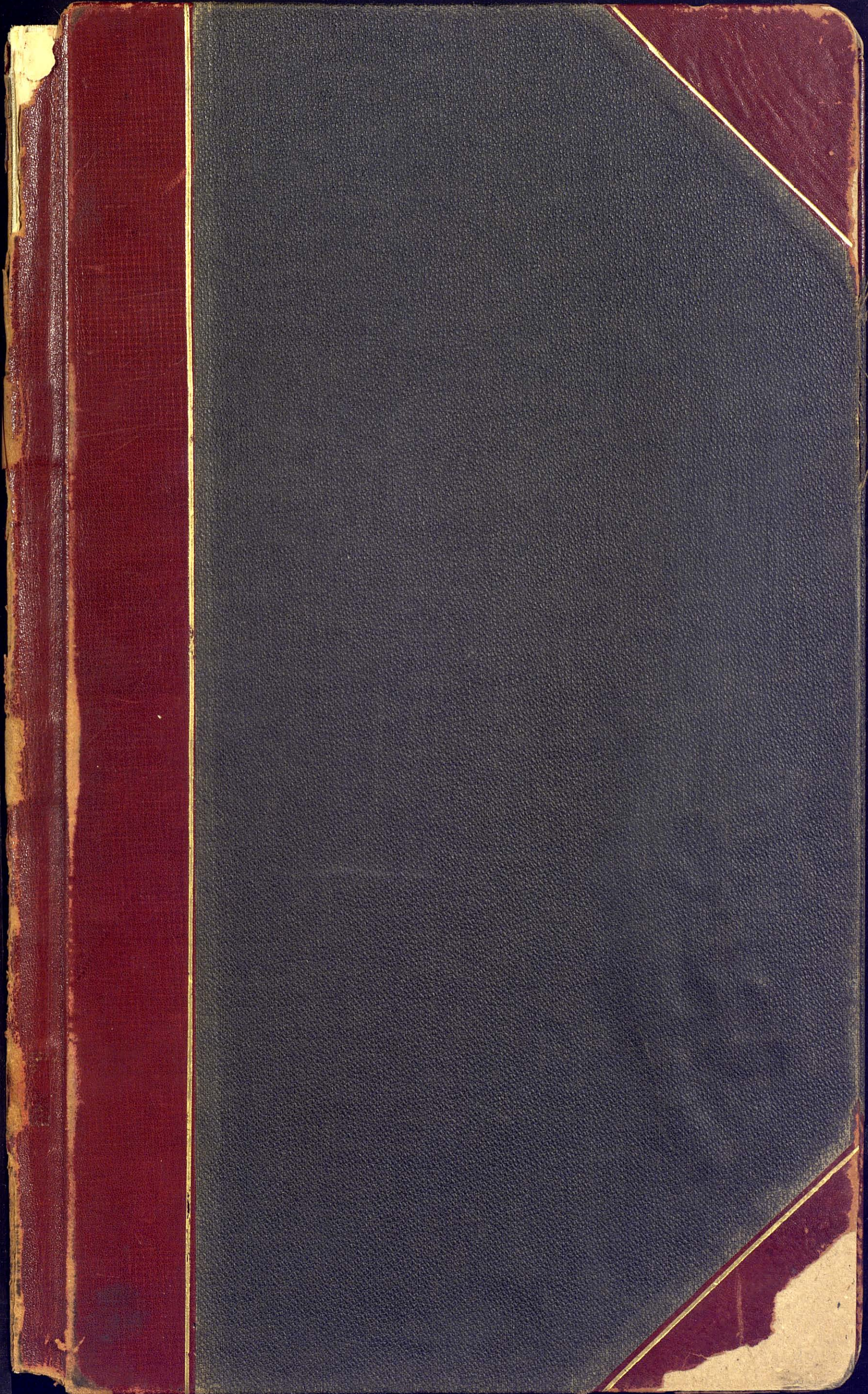

Dear Sir,

I am forwarding to you under separate cover the fieldnotes sent to me for correction and calls for windmills omitted.

