To the Honorable Commissioners
Court of Wilson County

I have the honor to
submit the following report of a
survey of the boundary line between
Karnes and Wilson Counties
made in obedience to an order passed
at the special term of your court
held on the 25th day of April 1881,
On the day designated in your order
the 23rd day of May 1881. I met the
surveyor of Karnes County, Mr W. J.
Seale on the Eastern boundary of
Wilson County, and together we
proceeded to try to find the North
Corner of Coliad and East Corner
of Bexar Counties or Districts.
This the North Corner of Coliad which
is also the Eastern Corner of Bexar
District, Being the point from
which the North Corner of Karnes
and East Corner Wilson is es-
tablished by Law in defining the
boundary of Karnes which is the
oldest County, it was necessary
for us to find before we could
begin the survey,
Therefore we examined

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 carefully the point shown to me formerly as the old district corner but found nothing to indicate that it had been ever marked as a corner, though from it a line was found marked running S. 51° W, the bearing of the line between Wilson and Karns Counties,

Failing as above stated to find any evidence showing this to be the corner sought, we went to the west corner of the Thos. Hodges survey which is shown by the County Maps to be upon the District line, and run a line N. 15° E. to the Gonzales County line, searching carefully for marks of the District line but found none. The line thus run struck the Gonzales County line in Dr. Greis pasture about one and three fourths miles from the point in Mr. Sixkes field formerly supposed to be the district corner. We then continued our examination by going again to the west corner of the Thos. Hodges survey, and running S. 15° W about as far as the west line of the Cox survey or the Cash line of the

T. K. Wheeler survey when finding
no marks of the line we went to see
Mr. John Orman and Mr. Ford sup-
posing they might be able to give us
some information regarding the
line, They each showed us markers
of surveys, but they were of private
surveys of lands, and not of the line
sought.

Going then into Karnes County
we tried to find the District line
from surveys which called for it
in their field notes. Finding a small
live oak tree called for as a witness
tree near the corner of a survey
and claimed by said field notes to
be upon the District line we ran
from it S. 15 W. to the San Antonio
River striking it about one fourth
of a mile below the mouth of the Cibola
Creek. While running this course we
made examinations for marks of
the district line but found none.
Thus having run our compass over
the entire distance from Gonzales
line to the San Antonio River except
about half a dozen miles without
finding a trace of the old line

We were reduced to the necessity of making a re-survey of the whole line in order to determine our starting point for the line we had been ordered to survey.

Therefore beginning at about the middle of the mouth of the Cibola the beginning point of the District line we proceeded to make a careful survey of the District line, running it N. 15° E. with a magnetic variation of $9^{\circ} 45' E.$ to the Gonzales County line which we struck about midway between the point in Mr. Sikes field and that terminating the line run from Hodges corner.

At the point thus reached we placed a mesquite post marked B and G and from it measured S. $41^{\circ} E.$ four and three fourths miles to a point in Mr. R. M. McClures field where we placed another mesquite post marked W. and K. This post being at the North corner of Karnes County and the East corner of Wilson County, we marked a line oak tree ^K W bearing N. $9^{\circ} E$ $88\frac{1}{4}$ Varad and another,

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with similar marks and about the same size about 14 inches in diameter bearing $N 10^{\circ} 32' E. 88\frac{1}{2}$ Varas. Thence we run the boundary line of Kanner and Wilson Counties $S. 57^{\circ} W$ with a magnetic variation of $9^{\circ} 45' E.$ and at 420 varas pass about 13 varas North west of Mr. R. M. McClure's house at 806 varas cross the line of the Goodbread survey $N 30 E. 350$ varas from its west corner at 1340 varas pass about 50 varas South East of Alfred Griffins house and enter his field at 1512 varas cross the line of the Erskine and Smith surveys $N 20^{\circ} W 333$ varas from their corner on Fannin's north line at 1740 varas pass about 32 varas South East of Mah Griffins house and at one mile placed a post in Mr. Griffins field.

On the 2nd mile at 618 varas crossed Fannin's north line 1834 varas from his North west corner at 1020 varas the bed of Blue Creek at 2 miles we set a post on the south west side of a ravine in the edge of the mesquites. On the 3rd mile at 622 varas crossed

West line of Fannin's S. 20° E 631 varas from his North West Corner at about 1680. 1700. and 1720 varas crossed a branch of Elm Creek, and at 3 miles we placed a Mile post in the East side of Sol Brown's field.

