



DALLAS


BUSINESS DISTRICT

THE LAND OF BIG OPPORTUNITIES

The largest thing in the United States is the State of Texas. The Lone Star State, as it is familiarly known, contains one-twelfth of the tillable area of the whole United States. If farmed intensively, this State could produce all the food needed by our hundred million citizens, including meat, bread, butter, milk, eggs, sugar, honey, vegetables, fruit, berries, nuts, fish, oysters and a vast assortment of other things. More than this, there is ample gas and coal within the State of Texas to cook it as well.

Texas needs more farmers to till her fertile acres, and more manufacturers to utilize the products grown here and develop the natural resources and raw materials that occur in such profusion.

FARM TEXAS THOROUGHLY AND EVERYONE CAN EAT

The arable lands of Texas, if thoroughly cultivated, could produce far more farm products than any other State in the Union. Already it ranks amongst the Big Three which, according to the Annual Report of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, produce annually the greatest total value of farm products. Iowa and Illinois, neither of them having over one-fifth the total area of Texas, are this State's only contenders for first place. Lack of man-power to properly cultivate its lands is the only drawback that keeps Texas from outstripping all other States in farm production.

Texas needs farmers to settle and develop the vast areas of high-grade lands now used as open cattle ranges and to intensively farm immense areas that are now cultivated only in a superficial way. To the farmer

who comes to Texas now the State can offer the rarest and richest crop a farmer ever has.

THE RICHEST CROP EVER HARVESTED

Land values in many parts of Texas are comparatively low at the present time. It is demand that regulates the price of land, and when there is more land than the population can use to the best advantage, the value is naturally low in sympathy with the lack of demand. To the new settler Texas offers the most profitable harvest that any farmer ever reaped—the increase in the value of his land. This is the one crop that has made the farmer of our great farming States rich without work. There is only one such crop off the land, and the time to plant is now, and the place is Texas.

WHERE THOSE BALMY BREEZES BLOW

Covering an area equal to the size of half a dozen States, Texas naturally has climates and climates. Along the four hundred miles of Gulf Coast, the climate is tempered to semi-tropical by the breezes off the Gulf, being warmer in winter and cooler in summer than it would otherwise be. During the winter months the Gulf Coast country is one great health resort, to which visitors come by the thousands to enjoy the luxury of the tropical winter. In the northern portions of the State, and especially in the Panhandle country, the winters are of the kind to be found in any mildly semi-temperate zone. Texas winters outside of the Gulf area include occasional snow storms, or what the natives term "northwesters." However, it can be truthfully said that Texas has no regions of arctic cold or equatorial heat, the temperature for the State in general being mild.

THE SHORT HAUL TO MARKET

Texas now produces less farm products than it consumes. Millions of dollars worth of hay, grain and edibles are imported into the State each year to make up the shortage of home production. The home market is the shortest haul every time. This is the market that the new settler will find very profitable. In addition to the home markets, the farmer in Texas has the advantage of a network of local railroads covering all the best agricultural districts and connecting with trunk lines to the Gulf ports and to the larger cities of the Middle West.

The stockyards of Chicago, Kansas City, St. Louis and Denver are easily accessible from all parts of the State, while Fort Worth is the most important local market for cattle, hogs and sheep. Houston, Dallas and San Antonio are also live stock markets of considerable proportions.

Galveston, the great Gulf port, is the second largest exporting port of the entire United States, and has direct railroad communication with all sections of the State. From Galveston is a convenient outlet for farm produce to the big ports, not only of America, but of all the foreign countries.

WHAT GROWS BEST UNDER TEXAS SKIES

Cotton is far in the lead as the State's most important agricultural product. Texas, which produces twice as much cotton as any other State and five times as much as most of the cotton producing States, easily takes the lead as the most important producer of cotton in the Union.

Corn is second in importance to cotton, this being one of the leading corn-producing States in the Union.

Other important farm products are winter wheat, oats, sweet potatoes, rice, hay, peanuts, sorghums, peas, beans, garden vegetables, potatoes, melons, etc.

Fruits and nuts are of great commercial importance. Texas citrus fruits grown along the Gulf Coast include oranges, grape-fruit and lemons. These are justly prized for their fine quality and flavor wherever known. Figs are especially adapted to the soil and climate of the Gulf Coast and are great revenue producers.