In the Dallam County Tract the call for the League corner at the N E corner of survey 64, and S E 33, is corrected. In Survey 70, which was sent back for correction or explanation of the difference between the calls in the fieldnotes and the calls on the Plat sent you by my father, I find that the call of S 89°46'W 468.1 varas for the South line of 70 is correct and can be checked by the total distance between this corner of 70 and the corner of 65, given in the report and in the Partition Line Notes. The call of N 89°44'W 504.1 varas on the plat is in error and should be corrected to read N 89°42'W 471.5 varas, the change in course was to fit the Lane fence and call at this point, and the distance of 504.1 varas was taken from the preliminary survey notes and does not take into consideration the Lane calls, as the final survey does. I have corrected the West line to read North 1974 varas instead of North 1985.

The call in Survey 65, of S 89°44'E 482.5 varas on the plat should be corrected to read S 89°42'E 471.5 varas, to the west line of the lane, which was taken at this point, and in the next call S 0°42'E instead of South as shown on the plat. This course of south was taken from the Partition Notes and is the call for the Syn. Subdivision Line, at this point and not the Lane call which was taken for the final survey. I believe that this covers all points in the Dallam County Lands to be corrected.

In the Hartley County Tract, I have given the calls for windmills and for the League Corners, and have corrected the fieldnotes of the Rim surveys as follows.

Survey 1, the first call of the bluff meanders is corrected to S 3°50'W 156 varas, the 19th. call from S 18°W 179 varas to S 18°E 179 varas, the 23rd. call from N 72°W 71 varas to N 72°E 71 varas, the 40th. call from S 13°30'W to S 13°30'E 100 varas, the 42nd. call from S 83°E to S 83°W 181 varas, the 54th. call from West 27 to West 28 varas, and the 55 th call from N 0°49'W 2917 varas to N 0°49'W 2674 varas, this closes the survey and also corrects the calls of the adjoining surveys. Survey 2, I have corrected the North line to read 2673.8 varas, Survey 10. I have corrected the West line to read S 0°49'E 1205 varas.

Hoping that these corrections and explanations of the difference between the fieldnotes and plat meet with your approval I am,

Dear Sir,

I herewith respectfully submit the following Report of the Survey recently made by me for the State of Texas of lands in ~~the~~ Dallam and Hartley Counties, Texas.

Object of the Survey.

To definitely mark on the ground the lines and corners of two tracts of land awarded to the State of Texas by final Decree in the 53rd Judicial District Court, Travis Co. Texas, dated April 28, 1924, in cause No 36183, wherein the State of Texas was Plaintiff and Geo. P. Finlay et al. Defendants.

And to subdivide said tracts of land into lots suitable and convenient for sale as part of the Public Free School Land.

Authority for the Survey.

A letter from the Hon. Commissioner of the General Land Office of Texas dated April 28, 1924, appointing me as Surveyor for the State of Texas, for the purpose of surveying the lands recovered by the State from the Capitol Syndicate in Dallam and Hartley Counties, Texas.

Data for the Survey.

Copies of the Official County Maps of Dallam and Hartley Counties.

Copy of the Decree of Court awarding these lands to the State.

Copy of the Report of the Partitioners appointed by the Court to select these lands, containing maps and detailed description of the lands selected by the Partitioners and awarded by the Court according to said maps and descriptions.

Copy of Schedule "X", a map of the Capitol Syndicate Leagues showing those leagues set apart by the Court for the selection of the acreage recovered by the State.

Lithograph maps, kindly furnished by the Trustees of the Capitol Syndicate lands, showing the original league lines and corners as surveyed on the ground, and the Capitol Syndicate Subdivisions of said Leagues, which Subdivisions were used by the Court in Schedule "X" in the description and definition of the lands from which the Partitioners were to select the required acreage for the State.

These Capitol Syndicate Subdivisions were also used by the Partitioners in describing the lands selected by them in their report, which description of said lands was accepted and approved by the Court and made part of the Decree awarding these lands to the State of Texas.

Preliminary Examination of Field Notes.

The Land to be surveyed was that awarded by the Decree of the Court to the State of Texas out of the lands known as the Capitol Syndicate Grant.

