and Dickey Counties.

And now at this time to wit: September 12<sup>th</sup>  
1903 E. H. Clark the Surveyor duly appointed  
at the June term of this Court to represent  
and act for Dickey County, in surveying  
and establishing the County line between  
County 62236



the Counties of Gray and Douley, make due return of the field notes and a map of said Survey to the Court: said report came before the Court for examination and approval. It appearing to the Court from the evidence introduced, that the Surveyor appointed to run and mark said line for Gray County failed to appear at the time and place appointed, and that the said E. R. Clark did so appear, Mark Kussely, the Surveyor for Wheeler County also appeared: That in conjunction with each other they proceeded to mark and establish the line between Gray and Wheeler Counties: The said E. R. Clark joining in the Survey of this line for the purpose of establishing the North East Corner of Douley County. The said Surveyors surveyed and marked the line to a point thirty (30) miles South of the starting point said point being the South West Corner of Wheeler County and the North East Corner of Douley County. The Surveyor appointed by Gray County still failing to appear and join in said Survey. The said E. R. Clark proceeded alone to perform the duties assigned to him, and duly made his report aforesaid to the County Court of Douley County, the County employing him as aforesaid.



The Court, after carefully examining said report and finding that the law in such case made and provided had been substantially complied with, and being fully advised considers that the same is correct.

It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the Court that said report be and the same is hereby in all things approved.

It is further ordered that said report be recorded as evidence of said boundary line, and that such boundary line so surveyed and marked shall be regarded as and shall be the true boundary line between the Counties of Gray & Doolley.

It is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court make a Certified Copy of said report and map, and of this order and forward the same to the Commissioner of the General Land Office at Austin Texas.

The following is a copy of an order entered on the minutes of the County Court of Gray County, at the May term 1903

"It coming to the knowledge of the County Court of Gray Co. that the east, south and west boundary lines of said County have not been properly located, it is ordered by said Court that Y. W. Brown be employed to locate said boundary lines, commencing at the North east corner of Gray County thence running south to Southeast corner of said County, thence west to southwest corner of said County, thence north to Northwest corner of said County.

Stone monuments (properly marked) to be placed at initial corners of said County and galvanized iron pipe (properly marked) driven in ground at end of every mile on boundary line of said County,

It is further ordered that said survey shall commence on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August A D 1903, and continue until completed. It is also ordered that the County Courts of Wheeler, Douney



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and Carriers Comities be notified by  
sending each a written copy of this  
order in time to be received by them  
at least two days before the next regular  
meeting of their respective County Courts,"

The County Court of Gray County having duly made an order (a certified copy of which is herewith attached marked Exhibit "A") for the establishment of the County line between the Counties of Gray and Donley and having duly sent a copy of said order to the County Court of Donley County, which was duly received in which order it was stated that the Survey should be commenced on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August 1903 at the N.E. Cor of Gray County.

Pursuant to said Notice the County Court of Donley County duly appointed E. R. Clark the present Surveyor of the Donley Land District, an experienced and competent practical Surveyor to proceed at the time and place designated in said order to assist in running and establishing said line, requiring said Surveyor first to file his bond and take the oath of office as required by law, which bond was duly executed, approved and filed before proceeding with said Survey.

Pursuant to the orders of the Court and Commissioner of the General Land Office  
Counter # 68,241



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I E. W. Clark having taken the oath of office and filed my bonds was on the morning of August the 10<sup>th</sup> 1903 at the place designated prepared to commence said Survey.

At this time there was no Surveyor present representing the other Counties interested.

On August the 8<sup>th</sup> I was informed by Geo. W. Saunders County Judge of Gray County that YW Brown the Surveyor appointed by the County Court of Gray County, to represent said County in said Survey, would not be present, but that he had made arrangements with Judge Strubling, Surveyor of Roberts County, to represent Gray Co.

About noon on the 10<sup>th</sup> Judge Strubling appeared and said that he was not ready, had no data and there was nothing in sight for him and refused to join in the Survey, and thereupon I commenced the Survey under the Statute in Judge Strubling's presence, and on the morning of August the 11<sup>th</sup>

Mr Mark Hensby the Surveyor representing Wheeler County appeared.

He was satisfied with the work done on Monday and from that time proceeded in conjunction with me to establish the line between Wheeler and Gray Counties, The following are the field notes of said Survey.



Beginning at the Common Corner of Humphells, Wheeler, Gros and Roberts Counties, a conglomerate sand and gravel rock set in ground and the part above ground is 12 x 14 x 15 inches and marked on the N.E. side [H] and on the N.W. side [LC STR 188] and on the S.W. side [G] and on the S.E. side [W] and on top [10]. I took the following witnesses to said cor. a square pit dug at N.E. edge of small dry lake with brown bottle mhd 14 in bottom, buried in centre, with neck sticking up, brs S 44 1/2 W 47 7/10 vs another pit triangular in shape dug near head of draw with piece of casting buried in bottom, brs S 61 3/4 E. 100 vs. Mr. Johnsons windmill brs S 56 W. about 550 vs. Said rock is also the S.W. Cor. of Sec No 13, Block A. 2, H & G. N. Ry Co Sm.
