

Commissioners Court April Special Term 1881

Be it remembered that on this the first day  
of April 1881 a special Term of the Commissioners  
Court of Wilson County Texas was begun  
and holden within and for said County at the  
Court House in the Town of Floresville Present  
A. H. Abney County Judge J. M. Rose A. W.  
Murray G. W. Rose & J. F. Cassinova County  
Commissioners T. S. Wyatt Sheriff L. P.  
Guyles Clerk, when the following proce-  
dures were had "To Wit",

To the Honorable Commissioners Court  
Wilson County Texas:

I beg leave to submit the following report of a survey of the boundary line of the Counties of Bexar and Wilson made in obedience to an order from your honorable body made at its May term 1896, directing the County surveyor Mr W. P. Graves and myself to meet and co-operate with the County Surveyor of Bexar County in marking the common boundary of the two named Counties.

The order of survey issued by the Commissioners Courts of Bexar and Wilson Counties named the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May 1896 as the time to begin the survey of the line, and the mouth of Martinez Creek as the beginning point. But the surveyor of Bexar County and myself having been cited to appear as witnesses on the first day of June in the District Court of Wilson County, and we having met and discussed the preliminary arrangements of the survey, adjourned to meet again on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of June 1896.

On the day last above named Mr Thos. C. Nelson County surveyor of Bexar County, and Mr Paul Pretzer an efficient practical surveyor and civil engineer representing the interests of Bexar County met me, and we began at the mouth of Martinez Creek the survey of a preliminary line to determine the true bearing of a line running

straight from the mouth of Martinez creek to the North East corner of Atascosa County. The line was run with a transit and carefully measured with a steel tape and temporary stakes placed for the distance of each mile, and the intersection of the lines of survey's noted, and at the distance from the mouth of Martinez creek of 97 miles and 1899 varas we were 411 varas  $55^{\circ} 37' E$  of the post previously placed by me for the corner of Atascosa and Wilson Counties.

The course of the line run as above stated was  $S 36^{\circ} 07'$  with a variation of  $8^{\circ} 35' E$  at the beginning point, but at the southern extremity of the line the variation of the needle was  $8^{\circ} 41' E$  with same compass reading. therefore the corrected line between the mouth of Martinez creek and the Atascosa corner would be 97' more to the right, or  $S 36^{\circ} 11' W$  with average variation of  $8^{\circ} 38' E$ .

With the complete agreement to and acquiescence in the line of the representatives of Wilson and Bexar Counties, and the full assistance of each, the line as hereinafter described was surveyed and marked.

Beginning at the mouth of Martinez creek at a box elder tree on the west bank of said creek and Cibolo creek marked B and W. Thence  $S 36^{\circ} 07' 51'' W$  varas to a round topped boulder near the top of the upper bank of the creeks from which boulder an elm tree about 14" in diameter bears  $S 87^{\circ} 34' E$   $9\frac{1}{4}$  varas and a live oak tree



about 45" in diameter bears S $60^{\circ}E$  26 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas  
Thence continuing same course S $36\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}N$  at  
one mile placed a post on a gravelly ridge  
whence a mesquite tree bears N $10\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}E$  7 $\frac{3}{5}$   
varas and another about 17" in diameter  
bears S $77\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$  13 varas and a post oak  
tree about 10 inches in diameter bears S $43\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}W$  11 varas

At 2 miles place a post in Fritz Gutz yard  
north of his house which is in Wilson  
County and from said post a post oak tree  
about 24" in diameter bears S $60^{\circ}W$  11 varas  
and a live oak tree about 18" in diameter  
bears S $79\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}E$  30 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas. At two miles  
and 350 varas cross the line of Morris  
and Rodriguez surveys. N $60^{\circ}E$  446 varas  
from Rodriguez south corner and at  
3 miles placed a post in edge of mesquite  
and post oak timber from which a mes-  
quite tree about 9" in diameter bears N $27\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}W$  7 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas and a post oak tree  
about 16" in diameter bears S $31^{\circ}E$  37 varas  
and a mesquite tree about 8" in diameter  
bears S $41\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$  29 varas