The original survey of the 3000000 acres constituting the Capitol Syndicate Grant was made on the ground in subdivisions of Leagues. The field notes of these leagues are found in the Patents to these Leagues issued by the State and on record in the General Land Office.

I was already familiar with the lines and corners of the original leagues in Dallam and part of Hartley Counties, having assisted in a resurvey of these leagues made some years ago for and by the authority of the State of Texas, and knew the location on the ground of many of the original marked corners of these leagues, having identified them by a connected chain of corners starting at the Monument at the N.W. corner of the State.

The land awarded to the State out of these leagues was that selected by the Partitioners acting under order of Court.

The lands selected by the Partitioners are described in their report ~~as~~ by metes and bounds, as starting at or tied to certain marked corners of the leagues patented to one Abner Taylor, and running thence by course and distance on such lines as contain the required acreage allotted to the State.

The lands are further described as including or covering certain of the Capitol Syndicate Subdivisions of the original leagues.

These Subdivisions are known by the survey and block numbers as given on the Capitol Syndicate maps. They are marked on the ground by iron pipes driven at the survey corners and stamped with the numbers of the adjacent subdivisions, and frequently tied to original league corners. The course and distance of the lines of these subdivisions, and the relative position of the league corners, and the acreage of each subdivision, are given on the Maps of the Capitol Syndicate lands issued by the Capitol Syndicate and used by the Partitioners in their report to the Court on which the award was based.

The Report of the Partitioners states that under order of Court they made an actual survey, with transit and chain, of the lands described in their report.

I was one of the Partitioners appointed by the Court and was on the ground when the selection of the lands awarded to the State was made, and acting as surveyor ran the transit and chain for the survey on which the description of the selected lands by metes and bounds was ~~made~~ based, and therefore was familiar with the actual location on the ground of the marked corners and lines, and the objects natural and artificial called for in the field notes describing the acreage of land awarded to the State of Texas by the Decree of Court based on the Report of the Partitioners appointed by the Court to select and define said acreage of land.

History of the Survey.

Having arranged for the equipment and men necessary for the field work of the survey, we went to Dallam County and camped on the Dallam Co. tract of State land on June 8th 1924.

We began our survey at the pipe marking the S.W. corner of the tract and tied to the S.W. cor of Abner Taylor League No. 46, which bears S 51° 50' W 37.5 varas. The League corner was marked by a 3" iron pipe and had been identified on a former survey for the State as noted above.

We later replaced the iron pipe at the S.W. cor sur 70 Cap. Syn. Sub. by a concrete monument 3' long with 2' above the ground, to mark the S.W. corner of the State land.

Thence we ran north along a fence, noting 1 1/2" iron pipes marked with the numbers of the Cap. Syn. Subs. in their Blk 19, and some other pipes and stakes said to have been set for subdivisions of the land west of the fence. This fence belongs to parties owning the lands on the west.

We set one of our 16' flags at this starting corner and could see it from a point 4 1/2 miles north. We reset the iron pipes where necessary for correction of line or distance, chaining twice between the S.W. & N.W. corners of the State tract. Later we marked these old pipes with an "S" and the number of our adjacent subdivision or lot. At S.W. cor of our sub. 80 we set a gal. iron pipe 5 miles south of the north line of tract and 40 varas north of the iron pipe marking N.W. cor Cap Syn. Sub 55. This was done in order to carry the even miles as far south as possible and throw the excess distance into the most southerly surveys.

At the N.W. cor of the tract we later set concrete monument and from this N.W. corner we ran east at a magnetic variation of 12° 15' E, which we found to fit the Cap. Syn. Sub. lines. We found the old pipes under this fence, in places a few inches to 1 vara out in distance, and reset them on line at true distance, chaining and rechaining the line for 5 miles east to a point in the Dalhart and Boise City highway, the road bed having been sold to the County by a Deed of record giving the field notes of the land purchased for this road through the Cap Syndicate lands.

Later we set a concrete Mon. on the west side of the road on the north line of the State land at 10.8 varas west from the 5 mile point near the middle of the road, and another Concrete Mon. on the north line of the State land at a point 10.8 varas east from the 5 mile point in the road, leaving a width of 60' for road as called for in the field notes.