On the 4th mile leaving Browns house in Karnes County at 367 Varas we crossed the line of Cox and Roberts Surveys, S 61¹/₄° E 542 Varas from Cox's West Corner at 840 Varas cross Riddleville and Rauchs Road at 1491 pass S 61° E 22 Varas from Roberts West Corner and Bell's North Corner at 185¹/₂ Varas cross line of Bell and Brocha 56¹/₂ varas from Bells North Corner and at 4 Miles placed a post in Mesquites on a Ridge.

On the 5th Mile at about 300 varas pass about 200 varas South east of R. W. Shockley's house at 900 varas enter wet flat 1200 varas Bed of Shockley Creek at 1343 varas crossed North E. line of D. Cole's Survey N. 61° W 140 varas from its East corner and at 5 miles set a post on the edge of a hollow in a small grove of young Live oaks.

On the 6th Mile we crossed the line

of Cole and Cox. S 60° 417 varas from Cole east
corner, at 1460 varas passed about 60 varas South
East of John Demans house which is in
Wilson County - at 6 miles we set a post
on the west slope of a live oak ridge in
scattering timber. on the 7th mile at 480 varas
we crossed the line of P. Kirk and D. Fox
S 30° W 199 varas from their corner on
Whelers north line at 1899 varas we crossed
the line of Wheler and Deeman survey S
30° E 280 varas from Deemans North East
corner and 80 varas from Whelers corner on
same course at 7 miles we placed a post
in the Merywiler, on the 8 mile at 525 varas
San Antonio and Yorktown road at 1516
varas bed of Collets creek about 9 varas above
a very large Cottonwood tree and about
half a mile below Kellys house at 8 miles
we placed a post in Kellys pasture
On the 9th mile at 280 varas bed of a
hollow running eastward at 1068 varas
we crossed the west line of the Deeman
survey S 30° E 762 varas from its North west
corner and at 9 miles we placed a post
in a flat south of strip of post oak
timber - on the 10th miles at 1088
varas crossed line of Legrauds and
Calliops survey 1082 varas from

Legrand's North west corner at 10 miles placed a post in a flat running west of North.

On the 11th mile at 1174 1/2 varas we crossed the line of the Calliat and Morris survey N 30 W. 568 varas from Morris South East Corner and at 11 miles we placed a post in a flat.

On the 12th mile at 1186 varas we crossed the line of Morris and Vaughn survey 270 varas from Vaughn's South East Corner, and at 12 miles we placed a post of live oak timber in a live oak ridge in the prairie.

On the 13th mile at 1187 varas cross Vaughn's south line S 60 W. 1895 varas from its South East Corner at 13 miles we placed a post on west slope of a ridge in the prairie.

On the 14th mile at 275 varas we crossed the Hellina and Stockdale road at 942 varas we cross the north east line of the Peter Morgan survey N 29° W 303 varas from its east corner and at 14 miles placed a post in Hugh

Edwin's pasture, on the 15th miles at 773 varas we crossed the lower line of the Peter

Morgan Survey 1723 Varas from its
East corner at 803 Varas crossed
Edminston Creek at 810 Varas old
road from Hedua to Sutherland
Springs at 900 Varas crossed Ed-
minston Creek again at 1000 Varas
same and at 15 Miles set a post
on the South of same and about 90
Varas from it.

On the 16th Mile at 1765 Varas a hollow
runs west into Dry Creek about 70
Varas distant and at 16 Miles set a
post in the edge of a flat.

On the 17th Mile at 250 Varas the bed
of Dry Creek at 1207 Varas same
and the same at 1375 Varas and
at 1802 Varas edge of water of
Cibola Creek which is crossed ob-
liquely downward by the County line
at 1856 Varas west bank of Cibola
and at 17 Miles set a post on abrupt
bank of same.

On the 18th Mile we passed through
fields belonging to Poles and at 1270
Varas passed through the east side
of John Fluck's gallery leaving the
house in Wilson County at 1660
Varas passed the road from Carbajal

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 Crossing on the Cibola to Sutherland
 Springs and at 18 miles we placed
 a post in Mesquites a little North of
 a hollow.