At 3 miles and 1785 varas cross line  
of Mancha and Morris surveys N $14^{\circ}E$   
6 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas from Morris south corner  
and at 4 miles place a post in post  
oak timber whence a post oak tree  
about 22" in diameter bears S $47\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}E$  8 $\frac{1}{2}$   
varas and another about 16" in diameter  
bears N $66\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}W$  4 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas and another  
about 20" in diameter bears N $41\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$  7 $\frac{1}{2}$   
varas. At 5 miles placed a post in  
open post oak flat south of Lipan Creek  
and North of Gulf Shore Rail Road whence

a post oak tree about 18" in diameter bears  
 $N 73\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} W 17$  varas and another about 20"  
in diameter bears  $S 15\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} W 18\frac{1}{2}$  varas  
and at 5 miles and 300 varas cross  
line of O'Hanlon and W. Newer survey  
 $N 76^{\circ} W 11\frac{1}{2}$  varas from the North East  
corner of the latter and 859 varas from  
the south east corner of the former and  
at this point crossed old Indianola road  
At 6 miles placed a post in south edge of a  
field whence a post oak tree about 20"  
in diameter bears  $S 46^{\circ} W 4\frac{1}{2}$  varas and  
another bears  $N 25\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W 58\frac{1}{4}$  varas, and  
at 6 miles and 1778 varas crossed the  
line of W. Newer and Sturrock surveys  
also La Vernia and San Antonio road  
 $N 76^{\circ} W 11769$  varas from Sturrock & W. Newer  
surveys on line of Jesse S. Moore survey  
At 7 miles place a post whence a post  
oak tree about 30" in diameter bears  $N$   
 $60\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} E 78\frac{3}{5}$  varas and a live oak tree  
about 35" in diameter bears  $N 71^{\circ} W + 3$   
varas. on the 8<sup>th</sup> mile pass near and  
south east of Quaiks house and through  
the kitchen of Tidik leaving both dwellings  
in Bexar County.

At 8 miles placed a post in mesquite  
flat whence a mesquite tree about 14"  
in diameter bears  $N 35\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} W 37$  varas  
and another bears  $N 76^{\circ} W 35\frac{1}{2}$  varas  
and at 8 miles and 1735 varas cross  
line of Sturrock and Martinez surveys  
 $N 76^{\circ} W 395$  varas from Martinez north  
east corner and 575 varas from Sturrocks  
south west corner

At 9 miles placed a post in open post



oak and mesquite whence a mesquite tree about 18" in diameter bears N  $64^{\circ} E$  37 varas. and a post oak tree about 14" in diameter bears N  $13^{\circ} E$  7 varas and a leaning post oak about 15" in diameter bears S  $31^{\circ} E$  10 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas.

At 10 miles placed a post in open post oak timber whence a post oak tree about 10" in diameter bears N  $70\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  10 $\frac{3}{4}$  varas. and another bears N  $4\frac{3}{4}^{\circ} W$  28 varas. and another bears S  $70\frac{3}{4}^{\circ} E$  21 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas. and at 10 miles 650 varas cross San Antonio and Sutherland Springs road on line of Martinez and Steele 16 $\frac{1}{4}$  varas from Martinez south east corner. At 11 miles placed a post in open post oaks whence a post oak tree about 24" in diameter bears N  $55\frac{3}{4}^{\circ} W$  10 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas and another about 20" in diameter bears S  $78\frac{3}{4}^{\circ} E$  16 $\frac{1}{4}$  varas. and at about 11 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles cross the line of Aephous Steele and Campbell Longley surveys 24 $\frac{1}{4}$  varas N  $76^{\circ} W$  of the south east corner of the Steele.

At 12 miles placed a post in a mesquite flat whence a mesquite tree about 4 inches in diameter bears N  $7^{\circ} E$  7 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas. and another about 10 inches in diameter bears S  $17\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  27 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas.

At 13 miles placed a post on north west slope of open ridge whence a hickory tree about 18" in diameter bears N  $58^{\circ} E$  36 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas. and a post oak tree about 30" in diameter bears S  $33^{\circ} W$  6 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas. and the lower at the Quarter masters depot near San Antonio bears N  $47^{\circ} 40' W$ . and at about 13 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles pass

between Seward's gin and residence leaving  
the latter in Wilson County

At 14 miles placed a post in North  
edge of Hobgob's orchard whence a post  
oak tree about 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter bears S  
17 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E 59 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas and a live oak tree  
about 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter bears N 41 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W  
54 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas.

At 15 miles placed a stake in Storm's  
field whence the South end of a school  
house bears S 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E about 400 varas.  
distant and at about 15 $\frac{3}{4}$  miles mark-  
ed two large live oak trees fore and aft  
and one of them W on the south east  
side and B on the North west side. These  
trees are about 40 varas south east-  
ward of Saucedas house which is in  
Bexar County.