The fence along the north line surveyed was accepted by the partitioners as the dividing line between the State land and the Capitol Syndicate land, the ownership of the fence remaining with the Cap. Syn.

From this N.E. cor of the part of the tract west of the road we ran south, along the west side of the road, crossing and recrossing the fence. The greater part of the fence was out in the road, from a few feet to 5 or 6 varas. The old pipes had been set on the survey line in the middle of the road and had been pulled up when the road was graded. Two of them had been set up under the west fence but were some 12 to 16 varas out of place. The field notes of the road on record show that the Cap. Syn. Sub. section line was the middle of the road and that a strip 10.8 varas wide on either side of this line was the limit of the road bed. We set our pipes according to these field notes 10.8 varas west of the Cap. Syn. Sub. section line at one mile intervals, and later marked them with the numbers of our adjacent lot or subdivision, and set another set of pipes 21.6 varas east of these for the east side of the road, finding this fence also crooked, and marked them for our subdivisions.

Both these fences belong to the State, neither of them intrude on the graded road bed, although they intrude on or recede from the road bed outside the ditches.

Running south along the west side of this road from the N.E. corner of this part of the tract, at 5 miles and 84 varas (exact distance called for) we reached a point 1.5 varas east of a large post from which a fence ran N 89°42'W 1901 varas to an iron pipe marked for the N.W. cor Cap. Syn. Sub. 66.

The extension of this fence east and would reach a high post with pipe on south side of it, at the west end of the south fence of the part of this tract east of the road.

We set a concrete Mon 10.8 varas south of our 5 mile and 84 vara point for the S.W. cor of the road, and 471.5 varas S 89°42'E set another Mon. at turn of road, and 1198 varas S 0°43'E set Mon. about 3 varas inside of fence for S.E. cor of our lot 85, on west side of road, 10.8 varas west of Cap. Syn. Sub. corner.

We ran from this Mon. N 89°42'W 2386- 10.8 varas to an iron pipe set for S.W. cor Cap. Syn. Sub 66 and 1108.5 varas south of pipe at N.W. cor of Sub. 66 noted above at the end of fence running west N 89°42'W 1901 varas from our ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ 5 mile & 84 vara point on west line of road.

We then ran on N 89°42'W 1900.8 varas and marked pipe for S.E. cor of our lot 83. On 1900.8 marked pipe for S.W. cor our 83. On 1900.8 marked pipe for our S.W. 82. On 1881 varas to our Mon. at S.W. 83, above described as S.W. corner of Dallam Co. tract.

We then ran meridian lines from the mile corners set on north fence to the south line. We set pipes at even mile distances from the north for 5 miles throwing the excess southing of the Cap. Syn. Subs. into the southerly surveys, 40 varas on the west line, 84 on the east line, in order to preserve as much uniformity as possible in the 320 acre lots, and throw the excess acreage into the surveys on the south which were already irregular.

We then ran transit lines east and west from the outside corners checking any irregularities in chain measurement on our meridian lines. We could see our flags across the full 5 miles on some of the lines, and on the others three flags were sufficient.

In like manner we ran the north line of the part of the Dallam Co. tract which lies east of the road.

Starting from the Mon. on the road we ran 1890 varas and set pipe, on 1900.8 varas set pipe, on 1900.8 set Mon. for N.E. cor of tract.

This line ran along a fence which the Partitioners recognized as the dividing line between the State land and the Capitol Syndicate land, the Cap. Syn. retaining ownership of the fence.

We turned south and ran south setting pipes at even mile distances for 4 miles, then on south 1401.5 varas to a point in the north line of sur 69 in Blk 47 1/2 H. & T. C. Ry. Co. Here we found a Cap. Syn. Sub. pipe marked 60 61 lying down some 12 steps south of an old fence running nearly east and west.

Thence we ran S 89°20'W 721 varas to an iron pipe 15 steps south of fence corner and some 1 1/2 varas east, marked "B 19". Thence S 0°40'E 554 varas to an iron pipe standing east of the end of a fence about 1 vara.

