# **REPORT OF SURVEY OF BLOCK 76, PUBLIC SCHOOL LAND**

Mr. Zane Kiehne, by virtue of his ownership, has requested that we perform the necessary surveys and prepare the documents so that he may obtain patent on Sections 1 through 24, Sections 26 through 28, and Sections 33 through 35, Block 76, Public School Land, Loving County, Texas.

Block 76 lies in northeastern Loving County, Texas. It is bounded on the South and West by the Texas and Pacific Railway Co. Surveys within the 16 mile reservation set aside by the Texas Legislature. The northern boundary of Block 76 is called to be the Texas and New Mexico line, and was originally described in field notes by Dennis Corwin in 1881. Mr. Corwin was locating lands for the University System, however it was one of several of his blocks not taken by the University, but was incorporated into the Public Free School Fund. His field notes found in the Land Office Archives describe the Block being 8 miles North-South by 6 miles East-West and containing 48 sections of 640 acres or 30,720 acres of land.

In April and May of 1859, John H. Clark, U.S. Boundary Commissioner, conducted the survey of the 32<sup>nd</sup> Parallel in the vicinity of where Block 76 now lies. Commissioner Clark, along with the Texas Commissioner, Mr. Scurry, had commenced their work in January of that year at the intersection of said 32<sup>nd</sup> Parallel with the Rio Grande. In a report to the General Land Office dated September 30, 1861, Commissioner Clark described the survey of said parallel and the astronomical work performed along its route. Of particular interest in the vicinity of Block 76 is his description of Monument 27, which he describes as "a mound of earth at supply camp on the Plain. Has a large stick of timber in centre". One must take note of the harshness of the country in which they were working. Aside from the usual task of keeping a water supply for men and animals, the report states that the party also encountered temperatures "20 to 35 degrees below freezing" and by "storm so violent as to turn over wagons, lift the instrument from the tripod, and fill the atmosphere with dust and gravel". Mr. Scurry, the Texas Commissioner, reportedly left the party after reaching the Pecos. An astronomical observation was made near the Pecos and a prolongation of the tangent was run eastward for 35 miles and a "flag was set on the 'Llano Estaco'", and this portion of the parallel was marked by 4 monuments. The party then returned to the Pecos and moved camp to the proximity of the 103<sup>rd</sup> meridian, where the 5<sup>th</sup> and last astronomical observation was made.

Seventeen years later, in August of 1876, W.B. Champlin and James L. Peck, Deputy Surveyors for the Texas and Pacific Railway, surveyed Block 53, Township 2, and Blocks 54 through 57, Townships 1 and 2. Only 3 monuments called for in their field notes have reportedly been recovered, these being recognized as Clark's Monuments 26 and 27 on the 32<sup>nd</sup> Parallel, and Peck's Rock Mound near the Pecos River at the Southeast corner of Section 43, Block 55, Township 2. In the field notes on Section 4, Block 54, Township 1, Mr. Champlin made a passing call on the South boundary of the Territory of New Mexico for a "Pine St. in Earth Mound about 6" dia. 2 feet high Mound about 7 feet dia." (taken to be Clark Monument 27). Again in the field notes of Section 2, Block 56, Township 1, Mr. Champlin makes a passing call for a "large Pine Tree 10' high 16" dia. Surrounded at base by a circular Rock Mound 2 ½' high by 7 ft. in dia" (taken to be Clark Monument 26).

David Dewhurst, Commissiones By Douglas Howard Counter # 76377 By 1902, the State of Texas had caused to be surveyed the remaining Public Domain. W.D. Twichell, a surveyor of recognition, was awarded the contract to survey the remaining public lands in Loving County. Among these are the "C" Blocks lying East of Block 76 and also South of Block 53, Township 2, T. & P. Ry. Co. Surveys. His intent was to place Block C-26, Public School Land, East of and abutting Block 76. Mr. Twichells' work on the XIT lands in the panhandle caused him to find and retrace much of the John H. Clark survey of the 103rd Meridian, from the Northwest corner of Texas, southerly to the Southeast corner of New Mexico in the early 1890's. From this work he was able to identify many of the Clark Monuments of 1859 and 60. His findings placed the 103rd Meridian survey some two to three miles West of the true meridian. He was very familiar with Clarks' work by 1902, when he found and identified many of the Clark Monuments on the 32nd parallel from the Southeast corner of New Mexico to the Pecos River, most notably in our case, was the Clark Monument 27. His note book indicates that he found a "Pine Post charred by prairie fire bears S. 73 vs. - 5" dia. Post badly burned & rotted, Stn. Md. Around post - T mk ? ...added 2" iron pipe". K Sketch (Winkler County Rolled Sketch 13 -GLO) by Mr. Twichell indicates a double circle, the same as he shows for the Clark Monument 26. To locate the East line of Block 76, he then used the passing call of 9 mile + 1550 varas (3 miles + 1550 varas made by Mr. Champlin to the Northeast corner of Block 54, Township 1, T. & P. Ry. Co. Survey, in addition to the 6 miles as called for by Mr. Corwin) to locate the West line of Block C-26, but placed its Northwest corner in a northerly position closer to the true 32nd Parallel.

