

Dear Mr. Walker:

Re: County Boundary Line between Walker and San  
Jacinto Counties:

We now beg to hand you herewith two certified copies of Final Judgment in Cause No. 6565, styled Walker County vs. San Jacinto County, in the District Court of Houston County, Texas, rendered November 12, 1929, which Judgment undertakes to establish the County Boundary line between said Counties.

One of these certified copies has been duly recorded in the Deed Records of San Jacinto County, and the other certified copy has been duly recorded in the Deed Records of Walker County. Both copies are submitted herewith for filing in the General Land Office, and we will thank you kindly to have them both filed and take such course in the matter as is required or permitted under the law.

With reference to the Southern terminus of this County Line, as established by the concrete post on the Bank of Peach Creek, we had the matter up with Mr. O. C. Wakefield, who had charge of the work, and he assured us that there was no way in which this point could be better established without running out, locating and defining the County Boundary line between Walker and Montgomery County and between Montgomery County and San Jacinto County.

Mr. Wakefield says that he inquired from the older inhabitants living in the vicinity of this point, and he feels certain that he established the South end of said County Boundary line at the point where the County Line between Walker County and Montgomery County intersected Peach Creek, and from which point the County Boundary Line between Montgomery County and San Jacinto County is Peach Creek.