At 16 miles place a post in the valley  
of Calaveras Creek about  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile north  
east of same

At 17 miles placed a post on top of open  
ridge just north of Benito Gonzales  
house and about 300 varas northwest  
of the San Antonio Sewer Pipe factory  
and at 17 $\frac{1}{4}$  miles crossed the S.A. & A.P. RR  
track.

At 18 miles placed a post in a field  
At 19 miles placed a post on mesquite ridge  
whence a mesquite tree about 6" in dia-  
meter bears S 50° E 11 $\frac{1}{4}$  varas and another  
about 7 inches in diameter bears N 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ °  
W 13 $\frac{3}{4}$  varas and at 19 miles and 1040  
varas cross the San Antonio river at  
the western end of a bend after crossing  
a deep ravine several times

at 90 miles placed a post in the river valley whence a mesquite tree about 10" in diameter bears N  $90\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E  $8\frac{1}{4}$  varas and another about 90" in diameter bears S  $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E 19 varas

At 91 miles placed a post in the river valley 70 varas north west of a pond in Resaca, whence an elm tree about 15 inches in diameter bears S  $18\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  W  $7\frac{1}{4}$  varas, and a mesquite tree about 8" in diameter bears N  $46\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W  $11\frac{1}{4}$  varas

At 92 miles post in open post oaks whence a hickory tree about 17" in diameter bears S  $60^{\circ}$  W 11 varas, and a post oak tree about 17 inches in diameter bears S  $10\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W  $27\frac{1}{4}$  varas

At 93 miles placed a post in open post oak timber whence a post oak tree about 17 inches in diameter bears N  $7^{\circ}$  W  $14\frac{1}{2}$  varas, and another about 16" in diameter bears N  $60\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E  $19\frac{1}{2}$  varas

At 94 miles placed a post in mesquite ridge whence a post oak tree about 7" in diameter bears S  $46\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E  $37\frac{1}{2}$  varas and another bears N  $10\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W  $27\frac{1}{2}$  varas, and at 94 miles 1839 varas cross the back line of the Sequin grant 1798 varas from its south corner. At 95 miles a post in a sandy field, and at 95 miles 320 varas cross line of Sam Fleming and J Sheely survey N  $30^{\circ}$  W  $13$  varas from Sheely's east corner.

At 96 miles set a post in black jack timber whence a black jack tree about 15" in diameter bears S  $9\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E 11 varas and another about 17" in diameter bears N  $74\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E 8 varas and at 96 miles

1648 varas cross the west line of the Warren Adams survey S $70^{\circ}8'$  944 varas from N $81^{\circ}$  corner of the same At 97 miles placed a post in Basil Haydens field on the Burt survey at 97 miles 1341 varas pass a post once said to be at the County corner and at 97 miles 1398 varas a large post placed in 1885 for the corner of Atascosa, Wilson and Bexar Counties from which a post oak tree about 16" in diameter bears S $67^{\circ}E$  5 varas marked A and another marked B about 14 inches in diameter bears N $74^{\circ}E$  29 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas and another low branching forked post oak tree about 13" in diameter bears N $80\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}E$  33 $\frac{1}{3}$  varas and is marked W This last named post is about 59 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas S $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$  of the south corner of the J.R. Burt survey. The trees near the line were marked with five blazes to distinguish this from other lines previously marked for the County line and the fore and aft lines marked with blazes in the direction of the line and two blazes below and three above the blazes The line described above is slightly different from the line surveyed in 1881 although in the main it is about the same having the same initial point and practically the same objective point and as stated before was fully agreed to by the surveyors of Bexar and Wilson Counties

I notified Mr Graves County Surveyor of Wilson County of the time and place of meeting for the beginning of the work

as requested by him. But he did not appear, and was not with us at any time during the progress of the survey nor did we receive any communication from him. The entire length of the County line is  $27\frac{3}{4}$  less 27 varas and was carefully surveyed twice once on the preliminary line and once on the true or corrected line. and my fee for the work is one hundred and sixty five dollars being three dollars per mile for each mile actually and necessarily run. I make no charge for any intersecting lines as most of the intersections were made at the time of the survey in 1881 and adopted with such corrections as were made necessary by the slight alteration in the line.

I, W. T. Sutherland special surveyor of Wilson County do hereby certify that survey described on the preceding pages was made according to law and with the concurrence and assistance of the surveyors representing Bexar County, and that my fee for the same is correct and in accordance with my proposition to the Commissioners Court of Wilson County.