Texas pecans are shipped North in many carloads each year, where they usually bring fancy prices. As high as one dollar per pound is frequently received for the thin-shelled varieties and fifty cents a pound for the native varieties. About twenty million bushels is the annual yield of the State's pecan trees.

Strawberries, blackberries and dewberries succeed remarkably well along the Gulf Coast. The vineyards of south-central Texas have been famous for almost a century, the fine points of grape culture having been introduced by the Spanish priests. Apples of the finest quality, as well as pears, apricots and California grapes, do well in the mountain valleys in the southwestern part of the State, where water for irrigation can be secured. The annual peach crop of the State is about four million bushels.

From the above, some idea can be gained of the extent and diversity of the fruits and grains that can be raised in the Lone Star State.

THE SUCCESSOR OF THE LONGHORNED TEXAS STEER

In the production of livestock Texas easily maintains first place. A large part of the meat supply of this coun-

try is represented by the cattle feeding upon the vast ranges in this State. But a few years ago most of the State of Texas was one vast open range. Things have changed in late years, ranches have been fenced and gradually reduced in size, but still the livestock industry is carried on in many sections on a gigantic scale. Range cattle continue to be first and most important in value of the livestock industry. Cattle from Texas ranges are shipped North by the trainloads each year to be fattened and finished for market in the grain-producing States of Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa and Illinois. The long-horned Texas steer of the early days is now succeeded by the Hereford, the Holstein and other high-grade beef cattle.


Texas ranks very important also for the production of horses, mules, sheep, hogs and angora goats. Of angora goats alone it is estimated that there are over two million in the State.

AN EMPIRE OF NINE KINGDOMS

Texas can be divided by soil and topography into nine general districts, the location of which is outlined in a general way on the accompanying map, for which we are indebted to the Agricultural Department of the Rock Island Route and to Prof. H. M. Cottrell, the well-known authority on agriculture in the Southwest.

Coast Plains—These are flat, almost level prairie, lying along the coast. Over a considerable part of these plains the slope is so slight that the rainfall has no run-off, and drainage is the important problem. The rice fields which make Texas rank second among the rice-producing States,

are in the eastern part of these plains. In the central portion of these plains truck gardening and fruit growing are important industries. There are many oil wells in this district.

Forest Area.—The country is undulating to hilly, and generally covered with timber. The pine forests and the great lumber industry of the State are located in the eastern part of this area. It is estimated that there are still standing twenty-five billion feet of pine and ten billion feet of hardwood. There are enormous deposits of lignite coal in this district.

Black Land Belt.—Named from the famous black, waxy prairie soils. This is the richest agricultural district in the State, and includes the cities of Fort Worth, Dallas, Austin and San Antonio. This is the corn and cotton section of Texas, although other parts of the State are adapted to these crops.

Llano Country.—Is hilly and rugged. It has large deposits of iron. In the northern part is artesian water and a rich, clay soil.

Limestone and Coal Country.—Large beds of bituminous coal. The country generally underlaid with limestone. Some irrigation has been started.

Red Bed Plains.—Great prairies with red clay soils. A great grazing country, well adapted to the raising of feed crops, and to raising and feeding of hogs and beef cattle, and to dairying.

Staked Plains.—Great level grass-covered plains, once given over entirely to range cattle. Well adapted to the raising of milo, cane and other feed crops, and to dairying, beef cattle and hogs. Over one million acres in this district is underlaid with an abundant supply of water, at so shallow a depth as to make irrigation by pumping highly profitable.

Plateau Region.—A plateau country, cut up by breaks and canyons, particularly adapted to grazing. The valleys are good farm lands; the rainfall is light, and irrigation is advisable wherever water can be secured.

Pecos Mountains.—A rough mountain country, largely devoted to grazing cattle. This section is cut up by several mountain ranges, with many breaks and canyons, and considerable areas of level land and valleys. It contains the highest mountains in the South, among them being El Capitan, 9,020 feet, and Baldy Peak, 8,382 feet. The quicksilver mines of the State are in this district.


