On July 25, 1933 the Commissioner of the General Land Office forwarded to your office photostat copies of fifteen plats, representing a survey made for the purpose of closing the public land surveys upon the boundary between the states of Texas and New Mexico, which boundary was surveyed by Samuel S. Gannett, U. S. Supreme Court Commissioner, in accordance with the decree of the said court in the case of the State of New Mexico vs. the State of Texas (276 U.