The U.S. Boundary Commission, under authorization from both the State of Texas and the United States, in 1911 caused a resurvey of the 32<sup>nd</sup> Parallel between Texas and New Mexico. The report signed by Francis M. Cockrell, Commissioner on the part of the United States, and Sam R. Scott, Commissioner on the part of the State of Texas, stated "Arthur D. Kidder, U.S. Examiner of Surveys, in 1893, found and identified the Clark Monuments 4 and 31 on the 32<sup>nd</sup> Parallel, and identified the location of Monument 32 as well as the Southeast corner of New Mexico, as marked by <u>Maury</u> Harris, and afterwards identified by Mr. Twichell, the Texas Surveyor, and which was determined by us to be the corner actually located by Clark in 1859, the SE Cor. N.M.". The Cockrell et al report indicates the Clark Monuments 4, 8, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 22, 24, 25, 26 and 31 were found and identified on the resurvey.

J.E. Whiteside SF 13984, patented July 21, 1980, lies between Block 76 and the Texas-New Mexico State Line as resurveyed in 1911. E.L. Stratton, County Surveyor of Loving County, in 1938, made an on the ground survey and prepared Field Notes for 454.6 acres of land. The survey covers an area 225 varas North-South by 10404.8 varas East-West and is monumented by 2" iron stakes. In reply to a Mr. Frank Aguirre in Mentone, Texas, on April 16, 1948, concerning the placement of the Whiteside survey between Block 76 and the State Line, Bascom Giles, Commissioner of the General Land Office, indicated that because of the call by the T. & P. Surveyor for Clarks monuments of 1859, the North line of the T. & P. blocks would be the line of Clarks work.

Several surveys, on which patents issued, were found to exist between Block 76 and Block C-26. These include: (1) the J.E. Whiteside SF 14020, patented July 21, 1980 on Field Notes by E.L. Stratton, County Surveyor of Loving County, (2) J.B. Walling SF 15342, patented March 23, 1953 on compiled notes by Herman Forbes, Draftsman of the General Land Office. The W.D. Johnson SF 15467 file contains Field Notes by Clifford Cool, Licensed State Land Surveyor, and marked on reverse as correct on map for 98.50 acres and signed by V.E. Sterling, File Clerk of the Land Office.

In May of 1940, E.L. Stratton, said County Surveyor of Loving County, made a survey for Mrs. Effie Camfield in reference to SF 14170. This survey placed a vacancy some 490 to 530 varas wide between said Block 76 and Block C-26, as surveyed by Mr. Twichell in 1902. On September 25, 1942, Commissioner Giles gave notice that her vacancy application was "Rejected-No Vacancy".

#### **Construction Of Block 76**

Time has passed and many surveys have run on the ground concerning Block 76. However, only by relying on the original work of Surveyors' Clark, Champlin, Peck, Corwin, and Twichell, can we truly find its Original position.

According to the Field Notes of Block 76, Mr. Corwin begins at the Northwest corner of Block 53, Township 2, Texas and Pacific Ry. Co. Survey. This corner has not been marked upon the ground by any accepted survey according to the record information, nor has any recognized monument been recovered. This places the burden of having to reconstruct the T.& P. Surveys from recognized monumentation as called for by Surveyor's Peck and Champlin on their original surveys in 1876 before the location of Block 76 may be addressed.

