Enclosed herewith I send copy of field notes of Wood and Hopkins county line, which was established on D. O. Norton line.

The disputed line between Wood and Franklin has been amicably adjusted. The surveyors began at the east end of Gilbert and Bradstock line, and continued east to Dry Fork or Cypress, and thence down said Fork to Camp County. They found the D. O. Norton line to be common with this line, as far as Norton line runs. I will send copy of Parker & Cowan field notes as soon as approved by our Comis Court.

The State of Texas $\frac{3}{3}$ To the Hon. Commissioners,
Wood County $\frac{3}{3}$ Court of Wood County, Texas.
November Term A.D. 1880.

In accordance with an order of said Court passed on the 7th day of October A.D. 1880, appointing the undersigned to assist in running and establishing the boundary line between Wood and Hopkins Counties to be begun on the eleventh day of October 1880, at the Southeast corner of said Hopkins County I, on said 11th day of October 1880, met James L. Gilbert, the surveyor appointed by the Commissioners^{Court} of said Hopkins County to ascertain the said boundary line and to make and establish the said line and corners thereof in the manner prescribed by law, at the place appointed, and we then and there began the survey of said line, making the following notes hereof, to-wit:

1st mile Beginning at a stake set by the Franklin County Surveyors in 1878 for the Southeast corner of said Hopkins County; thence west 400 varas to a black Jack marked H.C. on west side of an old road, at 770 varas a branch 100 ft. wide course S. W., a smooth gum 20 in dia marked H. C. bis north, at 1000 varas a branch 100 ft wide course S. W. an Elm on east back m Rd. N. bro. East; thence passing through the farm of J. M. Hay St. at 1900 varas set stone in a small branch from which a double water Oak 6 in dia marked H. C. bro due west 9 1/2 varas

Hence west at 500 varas a branch 1 or wide course S. W. at 1210 varas Big Sandy Creek 3 yrs wide course S. a Pin Oak 18 in dia marked H. C. 6. hrs north. at 1900 $\frac{1}{2}$ varas. set stone for 2nd mile. from which a Blk Oak 24 in dia mkd H. C. 6 or H. C. hrs. S. 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 9 yrs. and a black Oak stump 20 in dia hrs S. 10 W. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ yrs. the oak marked being on the road leading from J. Alvis to Winsboro.

4th mile

Hence West 690 varas road leading from old County line church to Wesley Jones place. a Red Oak 24 in dia marked H. C. hrs East road runs S. W. at 1640 varas the Winsboro and Black Jack Grove road from which a Hickory 12 in dia mkd H. C. hrs north-easterly 10 yrs. and a Post Oak 20 in dia marked H. C. hrs Southeast 15 yrs. at 1900 $\frac{1}{2}$ yrs set stone from which a Black Oak 18 in dia hrs S. 45 W. 1 yr. mkd 28 and 3

5th mile

Hence West at 500 varas a branch 100 wide course South. at 500 yrs - East boundary of the John Shaw survey 900 yrs. north from the S. E. corner of some - at 1900 $\frac{1}{2}$ yrs on earthen mound for 4th mile from which a black Jack 10 in dia marked H. C. hrs N. 63. E. 7 yrs. and a black Oak 8 in dia hrs. S. 70. W. 1 yrs. mkd H. C.

6th mile

Hence west at 115 yrs a road a black jack

marked N. E. on north side and W. C. on south side. at 285 yrs a branch 1 yr wide course n. S. W., at 1220 yrs. a branch 1 yr wide course n. 15 W., at 1900⁸/10 yrs. set stone for 6th mile. from which a black jack 10 in dia marked W.C. bxs. S. 2 yrs - and a post oak 20 in dia marked H. C. bxs n. 65 6. 12 yrs.

7th mile

Hence west 180 yrs small road from which a Post Oak 14 in dia bxs South 15 W. 3 yrs marked W. H. C., at 1250 yrs. a branch 1 yr wide course S. E. at 1860 yrs a branch 3 yrs wide course north at 1900⁸/10 yrs a low mound for seventh mile. from which a Post Oak 25 in dia marked H. H. 7 - bxs due East 8 yrs.

8th mile

Hence west at 110 yrs the most easterly Fruitnow and Sulphur Springs road via Black Oak Church. from which a P. O. 17 in dia bxs n. E. 12 yrs marked H. C. and a Post. O. 16 in dia bxs S. E. 10 yrs - marked H. C. at 1500 yrs creek 3 yrs wide course north at 1900⁸/10 yrs a Post Oak 70 in dia marked H. C. on north side and H. C. on south side. a willow oak 14 in dia bxs north 5 yrs - a Post Oak 18 in dia marked 8 bxs south 6. yrs.

9th mile

Hence west at 560 yrs Honey Creek Course W. S. W. at 920 yrs branch 1 yr wide course S. E. at 1900⁸/10 yrs - set stone from which a Post Oak 12 in dia marked H. C. bxs north 2 yrs - a Post. O. 10 in dia marked H. C. bxs S. W. 2 yrs -

10th mile

Hence west at 1200 vs branch, or wide course S. at 660 vs. a branch 12. wide course south at 1900 vs built on eorthow mound for 10th mile from which a P. O. 16 in dia marked N. 10. lbs due south, 12 vs. and a Post oak marked W. 12 in dia lbs S. 32 W. 10 vs.

11th mile

Hence west at 1000 vs N. E. of a sorghum orchard bank of Coffee Creek. at 1030 vs Coffee Creek 6 vs wide course S. at 1900 vs built on eorthow mound from which a P. O. 20 in dia marked N. N. 20 - 11 lbs north 1 vs. a P. O. 30 in dia marked N. lbs N. 53 E.

12th mile

Hence west at 1800 vs to Sulphur Springs. Riley Springs and Quitman road. a P. O. 10 in dia marked N. 6. lbs north east a Blk oak marked w. lbs South east. at 1900 vs built mound for 12th mile from which a Red oak 8 in dia marked X. in running this mile the west boundary line of Nacogdoches University Land was crossed at a point 885 vs. north of the south west corner of some -

Hence west at 200 vs Ranning Creek 6 vs. wide course S. a bending sweet gum on west side 2 feet dia 7 lbs N. on east side + w. on west side at 720 vs branch 12 ft. wide course south. at 1500 vs. a road a Post O. 14 in dia on west side marked W. another 12 in dia on west side marked N. at 1900 vs. a Post oak 12 in dia marked 13 on east side

and 18 on west side. From which a P. O. 20 in

P. O. 14 in dia mld H. bxs South 3 vs. and

wide course south a P. O. 12 in dia mld
H. L. (on each bank) another 12 in dia on
some bank mld H. L., at 1900^{glo} vs a P. O. 8

north side. a P. O. 1 in dia bxs. n. E. 1/2 vs.
a P. O. 6 in dia bxs n. W. 2 vs. both mottled

Thence west at 900000 the boundary
line of Rains County, in which we set a
petrified log 8 in dia for corner, from which
a P. O. 24 in dia mka 1t. C. bro S. 89 E.
9 vrs. another P. O. 16 in dia mka P. C. bro
S. 40 W. 7 vrs. another P. O. 24 in dia mka
1t. C. bro N. 18 E. 8 vrs. thus completing the
Survey of said line on the 28th day of Octo-
ber 1880