The fences on these 721 vara and 554 vara lines was allotted to the State and I was informed that the Cap. Syn. would soon set a fence along the east line as marked by our survey.

We now returned to the S.W. cor of our lot 70 on the east side of the Dalhart road and found that the road in order to make the turn at this point would ~~xxx~~ cut a corner off of this survey for about ten varas on the west line and 11 varas on the south line and set a monument at each point to mark the road, and set a pipe 471.5 varas S 89°42'E for the corner of the road on the south line of our lot 70, and a monument 10.8 varas south, at the west end of the south fence as before described.

From this monument we ran N 89°46'E along a fence on the south boundary of our 70, 1890 varas from the west line of 70, and set pipe and marked it "8" 89 for S.W. corner of 71. On 1900.8 set pipe for S.W. 68. on 1183 varas reached pipe set at east ~~xxxx~~ end of fence as described above, and set monument. At pipe N 9°40'W 554 set monument, On N 89°20'E 721 varas set monument for S.E. corner of Dallam County tract. The fence along the south line was allotted to the State.

We then ran the meridians from the corners on the north line to the south line, setting pipes at even mile distances for 4 miles and throwing excess into south surveys.

We then crossed these meridians with transit lines from corners on the east and west lines, correcting for errors in chaining meridian lines.

Our subdivisions were laid out under the personal instruction of the Commissioner of the General Land Office, who was with us on the ground and went over and examined each and every subdivision.

These lots or subdivisions were laid out one mile north and south and 1/2 mile east and west, where possible, containing 320 acres of land each, except where the irregular course of the west line and the road through the tract diminished the acreage. And on the south line of the tract where the construction and acreage was necessarily changed as shown on plat.

I would note that on the east line we tied the S.E. corner of our lot 33 to the S.W. corner of the Abner Taylor League No. 41, which was marked by a mound of white rocks one set in the ground and marked "X", and an iron pipe marked C L 40 41 and stood N 70°12'W 194 varas from our S.E. 33.

This was one of the marked points noted by the Partitioners in their report and is noted here to show that the land we surveyed for the State is the same land allotted to the State by the Partitioners, and that it was part of the land claimed by the Capitol Syndicate under the Abner Taylor patents to the original 3000000 acre grant and does not include or conflict with any lands outside of the limits of the original 3000000 acre grant.

Hartley Co. Tract.

The surface and the shape of the Hartley County tract of land awarded to the State, are quite different from the Dallam County quadrangle.

This tract is irregular in shape, and the west, south and east sides are cut by the intrusion of the rim rock and deep draws, which, in places, are difficult to cross.

We went to the N.E. corner of the tract of land recovered by the State in Hartley County, at an iron pipe set for the N.E. corner of Capitol Syndicate Subdivision No. 86 in their Blk 21 and ran south.

At 272 varas passed pipe set for N.W. corner Cap. Syn. Sub. 83, on at 2173 varas reset pipe on line, On 1900.8 varas reset pipe on line, on 1900.8 varas reached old pipe set for the S.E. corner Cap. Syn. Sub. 88, and connected there with a pipe set at the N.W. corner Cap. League 234, which was found 866 varas north and 143 varas west. This connection is called for in the report of the Partitioners.

There is a fence near the line we ran south, but at the start it is some 15 varas or more east of the N.E. corner of the State land, and crossed and recessed our line, being on our line at the 3 mile and 272 varas where we tied to the League corner. The Capitol Syndicate retain the ownership of this 3 miles of fence and intend to move it to the line we ran.

Returning to the N.E. corner of the State land we ran N 89°53'W as called for and at 1900.8 varas set a pipe marked for our subdivision. At 3801.6 varas pass ~~xxxxi@xxxx~~ old pipe, fence some 16 varas south, on at 846 varas pass an iron pipe set on line on edge of draw, on 72 varas, 918 varas in all set monument for the N.W. corner of the State land at N.W. corner Cap Syn. Sub. 108.

A fence starts some 16 steps north of our line at the N.E. corner of ~~the~~ the State land and crosses the line at about 3/4 of a mile west and passes by the two mile corner about 18 varas south, runs on west about 600 varas and then turns south to the bluff. This is an old fence set before the Cap. Syn. Sub. were surveyed. It was allotted to the State.

