Dear Mr. Friend:

The indications are that there is a strip of land about one-half mile wide and eighteen miles long lying north of University Blocks J, K and L, and south of the T&P blocks in Hudspeth County. I would like to impose upon your kindness to survey this block and return field notes to the Land Office.

It appears that it will be necessary for you to run all the lines except the divisional lines in surveying the University blocks. For that reason it will not be necessary for you to do any additional work on the ground. My thought is that from the corner of each University section you can extend a line north to connect with the T&P, which will cut the area into eighteen sections. If you will make the field notes in duplicate we can file one here and arrange with the surveyor at Sierra Blanca to record or file the duplicate as circumstances may require. The effect of the resurvey will be to give the Land Office positive control of the area, and enable it to lease it to better advantage than could be done should the area remain in the class of unsurveyed land.

This is to extend the authorization and the request for you to survey for the school fund any other tracts of unsurveyed land that your resurvey of University lands may develop. I am assuming that the University authorities under whom you are working will not object to your compliance with this request, and am sending the Chairman of the Board of Regents copy of this letter for his information.

SURVEYOR'S REPORT

During the summer of 1933 an extensive resurvey was made of what is called the "Alphabet Blocks" (Blocks A to N) of all University Land in Hudspeth County, operating under an Act by the Legislature approved March 29th, 1929. This body of land was surveyed originally by O. W. Williams in the year 1886, and he describes numerous monuments placed in various positions on the ground.

The North line of Blocks J, K, and L, and the East line of Block L were found on the ground to be fixed by monuments unmistakably identified, which were three in number. The NW corner of Block J was found, being a few stones in an old prairie dog town, one of which rocks, 4 inches in diameter by 1 inch thick, was marked "UL" on one side and "OW" on the other. On the South side of the old El Paso road, on the boundary line between Blocks K and L, was found a large stone 15" x 15" x 5", marked "Dos Alamos 15 1/2 M", and this is described by O. W. Williams as being 3063 varas South of the North common corner of Blocks K and L. These two corners fix the North line of the three blocks of University Land. Also, at the SE corner of Block L, University Land, an old stone mound of about 30 rocks, one rock 5" x 5" x 10" ~~in~~ face marked "UL 1886", was found and identified. A line through this rock mound northerly to intersect the North line at right angles establishes the East line of Blocks L and N, University, except where these Blocks conflict with the Texas and Pacific Lands.




Previous to the resurvey of University Land, Major W. J. Powell, a State Surveyor, representing and working for the owners of the Texas and Pacific Lands, also made extensive surveys covering all the blocks in the vicinity of the area East and North of University Land. Major Powell kindly furnished the University surveyor with copies of all his work, including plats showing his calculated position of all his corners. These corners were carefully checked in during the resurvey of University Land, and after thorough study of his construction as based upon the positions of original Texas and Pacific corners found, established by Jacob Kuechler in 1876, same was considered as being consistent, reasonable, and just, both by the Land Office and by the University authorities. Therefore, the South lines of Blocks 69, 70, and 71, Tsp. 2, Texas and Pacific, as held by their corners found on the ground, can not be made to coincide with the North lines of Blocks J, K, and L, University Land, as held by their corners found on the ground. They are pulled apart as shown by the sketch accompanying the fieldnotes of Public School Land Block JKL; consequently the call by O. W. Williams in the fieldnote of the University Land as joining the Texas and Pacific Land must be broken.

Major Powell's position of the common corner of Blocks 68 and 69, Tsp. 2, and Block 68, Tsp. 3, Texas and Pacific, is established by the intersection of a line running due South from a known Kuechler corner on the State line, and with a line running due West from the established common corner of Blocks 67 and 68, Tsp. 2, and Blocks 67 and 68, Tsp. 3, Texas and Pacific Land. Also, the SW corner of Texas and Pacific Block 72, Tsp. 2, is established in this same West line, being due South of the NW corner of Block 72, Tsp. 1, Texas and Pacific Land, established by course and distance patent call from the last known Kuechler corner on the State line. The North line of Block JKL, Public School Land,

is composed of three straight lines, each of which is a chord of a true parallel of latitude, the ends of which lie in the true parallel, and the courses of which are referred to true course along the State line North of Blocks A, B, and C, University Land.

The courses in Blocks J, K, and L, University Land, are called N 0° 46' W - S 0° 46' E and N 89° 14' E - S 89° 14' W, and the lines in Blocks A to H, University Land, are called North, South, East, and West because those lines in the first named blocks, when no attention is given to curvature and convergence, run 46 minutes to the left of the corresponding lines in the latter named blocks. The true course, however, of any survey, whether in University Land, or Block JKL, Public School Land, may be derived from the statement made in each fieldnote immediately following the statement of Magnetic Declination. All courses in Block JKL, Public School Land, are referred to courses named in the resurvey of University blocks.


PUBLIC SCHOOL LAND
