vrs.
 stake on line of Himmenees and Knighton
 surveys, at 10240 vrs strike lake on Willow
 Creek, at 10880 vrs. W. bank of lake, set a
 stake, it being 57 vrs. W. of the 8 miles,
 and continuing W. at 11700 vrs the W. bank
 of another lake, at 12336 1/2 vrs. set a stake
 on line of Knighton and Condon surveys,
 at 12723 vrs. a stake for 9 miles, at 14623
 vrs. a stake for 10 miles, at 16523 vrs. a
 stake for 11 miles, at 17620 vrs. a large Mes-
 quit stump hrs. N. 3 vrs. at 18423 vrs. a
 stake for 12 miles, Thence S. 81 W. 400 vrs. Salt
 Creek, 1900 vrs. a stake for 13 miles, W. of
 Benson Mott. at 3800 vrs. 14 miles, at 5700 vrs.
 15 miles, just W. of OConnors fence, at 7600
 vrs. 16 miles, at 9500 vrs. 17 miles, at 11400
 vrs. a stake for 18 miles, at 13300 vrs. a stake
 for 19 miles. Thence S. 61 W. 2000 vrs. N. 67 W.
 340 vrs. N. 45 1/2 W. 74 vrs. to bank of Copano
 Creek, set a Cedar post for corner of Refugio
 and Aransas Counties from which the mouth
 of the little Alameda Creek bears N. 25 W.
 20 vrs. Then beginning at said Cedar Post
 marked ^AC on S. side and ^RE on N. side, run
 the true line N. 80° 27' E. with the variation
 of N. 72° 30' E. and set mile Posts of Cedar
 and marked with the initial letters of the
 Counties and number of miles. Distance or
 length of true line 38500 vrs. Distance or
 length of trial line 61960 vrs. Total 100460 vrs.