WHERE THE GASOLINE COMES FROM

Texas is one of the greatest oil-producing districts in the whole world. One-fourth of all the oil produced in the United States is refined in Texas. Oil is found in many districts located in widely separated parts of the State. The extent and continuity has not yet been determined and probably will not for some time to come. Geologists consider that one of the world's greatest deposits of petroleum is now being opened up in Texas, and time alone can determine its extent and value.

Oil millionaires are one of Texas' most noticeable crops. The development of the oil industry has created a new crop of millionaires so extensive as to overshadow the fortunate ones of all the other great booms of history.

Eastern Texas is crossed and recrossed with oil pipelines carrying the product of the wells to the refineries and to the Gulf ports for shipment. Enormous refineries are a common addition to the rural landscapes.

Among the better known fields in point of production are: Burkburnett, Wichita Falls, Ranger, Goose Creek, Humble, Electra, Sour Lake, Breckenridge, West Columbia, Brownwood, Comanche, DeLeon, Batson, Damon's Mound, Spindletop, Petrolia, Hull, Saratoga, Moran, Archer, Iowa Park, Clay and Navarro counties. There are many others of equal fame and importance, with new discoveries being frequently made. Energetic drilling and development work is being carried on on a gigantic scale over an enormous area.




Business Districts of Leading Texas Cities

TEXAS THE WINTER RESORT

RECREATION AND BUSINESS FEATURES OF THE LEADING CITIES

All of the cities of central and eastern Texas are natural winter resorts to which thousands of visitors flock to avoid the northern winters. Here the visitor can stay in the open picking oranges, oleanders and roses, or bathing in the surf of the Gulf, forgetful of the zero mark on the thermometer.

There are numerous large and well-equipped resort hotels adjacent to natural playgrounds. The golf links, equal to the best in the country, are kept in condition for use every day in the year. For those who enjoy yachting, the land-locked bays along the coast offer

ideal courses. Surf bathing and the finest of fishing can be enjoyed all the year. Game birds in unbelievable quantities, geese, ducks, quail and snipe, make their winter homes here.

DALLAS.—The largest city of the State and one of the liveliest, most up-to-date towns on earth is Dallas, on the Trinity River. Here is a modern little city with sky-scrappers of the latest designs, fine theaters, country clubs, golf courses, parks, boulevards, colleges and everything else that most any other city can boast of.

Dallas is the great jobbing center of the State. It is the commercial hub of Texas. Here are several hundred factories. Here is a great inland cotton market. Here, also, is the cordial handshake of friendship and the true spirit of southern hospitality.

Good hunting and fishing are to be had near Dallas. Newly surfaced highways offer alluring drives through the wonderful farming country surrounding the city. Dallas is a cosmopolitan winter resort in every sense of the word.


HOUSTON.—One of the commercial cities of Texas is Houston, located but fifty miles from the Gulf. Here is an important railroad center, with manufacturing as its greatest asset. Lumber, oil, rice and cotton are the important industries, backed up by a large jobbing trade.

Houston is also a modern, up-to-date city, with many sky-scrappers, fine hotels, shops and theaters. It has a ship channel connecting with the Gulf, making it a shipping port.

Houston offers many interests to the winter visitor. It is known as the city of flowers, and this stands for a great deal along the Gulf Coast, where flowers are so abundant. There is a good eighteen-hole golf course at one of the most attractive country clubs of the South. Good duck and wild turkey hunting can be had nearby. The shell roads, fine and plentiful, winding through parks and woods, are a joy to the automobile. Excellent hotel accommodations are provided for the visitor.

The battle of San Jacinto was fought at Houston and the battlefield is now a State park. In this battle, General Sam Houston, bitter with the remembrance of the massacre of his comrades at the Alamo and Mission Goliad, attacked on April 21, 1836, the superior forces of Santa Anna and completely annihilated them and freed Texas from Mexican domination forever.

SAN ANTONIO.—Here is a land of perpetual springtime where

roses bloom in winter and where palms and semi-tropical fruits can be found in abundance. San Antonio is liberally supplied with first class hotels, where the tourist can be sure of bright social life. It is a far-famed health resort, with many curative sulphur wells.

While San Antonio is quite a ways from the coast, it is not far from Medina Lake, a considerable sized body of water between towering cliffs, that will appeal to all who love good bass fishing.


