Notice of Public Hearing on Proposed Medicaid Payment Rates Hearing. The Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) will conduct a public hearing on October 17, 2014, at 2:00 p.m. to receive public comment on proposed rates for hospice routine home, continuous home, inpatient respite, and general inpatient care. The Medicaid hospice program is operated by the Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services (DADS).

The public hearing will be held in compliance with Texas Human Resources Code §32.0282, Government Code §31.021, and 1 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §355.105(g), which require public notice and hearings on proposed Medicaid reimbursements. The public hearing will be held in the Health and Human Services Commission Public Hearing Room, Brown Heatly Building, located at 4900 North Lamar, Austin, Texas. Entry is through Security at the main entrance of the building, which faces Lamar Boulevard.

Proposal. The payment rates for hospice routine home, continuous home, inpatient respite, and general inpatient care are proposed to be effective October 1, 2014.

Methodology and Justification. The hospice reimbursement methodology is located at the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 42, Part 418, Subpart G.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission Filed: September 12, 2014

Public Notice

The Texas Health and Human Services Commission announces its intent to submit transmittal number 14-030 to the Texas State Plan for Medical Assistance, under Title XIX of the Social Security Act.

The purpose of this amendment is to update the state plan's provisions regarding the prohibition against reassignment of provider claims by adding an exception for substitute physician arrangements. The amendment would clarify that no payment under the plan for any care or service provided to an individual shall be made to anyone other than the person providing such care or service, except in cases where a substitute physician sees a billing physician's patients for 14 continuous days or less under an informal reciprocal arrangement or for up to 90 continuous days under a formal locum tenns arrangement. The proposed amendment is effective July 14, 2014.

The proposed amendment is estimated to have no fiscal impact. The clarification of the State's substitute physician arrangements would align the state plan with the State's program rules without changing Medicaid fees, costs, or utilization.
