Enclosed you will please find blue print of some connections that I have made in the south portion of Gregg County. These connections as shown, represent positions of the surveys as they were recognized and marked on the ground. As you will notice on this sketch, there is considerable difference in the field note calls and the actual positions of the surveys and lines as they were on the ground. For instance, the field notes of the S. S. Barnett Survey call to begin at the Northeast corner of the Mary Van Winkle, but describes different witness trees, and as a matter of fact we find that the two surveys do not corner together. The W. J. McCreary calls to begin at the Northeast corner of the Barnett Survey; thence North 10 deg. East, and as a matter of fact this East line of the McCreary as recognized on the ground and marked runs North and South. This is probably due to the fact that the West line of the John Cole Survey calls to run North and South and it would seem that the land owners adjoining this line have used it as the North and South line. We also ran a connecting line along the North line of the John Cole Survey from the East line of the W. J. McCreary to the West line of the Haden Edwards Survey, and that distance is shown on the blue print. From the Northeast corner of the Mary Van Winkle, I ran south with her east line to her Southeast corner and find that this corner on the ground is actually 690 varas south of the Gregg and Rusk County line.

I am sorry that I cannot furnish you more information on this area for in 1931 I made a survey of most all of this area with Mr. George Hiland, a Licensed Land Surveyor, and most of the connections that have to do with the outside boundaries of the survey are in Mr. Hiland's possession, and I have been trying to locate him for the last two or three weeks but do not know his address, and for that reason it was necessary for me to go on the ground and get this information that I am sending you, and although it may not be worth anything to you, you are welcome to it.
