The measurement coming out very near the  
bank of a branch (N.E.); from the point last  
above mentioned, I measured south <sup>1580</sup>  
vrs. and found a mound and 4 pits well <sup>defined</sup> ~~marked~~  
from there I measured south 2012 vrs. and  
found mound and 4 pits plainly marked, and  
the next mound and pits were found at  
3758 vrs. south from this point, (last described)  
I then measured south from the pits and mound  
last named above, 1900 vrs. and found a mound  
and 4 pits, which mound and pits are 14  
miles and 1545 vrs. West and 1800 vrs. South  
from the N.E. corner of Roberts County, by  
check made by me on Iron pipe formerly  
set by me at 15 miles <sup>west</sup> from said County  
corner; in regard to the large rock mound  
described in your letter, will say that I  
made diligent search and inquired of men

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who had been intimately acquainted with the locality for the past 20 years and they all say that if such a mound ever existed in that part of the country, they had never heard of it.

I learn, from good authority, that Mr. Spiller began his work, before alluded to, at a well established corner over near the center of Ochiltree County, Hoping that this may be satisfactory

Dear Sir,

Referring to your letter of July 8th, 1899, will say that I have just returned from making the connections required by you and will proceed to report results.

At a point 1928 vs. North and 838 vs. West from N.W. corner of Humphill County, as established by Ford & Cunningham, I found a pile of stone, from which a prominent point of bluff br. S.  $42\frac{3}{4}$  W, and the center of a natural mound br. S.  $23\frac{3}{4}$  E, which stone mound I ~~am~~ feel very certain is the N.W. cor. of sur. 59 in Block 43 as described in your letter referred to above; I then went to the

supposed N.E. corner of survey No. 160 in  
Block 13; T & N.O. surveys, as called for  
in my County line notes, and measured  
North, 2313 vs. found nothing

" 2 miles and 1651 vs. and found nothing  
I then made some inquiry of a settler and  
found that he had very recently had some  
surveying done by Mr. H.B. Spiller and that  
he had found the S.W. corner of survey 309  
Block 43, and I went there and found an  
old earth mound and 4 pits; I then measured  
East from that point 1990 vs. and found a  
mound and 4 pits (old work) I then returned  
to the S.W. cor. of sur. 309 as above described  
and measured South 2160 vs. as indicated  
in your letter of instructions and found  
no marks that could be positively identified
