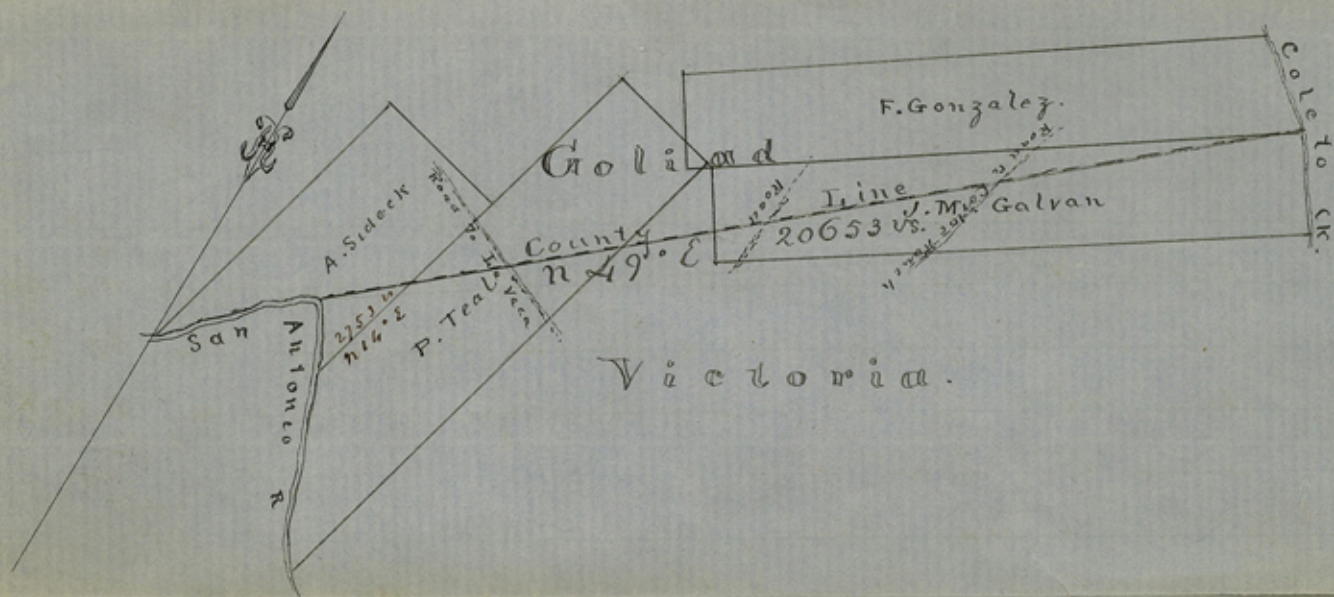
In pursuance of an Order to me directed by
the Hon^{ble} the County Court of said County to mark and Estab-
lish the boundary between the Counties of Goliad and Victoria
in conjunction with the Commissioners of the County of Goliad
and in accordance with said Order and on the day appointed
being the third Monday and 19th day of March 1849. the Com-
missioners of Goliad not being present the undersigned pro-
ceeded to mark and Establish the aforesaid Boundary
as follows

Beginning on the Right or West bank of the Colito
Creek (and on the line Run by W. Richardson of R. Co.) and
a Cottonwood 8 inches in dia. Mk^o $\equiv \equiv \equiv$ from which a Cotton
Wood 12 inches in dia. Mk^o ∇ bears S 39° E 8½ W. and a Cotton
Wood 10 inches in dia. Mk^o $\underline{\text{G}}$ bears S 80 W 10 W.

Thence S 29° W 45 W. from which the North corner
of Galvans Survey bears S 41° E 16 bars at 8.50 W the Edge
of bottom 6130 W to Road from Victoria to Cosler Ranch
16770 W to Road from Goliad to Post La Vaca 18775 W.
to Teal mrr. and Sidest S.E. boundary 2753 W from
their mutual corner (on San Antonio River) 19477 W to
Bottom timber 20653 W to the bank of the San Antonio
River a Box Elder 4 inches in dia. Mk^o $\equiv 1^{\circ}$ from which a
Sicamore 30 inches in dia. Mk^o C.B (standing under the
bank and partially in the River Richardsons Mark) bears
S 49° W 14 W. and an Elm 12 inches in dia. Mk^o ∇ bears
S 17° W 4 W. and an Elm 10 inches in dia. Mk^o \perp bears
S 21° E 7¼ W and a Pecan 30 inches in dia. Mk^o $\underline{\text{G}}$ bears
N 6° E 12½ W. and a Box Elder 8 inches in dia. Mk^o \times bears
N 87° E 5½ W. as

In pursuance of an Order to me directed by the Hon^{ble} the County Court of said County to Mark and Establish the line between the Counties of Goliad and Victoria in conjunction with the Commissioners of the County of Goliad and in accordance with said Order and on the appointed being the third Monday and 19th day of March 1849 the Commissioners of Goliad not being present the undersigned did proceed to Mark & set aforesaid boundary as follows

Beginning on the right or west bank of the Colorado Creek (being the line of the limits of Refugio County as Run by Willard Richardson) a Cotton wood 8 inches in dia. marked $\equiv \equiv \equiv \equiv$ from which a Cotton wood 12 inches in dia. Mark^d ∇ bears S 39° E 8 1/2 W. and a Cotton wood 10 in. in dia. Mark^d \ominus bears S 80° W 10 bars

Thence S 49° W 45 W from which the North corner of J. M. Galvan's Survey bears S 41° E 16 W - 850 W. to the Edge of bottom 6130 W. to the Road from Victoria to Refugio at 11290 W. to Road from the Colorado to Carlos Ranch 16770 W. to the Road from Goliad to Port Lavaca 18775 W. to Teal's N.W. and Sideck's S.E. line and 2753 W. N 44° E from their Mutual corner. 19477 W. to bottom timber 20653 bars to the bank of the San Antonio River a Box Elder 4 inches in dia. Mark^d $\equiv 1 \equiv$ from which a Sycamore 30 inches in dia. Mark^d C.B. (Richardson) Standing under the bank and par-

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trally in the River bears S 49° W 14 W. and an Elm 12 in.
dia. M^o bears S 17° W 4 W. and an Elm 10 inches in dia. M^o
+ bears S 21° E 7 1/2 W. and a Pecan 30 inches in dia. M^o G
bears N 6° E 12 1/2 W. and a Box Elder 8 inches in dia. M^o X
bears N 87° E 5 1/2 W.
