Pursuant to an order directed to me from the Honorable Commissioners Court of Roads & Revenues bearing date the day of 1840 directing to survey and make the line between the Counties of Upshur and Harrison

In Obedience to same I proceeded to the place appointed on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of October 1840 and finding no person to represent Upshur County I proceeded on the next day to survey and mark the line which is shown in the field notes entered on the back of this map

A field note of the survey made for the line of Upshur and Harrison Counties commencing at South East or rather the East corner of George Mortons Survey on the South bank of Big cypress a Stake from which a rod bears  $S 87^{\circ} W 4 \frac{1}{10}$  or marked W. C. and a white oak bears  $S 53^{\circ} E 11 \frac{1}{10}$  or marked D. C. Thence running due South a distance nine  $\frac{1}{8}$  miles the N bank of Sabine River a Stake from which a birch 8 in dia bears  $S 14^{\circ} E 5$  or marked W. C. ditto 20 in dia bears  $S 56^{\circ} W 9 \frac{1}{10}$  or marked W. C. The line is marked with three knots on the line. The survey and other Natural marks exhibited in the foregoing map

Beginning on the Bank of the Sabine  
River one mile above the mouth of Harris creek. ~~Go~~  
vs West 250 vs South of the S W corner of Survey No.  
312. by marking two Hickorys one for Upshur County  
and one for Wood County. Thence North passing to  
~~East of the end of N W.~~ of Survey No. 16. 160 vs North  
of said Survey to Dry fork 4200 yds Set Stake on the  
Bank from which a white Oak bears S 15 E Dist 12 vs  
marked W. C. a Post Oak bears S 12 W marked  
W. C. making the whole line 30 miles
