Re.: Notification of a possible vacant public school land in Wise County, Texas.

As per Texas Occupations Code, Title 6, Subtitle C, Regulations of Land Surveying and Related Practices, Chapter 1071, § 1071.360. Discovery of Undisclosed Land, my obligation as a Licensed State Land Surveyor of the State of Texas is to "forward a report of the existence of the tract [undisclosed tract of public land] and the tract's acreage to the commissioner."

On April 27th, 2007, a representative for Swaim Engineering and Surveying contacted our firm to review and investigate what they believed to be a potential area of vacant public school land in Wise County, Texas. This area is located approximately 16 miles North 42° West from the court house in Decatur, Wise County, Texas. It is described by bounds as follows:

- Bounded to the north by the Waid H. Hudson Survey, Wise County Abstract No. 388 (Fan. 3-4372);
- Bounded to the east by the Falls County School Land Survey, Wise County Abstract No. 988 and Montague County Abstract No. 1575 (Fan. 1-1192);
- Bounded to the south by the George R. Jackson Survey, Wise County Abstract No. 1197 (Fan. Pre-2842) and the J. D. Jackson Survey, Wise County Abstract No. 1198 (Fan. Pre-2841);
- Bounded to the west by the Richard Gilliam Survey, Wise County Abstract No. 342 (Fan. Bounty-578), containing approximately 40.3 acres per patent field note calls.

I began my investigation with the copy of the Wise County Working Index map obtained from the General Land Office. This map shows that the General Land Office has a working sketch prepared in this area, working sketch number six (6) *{counter number 72620}*. This sketch was done for Bascom Giles, Texas Land Commissioner, in 1950, and shows this same area, but does not include the Woods Survey. The Woods Survey is described to be located in the northeastern inward corner of the Hudson Survey, completely in conflict with the Falls County School Land Survey. Wise County tax maps, other abstract maps, and a survey from a previous licensed state land surveyor have the Woods Survey situated in the northeast inward corner of the George R. Jackson Survey. I have prepared a working sketch of my own (see enclosed). I included the following land grants:

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Votification of a possible vacant

As you can tell, by this working sketch there appears to be a portion of public school land that has not been surveyed or sold. There is a lack of calls to adjoiners on any of these surveys in that area that would allude to excess in the surveys surrounding this vacancy.

I have researched the records at the Wise County Clerk's office. They have the county tax assessor's tax maps of the 1930s. This map did not account for that area as being taxed at that time and has labeled the area as possibly being owned by the state (see enclosed).

The above information gathered and used to determine this conclusion is the preponderance of evidence. My opinion is that field work would need to be done to give a more absolute decision as to the existence of a vacancy. At this time, no field work has been done by me.
