

Survey for ascertaining the Western boundary of the County  
Travis -

Beginning on the Guadalupe river, at the crossing  
the old San Antonio Road from Nacogdoches.

Thence with the meanders of said road -

14,760 varas = 7.7 miles to York's creek

30,830 " = 16.2 " to river San Marcos.

58,973 " = 31. " to Plum Creek.

102,232 " = 53.8 " to Cedar Creek

117,862 " = 62. " to old crossing of Colorado at Bastrop.

General Course of old San Antonio Road from Gua-  
daloupe crossing to old crossing on Colorado N. 57° 37' E.

Distance of direct line from one river to the other,  
50 varas, = 57 miles.

General course of the Colorado river, or direct line  
from the crossing of Old San Antonio Road at Bastrop  
a point 75 000 varas above the same N. 61° 48' W.

Distance of meanders up the river, 42 miles.

Thence on the line running parallel with the San  
Antonio Road S. 57° 37' W. to Guadalupe river, 116,781 varas,  
61.4 miles. The corner between Travis and Bexar  
counties a cypress tree 30 inches in diameter, blazed and  
marked <sup>CC</sup>B&T standing on bank of river, from which a  
cypress 8 inches in diameter bears N. 51° E. 11.8 varas,  
marked with a blaze and chop.

Thence the Western boundary of Travis county  
running N. 17° E. crosses river at corner -

660 varas recrosses the river.
