North Line. Field Notes of the County lines  
of D Curry Co, Texas. Survey  
Commenced on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September 1855  
By W. J. Camp County Surveyor of Curry  
Co, Texas, Balm at the variation  
of North  $9^{\circ} 30'$  West

Beginning at North West Corner  
of Fisher County Texas an Earth  
Mound and 4 pits with stone in Center  
of mound marked N. E. Cor. S. C.

Said Corner 100 varas North of Double-  
Mountain River and 45 varas East  
of same, From which double Hack-  
Lerry bears South  $64^{\circ}$  West 38 varas  
marked  $\bar{x}$  N. E. C. S. C. and N. C. Cor-  
ner of Warrens Cow pen line N.  $57\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W.

Thence West at 60 vns, cross  
double-Mountain River, at 600 vns.  
Recross same, at 720 vns. Recross  
same again at one mile a stone  
mound with stone in center marked  
N. E. S. C. No 1 in a Canon on big  
draw that enters into Double Mountain  
River just below what is known as the  
Goldstein Old pen place

Thence West across Mountain and  
Canon, one mile to slab of Gypsum for  
monument marked N. E. S. C. No. 2. Said  
Corner being about 130 vns East of Cox's  
branch and 140 vns, East of high, red

6 north then cross two mountains, at

9 edge of Small Drain Course meet and  
10 50 vns. East of Canon, from which  
11 Cotton-wood tree bro S 21/2 N, 53 vns  
12 little red Hill bro N. 4 E. 40 vns, Coopers  
13 Leaf bro. N. 43 N

15 Thence meet at 60 vns cross Canon  
16 to base north at one mile Earth  
17 mound + 4 pits from which Coopers Peak  
18 bro. north 30° N, and South side of

3 Cove from which Caspers Peak bro  
4 N. & E. and highest point on the south bro,

9 marked N.L.S.C. No. 12 in open smooth Prairie

12 Mountain on the south bro, S. 13 E.

14 Thence West at one mile Stone Monument  
15 with stone in center marked N.L.S.C. No 13  
16 on West side of small branch from which  
17 Caspers Peak bro N. 4<sup>m</sup> E. and north  
18 end of an other Mountain bro S. 59<sup>m</sup> W.

20 Thence West at 360 on cross  
21 small branch, and cross high hills  
22 at one mile Stone Monument (on west  
23 side of small branch) marked N.L.S.C. No. 14  
24 South of big flat and north of high  
25 hills

26 Thence West at 1000 on top  
27 Mountain just a little north of sum-  
28 mit of highest hill of this group of hills  
29 at one mile Stone Monument (on Western  
30 slope of said high hill) marked N.L.S.C.  
31 No. 15 from which North end of  
32 Mc Kingie Mountain bro. North 77<sup>m</sup> W.

and South end of same bro N, 89 and  
West end of Long Mountain bro D 34 N,  
and North end of Flat top Mountain bro  
D 87 1/2 N.

Thence West Cross down a  
long hill and Cross a Canon a  
Creek at one mile an Earth mound  
and 4 pits from which North end of  
McKingsie Mountain bro N, 7 1/2 N, and  
South end of same bro N, 88 N.

Thence West at 450 vrs. Cross  
Canon Course North at 640 vrs. Cross  
branch Course North at one mile stone  
monument marked N. L. S. C. No. 17 on  
West bank of branch Course N. E.  
from which North end of McKingsie  
Mountain bro. N, 53 N

Thence West at one mile stone  
monument marked N. L. S. C. No 18 just in  
side of the N. W. Cor. of the Mabson Pasture  
from which the N. W. Cor. of section no 699  
and N. E. corner of section no 698 bro. N, 22 N.  
230 vrs. and N. end of McKingsie Mountain  
bro N, 7 1/2 N. Coopers Peak Peaks  
N 69 E. and West summit of South Mountain  
bro D 2 1/2 E.

Thence West at 480 vrs top of  
South Spur of McKingsie Mountain at  
1400 vrs, Cross same, at one mile stone

1 Monument marked N. 4, S. C. No. 19, 100 vns  
2 East of Main to McKingie trail, from  
3 which South end of Summit of McKingie moun-  
4 tain bro N & E, and Flat-top Mountain bro  
5 S 8 1/2 W.

8 Course West at one mile stone monument  
9 marked N. 4, S. C. No. 20 on East bank of small

14 Center of mound marked N. 4, S. C. No. 21 from  
15 which North end of Flat-top Mountain bro.  
16 S. 82 W. and North end of McKingie moun-  
17 tain bro. N. 78 E.

19 Thence West at 800 vns. Cross branch  
20 Course N. W. at one mile Stone Monument  
21 marked N. 4, S. C. No. 22 from which South  
22 end of Flat-top Mountain bro S. 67 W. &  
23 North end of McKingie Mountain bro. N. 84 E.

25 Thence West at one mile Earth  
26 mound with stone in Center marked N. 4, S. C.  
27 No. 23 from which North end of Flat-top moun-  
28 tain bro, N. 67 W. and N. W. end of <sup>2nd</sup> branch  
29 of Flat-top Mountain bro S. 8 1/2 W.

31 Thence West at 1170 vns top of North  
32 Spur of Flat Mountain at 1200 vns. Cross same

1 at one mile Earth mound & 4 pits from  
2 which north end of Flat-top Mountain bro.  
3 S. 37 E. about 1/2 mile distant & a little  
4 round stone topped Mountain in big valley  
5 bro. N 43 W.

7 Thence West at one mile in Earth  
8 mound & 4 pits in big valley or Cove between  
9 Flat-topped Mountain & Blue Mountains  
10 from which South end of Flat top Mountain  
11 bro. S. 67 E. and East end of New Moon  
12 or Blue Mountain bro. S. 63 W.

14 Thence West at 920 one, Cross road  
15 leading from Colorado City via Snyder  
16 to Yellow-house Canon at one mile  
17 stone monument marked N. L. S. C. No. 26  
18 on East end of small Rocky Mountain in  
19 big valley North of Blue Mountains and  
20 South of Double Mountain River

23 monument marked N. L. S. C. No. 27 in big  
24 valley from which round red & rock topped

25 above and below bro. S. 71<sup>m</sup>, 33 vno.

28 & 4 pits near the South edge of a dry lake

29  
30 Thence South at one mile Earth mound  
31 & 4 pits in North edge of long lake course N. E.  
32 & S. W.

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Thence South at one mile Earth  
Mound & 4 pits on big flat

Thence South at 1160 vns Cross wire fence  
the North string of Thos. Branch's Pasture, at  
one mile Earth Mound & 4 pits from which  
Mushaway Peak bro. S. 60<sup>0</sup> W. & back-bay  
grove in head of Canon bro. S. 13<sup>0</sup> E. Course of  
Canon S. W.

Thence South at one mile Stone monu-  
ment marked W. L. S. C. No. 11 on East side of small  
branch from which top of Mushaway Peak  
bro. S. 64 W.

Thence South at 1200 vns, @ cross a  
Creek the East prong of Rabbit Creek, course  
West at one mile Earth Mound & 4 pits from