On the 19th mile at 612 varas crossed
 a hollow the third time at 1611 varas
 crossed the road from Helena to
 Florenceville and on the north side of
 it placed a good mesquite post
 marked W and K and at 19 miles we
 planted a post.

At 20 miles set another post.

On the 21st mile at 1849 varas we
 crossed the line of the Hernandez
 and Manchaca grants - S 30° E 65-20 varas
 from the south corner of the Augustin
 Lanza survey and at 21 miles we
 placed a post in the prairie.

on the 22nd mile at 1670 varas we
 crossed a road from Pava Maria to
 Florenceville and at 22 miles we placed
 a post in the prairie.

At 23 miles we placed a post in
 the prairie.

On the 24th mile at 1000 varas we
 crossed the Marcilines Creek and
 at 24 miles we placed a post on
 the east slope of a sandy ridge

On the 25th mile at 840 varas we
Marked a fore and aft live oak
tree N on the south-east side and W
on the North west side at 25 miles
set a post in the prairie.

On the 26th mile at 1625 varas we
crossed Las Moras Creek and at
26 miles set a post in the Valley of
Lance.

On the 27th mile at 1460 varas crossed
the Canguister and Suther land
Springs road and at 27 miles
we placed a post in the Mesquites.

The 28th mile post was a seasoned
Mulberry placed in the river bottom
between the river bank and the waters
of the Sauautous River, after
running nearly parallel with it
and up its course about one fourth
of a mile.

On the 29th mile at about 40 varas
edge of water in said River at
about 120 varas enter Dewees field
at lower corner on west bank of
River and pass through the field
leaving nearly all in Wilson County
at 1100 varas pass about 1/2 mile
south-east of T. Dewees house

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at 1600 varas the road from
Canguesta to Fair View and at 29
Miles placed a post in a hollow between
two limestone hills.

The 30th mile post is on a live oak
ridge.

The 31st mile post was placed in
the prairie.

On the 32nd mile we crossed at 18620,
a newly marked line seemingly intended
for a Rail Road track which bears
about S 33° E. and N 33° W. and
at 32 miles we placed a post on
the North Slope of a hill.

The 33rd mile post was on the North
west side of a drain.

The 34th mile post was placed about
500 varas North west of Block
Jack hill.

On the 35th mile at 1885 varas we
crossed the South West line of Gasper
Flores Grant, ^{838-E.} 7734 varas from its
nearest North west corner and
the North East line of the Ward
survey N 35° W. 2266 varas from its
East corner and at 35 miles we
placed a post North west of a
ravine.

on the 35th Mile at 40 Varas pass out
of T. Dewe's pasture through which
the line runs from his field to this
point at 840 varas a drain, 880 varas
same 925 varas same and at 1580 varas
the same and a mile post at 36 Miles
At 36 Miles 286 Varas we placed
a post on the North East line of
Alascosa County for the South
Corner of Wilson County and the
West Corner of Kansas. said post
being on the line of Alascosa and
Wilson Counties as surveyed by Gen.
Ludovic Colcohou representing
Alascosa and W. T. Sutherland
representing Wilson County - by legal
appointment. and is 839 6899
Varas from another placed by
said Colcohou and Sutherland on
the line surveyed by them.

The post for the corner of Wilson
and Kansas Counties on the line
last mentioned was marked W and
K and from it the right prong of a
double Post Oak tree about 20-
inches in diameter marked K and
standing at the edge of a Ravine
bears S 66¹/₄ E. 134³/₄ Varas and a

Wilson Co. Survey. Line #1

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Mesquite tree about 14 inches in diameter bears N 10°-10' E 8 3/2 varas and is marked W and another Mesquite tree marked A and about 15 inches in diameter bears S 24° W 71 Varas.

The posts used on this line were of Good Mesquite timber with the two exceptions already mentioned. The Survey was made by agreement with & with the cooperation of Mr. W. J. Seal the County Surveyor of Karnes County, who expressed the opinion that the survey was in compliance with the provisions of law. The line was marked with a blaze and one hack above and one below the blaze.