The T. & P. Blocks 53 through 57, T1 and T2, as surveyed, must be considered as a complete system. The Field Notes of Survey 1, Block 53, T2, call to begin at a "stake and earth mound which is eight miles South and 30 miles West from, the Southeast corner of New Mexico. By progressing in a westerly direction, we find that Survey 1 Block 54, T1, calls to begin on the South Boundary line of Texas and of New Mexico which is 36 miles West of the Southeast corner of said Territory". Continuing Westerly, in the Field Notes of Survey 4, Block 54, T1, the first reference to a physical monument of any durable nature is found "Thence West at 950 vs. to Earth Mound and 2 pits in South boundary line of Territory of New Mexico at 1550 vs. a Pine Stake in Earth Mound about 6 dia 2 feet high mound about 7 feet in dia". This would make it 39 miles plus 1550 varas West of the Southeast corner of New Mexico

The above reference to the mound and pine stake is recognized as a passing call to the Clark Monument No. 27 on the Texas – New Mexico boundary. This monument was further preserved by W.D.Twichell in 1902 with the addition of a 2" iron pipe, and can be found today.

Based upon the above information, we find that to locate the East line of the T. & P. system, we must go the call of 9 miles plus 1550 varas, in an Easterly direction along an arc having a radius equal to the 32<sup>nd</sup> parallel, between the Clark Monument 27 and the Clark Monument 31 near the Southeast corner of New Mexico, then run a course due South. The Northwest corner of Block 54, Township 1 being located also along this arc at 3 miles plus 1550 varas from said Monument 27.

To ascertain the terminus of the East line of Block 53, Township 2, (being the Southeast corner of Section 48, Block 53, T2), we project a line due East from a found  $\frac{3}{4}$ " galvanized iron pipe with reducer on top (W.D. Twichell) in the North line of Section 1, Block C – 27, Public School Land Survey (per Judgement of District Court of Reeves County Cause 5050). The Northeast corner of Section 1, Block 53, Township 2 is then located at the Mid-point between said Southeast corner on Section 48, Block 53, T2 and the previously established point 9 miles plus 1550 varas Easterly of said Monument 27.

In the above recited Judgement and in the Judgement of Cause 5109, we find several monuments called for in the North line of said Block C-27, the W. & N.W. Ry. Co. Blocks 1 and 2, the H. & T. C. Ry. Co. Block 33 and School Land Block C-20. These found monuments were adjudicated as marking the South line of the T. & P. Systems. The Southwest corner of Section 43, Block 53, Township 2, can be located by prorating the distance between the Southeast corner of Section 43, Block 55, Township 2 (McCombs monument) and the above described Southeast corner of said Section 48, Block 53, Township 2, and would fall in the line between monuments found in the North line of the W. & N.W. Block 2.

We can now locate the Northwest corner of T.&P.Ry.Co. Block 53, Township 2 (also the Southwest and beginning corner of said Block 76) at the mid-point between the now established Southwest corner of said Section 43, Block 53, Township 2, and the Northeast corner of Section 1, Block 54, Township 1, as established in the "South boundary of the Territory of New Mexico" as it is called for in the original field notes of Surveyors, Champlin, Peck and Corwin.

In constructing the boundaries of Block 76. Mr. Corwin's task was to occupy the space not taken by T. & P.Ry.Co. in what would have been Block 53, Township 1 by their system. It would seem reasonable that Mr. Corwin's intention was to place the West & South boundary of his Block 76 coincident with the T. & P. Blocks. He makes a call to go "North 8 miles to the S. Boundary line of New Mexico". This would be the same boundary as the T. & P. Surveyors used in 1876. In locating the East line of Block 76, we must use his call of "6 miles" since he makes no other reference for adjoiners.

Mr. Corwin's map as preserved in the General Land Office archives does not divide and number Block 76 into Sections as he does for his other blocks. Our only method for determining their division is to rely on the earliest maps of Loving County. These indicate a division of 48 Sections numbered the same as the T. & P. Blocks. Each section would be determined by intersecting lines (North – South) with the arc East – West from respective prorated corners along the boundaries of Block 76.

We find that portions of SF 13984, SF 14020, SF 15342 and SF15467 are partially in conflict with Block 76 as originally defined. Since patents issued on the portion of these files adjacent to land in Block 76 held in fee by Mr. Kiehne, and he also holds fee to the overlapping portions of the SF 13984 and SF 14020, we have prepared Field Notes on those portions of Sections 1 though 6, 13, and 24, lying clear of conflict, for patents. Field Notes on the portions of above sections that are in conflict have also been prepared so that the original files may be split, and all rights of the original purchaser may be preserved.
