Saba County, Texas,

Gentlemen,

In accordance with an order passed during your May Term A.D. 1885, giving me the authority to establish the boundary lines of San Saba County, beginning at the mouth of Fall Creek, on the 15th. day of June A.D. 1885, with the assistance of the Surveyors of Llano, Mason, & McCulloch Counties, I have the honor to report as follows, to wit:

That the Surveyors of Llano and Mason Counties -- failed to assist and that after several attempts to run the South line of San Saba County by the variation of the needle which proved unsatisfactory on account of local attraction - Charles Harcourt, County Surveyor of Mc Culloch County and myself, County Surveyor of San Saba County, established a true meridian at the mouth of Fall Creek on the 26th. day of August 1885 and run West at right angles to it, which gives the variation here at $9^{\circ}4'$

Beginning at a cedar stake 2 feet long, set in the center of the mouth of Fall Creek (the top of which stands 4 feet above the lowest water mark) from which an Elm 15" bears West 85 varas, marked on the North Side S. S. Co and on the South side Llano Co. and a natural stone column being a part of a bluff 115 feet high bears $S. 88^{\circ} W. 85$ varas,

Thence West on the South side of Fall Creek 90 varas to the top of the ^{said} bluff.

At 1340 varas cross Fall Creek to the North side running $N. 40^{\circ} E.$

At 1 mile 1400 varas re-cross said Creek running $S. 30^{\circ} E$

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At 3 miles 410 varas cross the same Creek to the North side running North.

At 4 miles 340 varas cross Fall Creek again whose course is South.

At 4 miles 840 varas re-cross same Creek running N. 60° E,

At 4 miles 1030 varas cross the same Creek running S. 60° E.

At 5 miles 795 varas Cross Fall Creek --course North.

At 5 miles 1560 varas Cross Fall Creek the 8th. time running South ; - At this point we , also, crossed the old San Saba & Bluffton road near the Jennings Ranch.

At 10 miles 1130 varas cross Little Llano running South

At 11 miles 430 varas Cross a deep rough Cañon.

At 16 miles 240 varas crossed Wolf Creek running South

At 17 miles 800 varas crossed Miller's mining creek running South

At 18 miles 1800 varas crossed Pecan Creek running S. 20° E

At 19 miles 1640 varas crossed Hickory Creek running South.

At 21 miles 200 varas passed about 300 varas North of Cedar Spring, - At this point we can see the line 14 miles ^{East} with the telescope.

At 24 miles 470 varas crossed Rainbolt Gulch - runs ^{South} ~~South~~

At 26 miles 1130 varas crossed Cold Creek running South.

At 31 miles 610 varas pass the Supposed N. W. corner of -

Llano County

At 31 miles 750 varas passed a point 1200 varas North of

Pontotoc

At 37 miles 1000 varas crossed Lost Creek - runs North.

At 38 miles a stone pillar marked 38 M. S. W. Cor. San Saba County, for The South-West corner of said County which is 577 varas South , --950 varas East of the N.W. Corner of the Me --

Ashan Section, -and 577 varas South, -950 varas West of the S.W. corner of the Oliver Farnsworth Section.

Thence North (after having established the true meridian which, gives the variation at this point $10^{\circ}10'$ East) 760 varas crossed the Llano & Brady road.

At 1200 varas cross Lost Creek runs West.

At 1 mile 670 varas pass the S.E. corner of McCulloch County -making the whole No. of miles run for Mason County 8 miles - 1280 varas.

At 1 mile 1623 varas pass a point 1000 varas West of the summit of Dick's Mountain.

At 8 miles 430 varas cross Dry or Pecan Creek runs $N. 70^{\circ} E.$

At 8 miles 840 varas to a stone mound on the brink of a precipice on the South side of San Saba river 200 varas $S. 74^{\circ} W.$ of the N.E. corner of the W.R. Hext Pre-emption.

At 8 miles 890 varas cross San Saba river to its North bank

At 8 miles 1300 varas cross a large ravine which drains Long Valley, runs East.

At 9 miles 530 varas cross the N.B. line of ^{No} 2147 in the name of F Schulze, 460 varas West of its N.E. corner.

At 10 miles 555 varas cross San Saba & Voca road whose general course is $S. 45^{\circ} W.$ with the length of said valley which is about 3-4 of a mile wide and about 2 1-2 miles long.

At 12 miles a lime-stone pillar 3 feet high marked 50 miles San Saba & McCulloch County line -set on the summit of a high hill from which the country can be seen for many miles in all directions

At 14 miles 700 varas crossed Brady Creek running East

At 15 miles 100 varas pass a stone mound 530 varas West of the S.E. corner of No. 2145 from which the S.W. corner of No.

16 in the name of C. Loeffler bears S. 60° E. 240 varas

At 17 miles 210 varas cross San Saba & Dofflemyre ranch -- road.

At 19 miles 80 varas cross Lost Creek runs East

At 19 miles 1150 varas to the summit of a high ridge West of the Antelope Pond.

At 21 miles 1580 varas cross San Saba & Concho road, course S. 40° W.

At 22 miles 980 varas cross Richland Creek running East

At 26 miles 1760 varas cross Richland & Cow-boy road course N. 40° W.

At 28 miles 1360 varas cross a rough cañon

At 32 miles 1220 varas cross San Saba ^{& Milburn} roadcourse N. 40° W.

At 33 miles 610 varas cross a cañon runs West.

At 33 miles 1120 varas cross another canon whose course is West, also.

At 34 miles 1520 varas cross the ^{old} San Saba & Milburn Road runs West

At 35 miles 850 varas cross the North boundary line of J.P. Edwards' Pre-emption 950 varas West of his N.E. corner (which is the S.W. corner of No. 71 in the name of Peter Reitz from which a Post oak bears N. 1° E. 63 varas and another P.O. bears N. 4° ^W 63 varas) and 150 varas East of his N.W. corner.

At 36 miles 670 varas a stone pillar set on the South bank of Colorado River Marked 36 miles 670 vrs. N.W. cor. San Saba C

This stone is North 140 varas and West 950 varas from the N.E. corner of No. 959 in the name of W. Schutte.

All the mile posts are stone except 5 and they are mesquite posts.

The whole number of miles run including County lines and

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and around that portion of the surveys through which the County line runs situated in San Saba necessary to the correction of the abstracts of the lands in said County aggregate 247--miles; the lines are marked blaze with three hacks above it and three below it.

The timber on the high ridges has been cut down and the line can be seen to a great distance in many places.

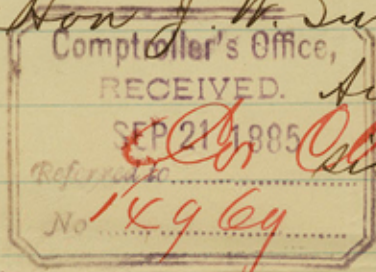