Returning to the pipe at S.E. corner Cap. Syn. Sub. 88, we ran south 5 miles along a fence, resetting pipes at mile distances. At the 5 mile point we found the fence made a sudden bend to the west and found a pipe 7 varas west of line. Moved it to place.

We ran this line instead of the west line as it ran over a level surface and could be measured more easily and accurately with the chain than the west line which ran over the rim rock and several steep hills.

Returning again to S.E. 88 C.S. we ran east along a fence, at 1900.8 varas set pipe, on 1900.8 found pipe at corner of fence.

Here later we set monument for outside corner of State land. The fence on this line is straight and on the line. The Cap. Syn. retain ownership of it.

We turned south, ran along a fence (on line) 1900.8 varas to a pipe. later we set monument for outside corner of State land.

Thence we turned east and ran along a fence (fairly straight) 1900.8 varas and set pipe. Thence ran N 89°44'E 1897 varas to an iron pipe set along side a large fence post for N.W. cor Cap. Syn. Sub. No 38.

This post was the corner where the fence turned south and ran 1899 varas to another large corner post with pipe along side of it, set for the S.W. cor of sd sur 38. We found that this mile of fence had been run out by the Cap. Syn. for the purchaser of sd sur 38 and that he had fenced and was holding to this line. These pipes and this fence were the marks accepted by the Partitians as the dividing line between sd sur 38 and the State land, though they did not know that any shortage would be caused by them.

On the other hand, running west from the S.E. cor sd sur 38 comes out 9.9 varas north of the pipe at S.W. 38, and running east from the S.W. cor 55 comes out 8 varas north south of the same pipe.

Hence we find the south line of State lots 36 & 37, and North line 41, 40 & 38 running N 89°44'E. Which gives an excess in northing of some 19 varas on the east side of State lots 39 & 40.38.

The survey seems to have been distorted by the league corner at the reentrant corner on Cap. Syn. Sub. 26.

The three corners at the jog at N.E. cor of State 38, were found marked by a pipe at the north corner, a pipe at the middle or league corner, and a pipe and small concrete monument at the east corner on the Rt. of way fence of the F.W. & D.C. Ry.

We set concrete monuments at the N.W. and S.W. corners of Cap Syn. Sub. 38, and at each of the three corners at the jog at N.E. cor State 38.

We now ran down the right of way fence at S12°08'W, a straight course with the fence, setting pipes (later) at the intersections with lines from the west.

We found a jog in the fence 174 varas N 12°08'E from the north line of the Channing survey. The fence turned west for 36.8 varas and then S 13°11'W 174 varas. This jog was made to let the road cross the R.R. track.

We set monuments at the end of the Rt. of Way fence and at the end of the 174 vara run.

The north line of the Channing survey shows to be the south line of Cap. Syn. Sub. 35, or the State lot 69.

We found this line for 1895 varas west marked by a fence set over certain stones set in the ground and marked, and certain pipes. The pipe at 1895 was marked "C Town L", and one 189 varas east was marked 35 45 for adjacent Cap. Syn. Subs.

Testing this fence by the location of the most westerly pipe relative to corners south and west, we found that it ran at a course which brought it out 19 varas north of the point reached by the course called for, at the east end. We also noted that this fence is shown on the Cap. Syn. map as running north of the south line of their 35.

But on examining the Deed Records we found that the acreage tracts on the north line of the Channing survey had been sold and that tracts 16, 17, 18, &c called in the deeds for the marked rocks and pipes found under the fence, and we saw that the more easterly tract had been planted in wheat and oats up to the fence, showing that the owners were claiming to this boundary.

On consultation with the Commissioner of the General Land Office we were instructed to accept this fence as the south line of the State land and we set a concrete monument at either end of it to mark the south line of the State land at this point.

From the westerly one of these two monuments we ran S 3°15'E 266 varas and set a monument.

Thence we ran N 89°55'W 3624 varas to S.W. cor our 73, set 4 miles south from our monument at N.W. 34, and set a monument.

