The application of THE CHIEF OF NAVAL AIR ADVANCED TRAINING. U. S. NAVAL AIR STATION, CORPUS CHRISTI, TEXAS, for amendment of an existing restricted area to be used for seaplane landings in CORPUS CHRISTI BAY AND LAGUNA MADRE, AT A LOCATION IN FOUR AREAS CENTRAL TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY 8 MILES EAST FROM CORPUS CHRISTI, TEXAS, will be considered at a public hearing to be held by the undersigned in the District Court Room, Nueces County Court House, Corpus Christi. Texas. beginning at 1:30 P.M. on Thursday. 7 February 1952.

All interested parties are invited to be present or to be represented at the above time and place, particularly the officials of any county, city, town, navigation district, local association, or shipping interest whose interest may be affected by the proposed work. They will be given an opportunity to express their views upon the suitability of the location relative to navigation or other water uses, and to suggest changes considered desirable.

Oral statements will be heard, but for accuracy of record all important facts and arguments should be submitted in writing, in quintuplicate, as the records of the hearing will be forwarded for consideration by the Department of the Army. Written statements may be handed to the presiding officer at the hearing or mailed to reach this office at least five days prior to the date of the hearing.

According to the plans submitted, the proposed seaplane restricted area would include the following four areas (see attached location map):

South Area (Existing Restricted Area):

Beginning at a point on the south shore of Corpus Christi Bay at the "North Gate" of the U. S. Naval Air Station at approximate longitude 97° 17' 15" west, thence 312° 20' 6,500 yards to latitude 27° 44' 30" north, longitude 97° 20' 00" west, thence 00° 00' 4,100 yards to latitude 27° 46' 30" north, longitude 97° 20' 00" west, thence 126° 20' 7,665 yards to latitude 27° 44' 12" north, longitude 97° 16' 31" west, thence 111° 22' 6,250 yards to latitude 27° 43° 04" north, longitude 97° 13° 12" west, thence 201° 00° 5,000 yards to latitude 27° 40° 44" north, longitude 97° 14° 12" west, thence 245° 00° to a point on the east shore of Encinal Peninsula at latitude 27° 40° 00" north, thence generally northerly along the shore to Flour Bluff Point and thence westerly along the south shore of Corpus Christi Bay to point of origin. The regulations prescribing this area and governing its use were approved by the Secretary of the Army on 21 February 1951. They were published in the Federal Register on 14 March 1951 and were codified as 33 C.F.R. 207.188. Public Notice of their approval was sent to all known interested parties and to 37 Post Offices on 20 March 1951.

The applicant proposes the following regulations to govern the seaplane restricted area described above: (1) No vessel or watercraft of any type shall enter or remain in the area at any time, day or night, except as provided in this paragraph.

- (2) Clearance for watercraft operating in the area on set schedules and on prescribed routes may be granted upon written application to the enforcing agency.
- (3) Changes in schedules and routes may be made upon written application to the enforcing agency.
- (4) Off schedule operations of craft or operation over unprescribed routes may be authorized, in cases of necessity, upon special application in each case. These applications shall be made in writing to the enforcing agency, except as provided in subparagraph (5) of this paragraph.
- (5) Commercial fishermen, geophysical exploration crews, and personnel of oil companies holding leases within the area will not be required to operate on set schedules or over prescribed routes but, in order to enter the area, either day or night, they shall have proper identification and the approval of the enforcing agency.

The applicant has modified the proposed regulations to govern the West, North and East areas as follows:


(1) No structure, surface or sub-surface, shall be erected within the restricted area without express authorization in writing of the enforcing agency.

"Structure" is defined as any form of construction of a permanent or temporary character, including any apparatus used in the construction, alteration, or repair of any such structure.

The additional regulations, listed in the notice of public hearing dated 26 December 1951 as (1) through (5) and renumbered (2) through (6), would be invoked only when exigencies of the service due to mobilization or increased expansion should require.

The South area would be governed by the regulations (1) through (6) listed in the notice of public hearing dated 26 December 1951.
