Dear Sir

I am in receipt of yours of 3rd ult and in reply say that our County Surveyor was present and in company with the County Surveyor of Milam County run out a greater portion of the dividing line between Williamson and Milam Counties. but before the whole line was run out our County Surveyor says that the Milam County Surveyor went home and did not return to finish the work. but our County Surveyor did run out the whole dividing line and made his report to our Commissioners Court showing up clearly his work the County Surveyor of Milam County would not join with our Surveyor in making the report. and at a call session of our

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Commissioners court last week we received the report - and our County Surveyor was instructed to visit the Commissioners court of Milam County at its next meeting and explain his report and if Milam County does not adopt the report our Clerk has been instructed to send you a certified copy of our surveyors report I feel that our County surveyors report is correct as he says that on his line he struck all the old marks - Previous to running out this line. Milam County had set a time nearly a year ago to run out the line - but set it on Sunday. We sent a surveyor down to assist but he reported that he could not find the Milam County surveyor. Now the Milam County surveyor wants to adhere to his first line - which is west of the true line In case we cannot agree with Milam County I think then you ought to appoint some competent Surveyor to run out the line - do nothing more until you get our report of the Survey and further information from me
