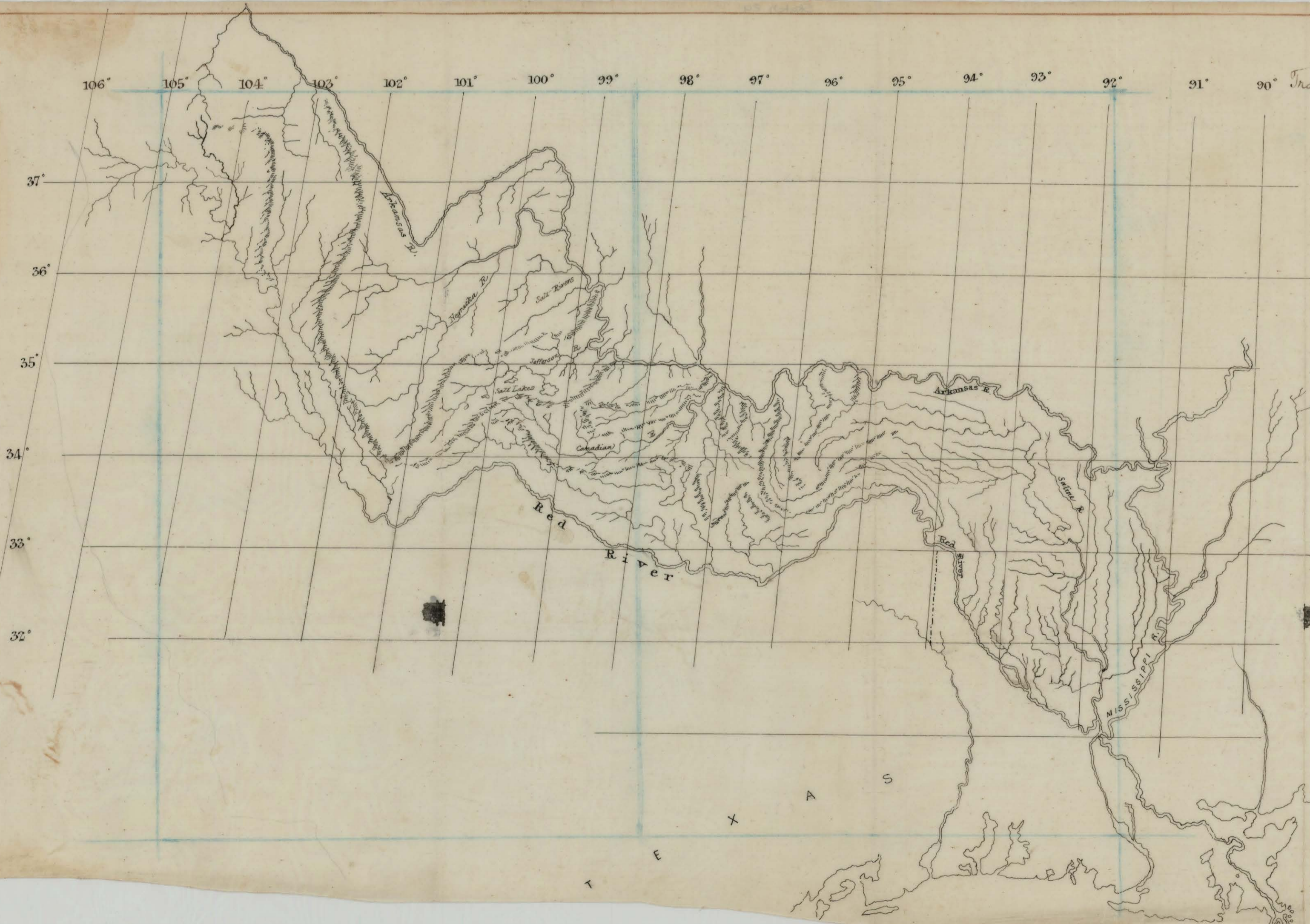

Tracing of a part of the map referred to in Article 3 of the Treaty between the United States and Spain concluded February 22, 1819, showing the territory through which run the Arkansas and Red Rivers, between 32° and 37° degrees of Latitude North, and 90° and 106° Longitude west from London. The title of the said map being: Map of the United States with the contiguous British & Spanish possessions compiled from the latest and best authorities by John Melish. Engraved by J. Vallance and H. S. Tanner. Entered according to Act of Congress the 6th day of June 1816. Published by John Melish Philadelphia. Improved to the 1st of January 1818.