San Antonio is located in a farming and stock raising district and is quite a commercial and railroad center. The winter visitor will find a modern city with a variety of amusements and numerous places of scenic and historic interest to visit.

The Alamo, shrine of Texas patriotism, stands in the center of the city. Here Bowie, Crockett and Travis, with less than two hundred men, stood out to the bitter end against a force of four thousand Mexicans, and with their lives helped pay the price of Texas liberty in 1836.


In the vicinity of San Antonio are the picturesque ruins of several Franciscan missions built about 1700. Many of these are still in a remarkable state of preservation. Most wonderful of these is Mission San Jose, built in 1720. Its ruined walls, cloisters and towers, its statuary and carving, are ranked among the finest examples of Spanish art and architecture.

FORT WORTH.—In the cattle and oil country of northern Texas is the city of Fort Worth, which commends itself to tourists by reason of its genial climate and many points of interest. In the early days it was the big cow town. It is still the big cow town, but now in the sense of a modern market for livestock. In the early days of March each year, the city holds a livestock show that brings forth the best blooded horses, cattle and other livestock that have replaced the longhorns and cow ponies of pioneer days.

Fort Worth is a busy modern city with wonderful boulevards along the Trinity River and around Lake Worth. It has a number of

modern hotels. The mean annual temperature is 65 degrees, snow rarely falls and the freezing point is seldom reached.

GALVESTON.—The great Gulf port of Texas is located on an island. Surrounded by the warm waters of the Gulf Stream, the pleasure seeker in Galveston may spend the entire time out of doors.

Salt-water fishing as fine as offered anywhere can be enjoyed here. Tarpon, Spanish mackerel, speckled trout, redfish, pompano, all are here and in fighting trim. Hunting will be found on a short auto trip into the mainland to the heart of the quail and jacksnipe country. Deer and bear hunting may be had at no great distance.

Galveston County, with its two hundred miles of shell-surfaced roads and thirty miles of hard packed beach, offers real bliss for the motorist. Along the beach there is no speed limit.

To accommodate the constantly increasing winter visitors, Galveston has an assortment of modern hotels, suited to all tastes and all pocketbooks.

CORPUS CHRISTI.—Overlooking the broad expanse of Corpus Christi Bay is the city of Corpus Christi, the Naples of the Gulf, endowed by nature as a health and pleasure resort. Corpus Christi knows none of the rigors of a northern clime. Here the winters are always mild and open.

The city is well equipped with good hotels and rooming houses. In addition to these are hundreds of cozily furnished cottages to be had at reasonable rentals. Golfing, motoring, boating, fishing and bathing are among the daily recreations.

Motoring to the inland country is a favorite trip. A new two-mile causeway, spanning Nueces Bay, provides a splendid auto road to Rockport, Aransas Pass and nearby points.

BEAUMONT.—In 1900, when 20,000-barrel gushers began spouting on Spindletop, Beaumont became world-famous in a day. The oil industry is represented now by four large refineries. The climate of Beaumont is similar to that of the other Gulf Coast resorts. Fishing, boating, hunting, motoring, golf and surf bathing are all available. Duck, geese, quail and other game abound. In the Big Thicket, twenty miles away, is still greater excitement for the hunter. Here can be found turkeys, bear and other large game.

There are more than a hundred miles of hard-surfaced roads near the city. Hotels provide ample accommodations.

Winter Time at Corpus Christi

POR T ARTHUR.—Although one of the newest of the southern seaports, the docks and shipping facilities of Port Arthur make it one of the largest and most complete along the Gulf Coast. It is not located on the Gulf itself, but on Lake Sabine, and connected with the Gulf by a deep waterway.

Being also connected with the adjacent oil fields by pipe-lines, Port Arthur ships vast quantities of oil to all parts of the world. The rice and lumber industries are important.

Port Arthur has a climate that is the delight of the winter visitor and ideal for all outdoor sports. Here will be found excellent fishing, boating, bathing, tennis and golf. Plenty of hotel accommodations.

WACO.—In central Texas is the busy commercial city of Waco, built on the site of an old Indian village of the same name. Waco is an important jobbing and railroad center. It is considered one of the prettiest cities in the State and is noted for the number and beauty of its parks.