From this monument we ran south 2640.6 varas and set a monument for the S.E. corner of the Hartley County Tract of State land.

Returning to the monument at S.W. 73 we ran west 1900.8 varas and set pipe, on 1900.8 varas to S.W. 77 above described. On west 1900.8 to a pipe set and marked for S.W. 79. The last three miles ran along a fence which was close to our line, but running on from SW 79 the fence crossed our line and at SW 81 it was 8 vara south, at N.W. 83 the fence was 10 varas south and nearly as far west. From the rise a little south of this pipe which we set at N.W. 83 we could see two miles north to where the fence ran over a pipe set for SW 52, and found course checked.

we ran S 0°47'W and at 2239 passed about 8 varas west of windmill, on at 2640 varas set Monument

From this monument we ran east setting and marking pipes at 662 varas, and at even mile distances connecting with our monument set at S E corner of State land.

As a check we went to our N.W. cor 86 as described above and ran 3640.6 varas south connecting with our pipe on the south line of the tract.

We then ran meridian lines from N.W.7 to SW 28
 N.W.9 to SW 24
 N.W.21 to NW 90
 N.W.34 to SW 73
 N.W.51 to NW 84
 N.W.56 to NW 86

Then we crossed these meridian lines with transit lines run east and west, so that each pipe was checked from two directions.

The subdivisions of the State tract in Hartley County were made under the personal direction of the Commissioner of the General Land Office, who inspected the surveys on the ground.

We ran the meanders of the rim rock making the boundary of survey 1, and also of survey 10, and made plane table survey of the mesa line and rim of draws, sufficiently close as to indicate the general course of a draw through the surveys, and the extent of valley or mesa land on a subdivision, as shown on plat of Hartley County Tract.

Each outside corner was marked by a concrete monument and each pipe marked with an "S" and the number of the adjacent lot of State land.

The survey followed the metes and bounds of the Decree of award and on the north it was marked by pipes and fences accepted by adjacent land owners. On the east the Rt of way fence of the F.W. & D.C. Ry. fixed the boundary. The Channing line was discussed above. The south line was run as called for in the field notes of the award, but so far we had no definite marks for the dividing line between the State land and the H. & T.C. Block 49 adjacent on the west.

We had the notes and marks of the Cap. Syn. Survey line showing where they claimed the line, and the call of the Partitioners for this marked line.

The question of possible conflict between the State and the H. & T.C. had to be determined.

On consulting Cap. Hewrens map of the Syn. Subdivisions it showed that he had connected what he showed on his map to be the original NW corner sur 14 and NE cor sur 15 Blk 49 with his N.W. corner of sur 108 Cap. Syn. Subs. which is the N.W. corner of the State land. But the pipe set at N.W. 108 stands back on the edge of the draw some 72 varas east of the true corner, or full distance, and although it is shown on the map as set back we had no data by which we could tell how far back.

On running the west line of our 83 we passed the well at 2239, and 64.8 varas on reached a pipe marked 22 33, evidently intended for the corner of these surveys in Blk 49, but this was not an original Blk 49 corner.

We examined the field notes of Blk 49 on record in Channing, and found that the original surveyor had placed a row of marked corners with bearings on the line one mile west from the east edge of the block. With copies of the field notes we went on the ground at our N.E. cor sur 82 State land and ran west 730 varas the distance called for to the west line of the State land, on west 1901 varas, 2631 varas in all, then turned south and ran 403 varas to a point 5.3 varas east of a rock mound from which the bearings called for at N.W. cor sur 27 Blk 49 H. & T.C. fit the calls. These bearings were plain and unmistakable. This showed that there was no conflict between the H. & T.C. Ry. east line and the west line of the State land, but that there was a slight excess in westing between them. This Blk 49 cor was found 403 varas south of our State land line here and on west line our 83 it was found 403 varas south and on our line. The NW cor 27 was found 5.3 west, so that if any difference in variation was made in the two blocks the H. & T.C. would seem to require the greater and would run away from and not toward the State line.

I think this covers the facts on which the survey was based, the methods employed, the facts developed and the results obtained on the survey.

