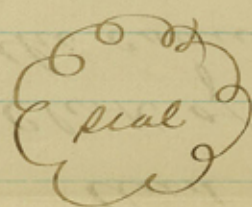


It appearing to the satisfaction of the County Court of Concho County that the boundary lines of the County of Concho are not sufficiently definite and well defined. Therefore it is ordered by the Court that R. H. Looney be and is hereby appointed to determine by actual survey the South, West, North and East lines of said County and to establish and mark by Stone mounds the SE. SW. NW. + NE. corners of said County in accordance with law, and it is further ordered that said R. H. Looney shall commence at the SE. corner the same being the NE. corner of Minard County then establish the south line. Said Looney shall begin this work on the 17th day of November 1879 and shall begin west line on the 20th of said month and shall begin the north line on the 24th of Nov. and shall begin the East line on the 27th of Nov.

And it is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court is ordered to notify the counties interested in said lines.