There is bathing and boating in the Bosque and Brazos Rivers, which flow together just outside the city. There is a good golf course, excellent roads and many other things that please the visitor.

The Texas Cotton Palace Exposition is held here during November of each year, continuing for two weeks.

AUSTIN.—The capital of the Lone Star State is Austin. The state house building is considered one of the finest buildings in the country and among the largest of the nation's public buildings. Here will be found the State Library and an extensive State Museum, with a liberal collection of historic relics.

Travis County has a thousand miles of excellent automobile roads. Lake Austin and the Colorado River give ample opportunity for bathing, boating and fishing. Austin enjoys a delightful winter climate. The hotel accommodations are of the best.

EL PASO.—The metropolis of western Texas is El Paso, the gateway city, located where Texas, New Mexico and Old Mexico join. El Paso is an important railway terminal, the headquarters for the mining interests of this section and a military headquarters. Just across the Rio Grande, which is bridged here, is the quaint, bedraggled old Mexican town of Juarez. A short street car ride takes the visitor from the modern American city, with its beautiful parks and buildings, into this town of adobe huts typical of the primitive life just across our border.

El Paso has short, dry winters and the many parks and plazas are pleasant loafing places. There are many fine hotels and an eighteen-hole golf course. Near El Paso is the wonderfully fertile irrigated district of the Rio Grande Valley.


MARLIN.—Thirty miles south of Waco is Marlin, the water of whose hot mineral wells possesses exceptional medicinal qualities. Modern sanitariums, hotels and bath-houses will be found here. There is fishing in the Brazos River and many beauty spots along its banks.

The city is on various State and National highways, so enjoys good roads. Here each spring come the New York Giants to prepare for the pennant race.

MINERAL WELLS.—A noted health resort is Mineral Wells, fifty-three miles west of Fort Worth. Nestling between two mountains and spreading out into the adjacent valleys about one thousand feet above sea level, it offers the tourist in addition to the benefits of its medicinal waters, a delightful climate and many forms of recreation.

Tennis, horseback riding and hunting are among the many sports. There is a country club with a nine-hole golf course.

BROWNSVILLE.—The historic city of Brownsville enjoys the distinction of being located at the most southern point in the western United States. It is an interesting combination of Spanish and American customs and inhabitants. There are good auto roads here, interesting irrigated land districts to see with boating, fishing and many things of general interest to see and do.


AUTOMOBILE ROAD SECTION

IMPROVING THE BYWAYS


Texas has made remarkable progress during the last decade in improving both main and secondary roads. Today Texas is building more roads than ever in its history, and its road bond issues for new work run far into the millions. The State has an abundance of exceptional road-building materials in its mountains and plateaus. Gravel beds are found in practically all parts of the State, from which surfacing material can be secured at small cost.

Considering its great size, Texas is already fairly well supplied with surfaced roads. In the southern part of the State shells are used and many miles of fine boulevards are surfaced with this material. Through the northern part, and especially in the black land belt, roads are being surfaced with gravel, and in some cases with bituminous material. In Western Texas the abundance of gravel and rock makes it possible to have good roads without an excessive burden on the taxpayers in this sparsely settled region. The dry climate insures the permanency of these roads.

In planning cross-state trips it is always wise to select the through routes, as indicated in the following logs and by the names and more pronounced marking on the accompanying map. These are the main traveled routes and receive more care. Supply and repair stations can also be found at more frequent intervals along these routes.

CONDENSED FACTS ABOUT TEXAS

The population is, 4,661,027. Austin is the State capital.

The total land area of Texas is 262,398 square miles, with a water area of 3,498 square miles. The extreme length north and south is about 735 miles, while the breadth east and west is about 775 miles.

El Capitan, 9,020 feet altitude, is the highest point in the State. Other high points are: Baldy Peak, or Mt. Livermore, 8,382 feet; Sierra Blanca, 7,000 feet; Franklin Mountains, 7,152 feet, and South Franklin Peak, 5,591 feet. The two latter are situated just north of El Paso.

The principal forests are in East Texas, and the prevailing growth is pine. In the western part of the forest region oak, hickory and ash are common.

Texas became a Republic in 1836. In 1845 it was annexed to the United States, becoming a State.

The Bluebonnet is the State flower.