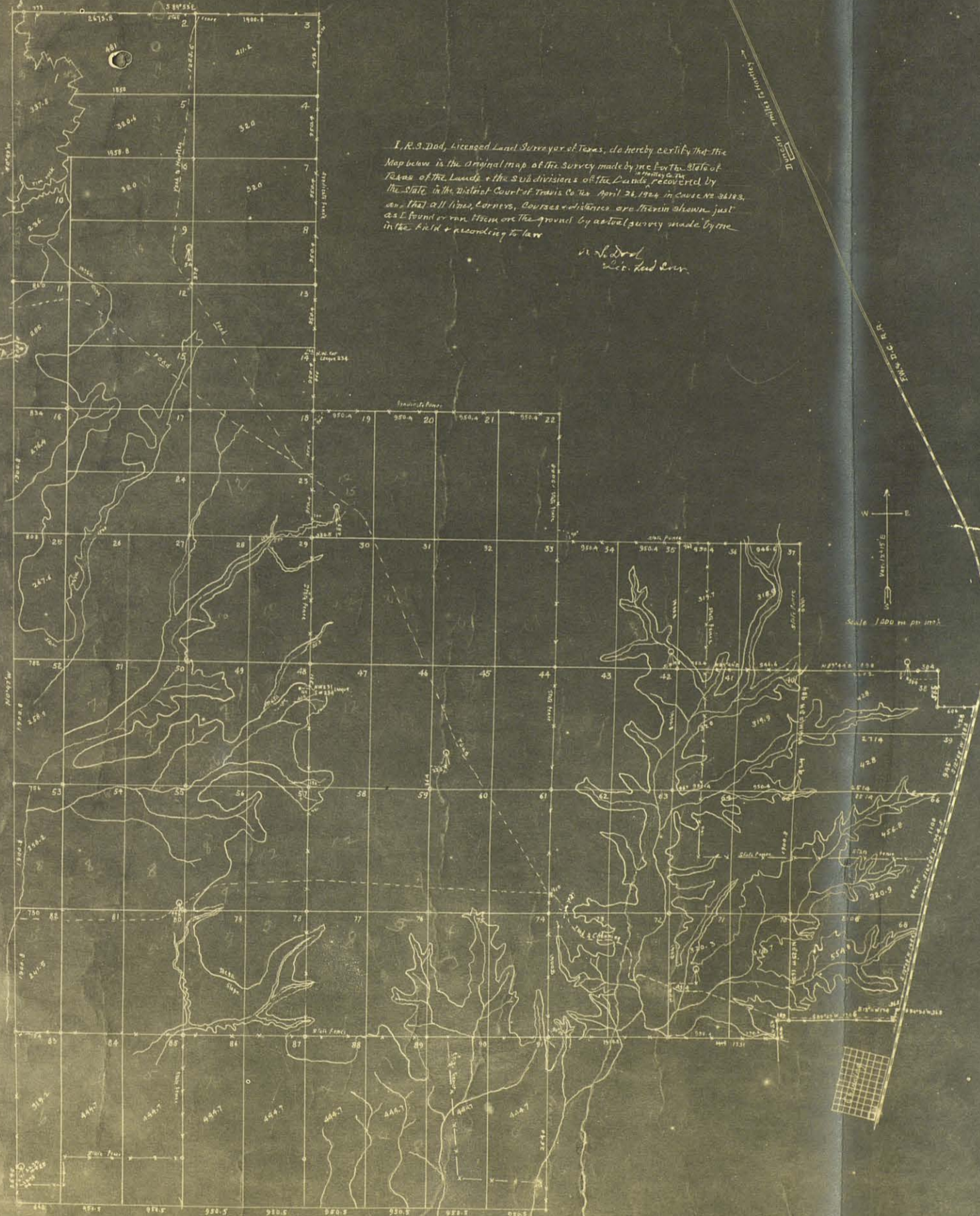

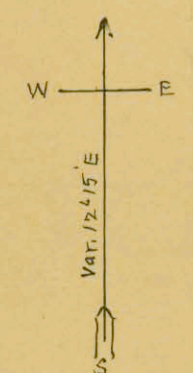
