

Copied from the Minutes of the Commissioners Court of Tyler County,
Texas.

From Book No.1: No Page numbers given on Book.

October 14th, 1858 : "Whereas the line between this County and the County of Hardin, has never been run & Established and the Court being Satisfied that it is very important that said line should be run and Established, and plainly marked: It is therefore ordered by the Court that Enoch S. Pitts be and he is hereby appointed on the part of Tyler County to meet the Surveyor of Hardin County at the point where the East boundary line of Polk County crosses Village Creek, on Monday the 25' day of Oct 1858 and proceed to run and plainly mark the line between the County of Tyler & Hardin.

And it is further ordered that the County Court of Hardin County be notified of the time and place of meeting for the purpose of running said line."

May 16th, 1859: "Ordered by the Court that forty Six Dollars be & the same is hereby allowed to E.S. Pitts as a partial payment for his services in running the County line between Tyler & Hardin Counties and that the same be paid as a privileged claim."

May 22, 1860: "It is ordered by the Court that E.S. Pitts, County Surveyor, be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$29.38 it being a balance due him for running the county line between Tyler & Hardin County as privilege claim."

May 22, 1860: "It is ordered by the Court that the Report of the Surveyors running the county line between Tyler & Hardin county be received, approved and ordered to be recorded."
