## INTERIOR.

### DOCUMENTO OFICIAL.

Comandancia general de Puebla y territorio de Tlaxcala.—Escmo. Sr.—En el momento de despachar el correo semanario he recibido por estraordinario un oficio del prefecto de San Juan de los Llanos, cuyo tenor es el siguiente.—“Son las cinco de la tarde en que he recibido del Sr. general D. Francisco Javier Gomez el oficio que á la letra cópio.—El comandante militar en este momento me dice lo que copio.—Tengo la mas grata satisfaccion en comunicar á V. S. que el pronunciamiento verificado anoche á eso de las doce, por los ingratos capitanes del batallon de Tres-Villas D. Lorenzo Calderon, D. Victor Ravelo y D. Ambrosio Herrero, acompañados del subteniente del mismo cuerpo D. José María Morlet y de los oficiales retirados teniente coronel D. Ignacio Bobadilla, teniente D. Juan Carrasco, y segun se dice el teniente coronel graduado capitán del regimiento núm. 12, D. Manuel Guevara, ha sido completamente sofocado en este dia, pues la tropa del citado batallon que es á mi cargo, aunque por el pronto lograron sorprenderla, á pocos momentos principió á desertárseles, presentándose en el edificio que elegí para que se me reuniera, dándoseles al efecto aviso por varios conductos, de manera que á eso de las ocho de la mañana, logré contar con la fuerza de unos setenta hombres. Todo el resto de oficiales de dicho batallon se me presentó á pocos momentos que supieron el escandaloso pronunciamiento del cuartel y contribuyeron en mucha parte á que la tropa abandonase á los traidores, y éstos convencidos del ningun prestigio que tenian en ella al ver como se le separaba, sin embargo de las precauciones que tomaron para evitarlo, se pusieron en marcha á las ocho de la mañana, con direccion á Orizava. Llegaba la fuerza á lo mas á setenta hombres que les quedaban y eso es la mayoría de reclutas, pues los soldados antiguos fueron los que se me pasaron, y en consecuencia hice salir sobre ellos la espresada fuerza que ya tenia reunida al mando del capitán de cazadores D. Joaquin Cervantes, con objeto de proteger la desercion que no cesaba en el enemigo aun yendo sobre la marcha.—En el punto de las Trancas llegaron á romper el fuego, que duró por mas de una hora, de que resultó completamente dispersa la

fuerza contraria, y dejando en el camino sus muertos y heridos, marcharon en aquel desorden unos cuantos hombres, habiéndoles quitado el parque y equipajes.

La division que salió de aquí ha regresado ya y por consiguiente queda establecido el órden en este punto; y en tal concepto V. S. podrá con vista á igualmente de las circunstancias que llaman su atencion por ese rumbo, resolver lo que crea mas conveniente, en cuanto á la marcha que tenía restrelta hoy con objeto de auxiliarme como manifiesta en oficio de esta misma fecha que recibí por estraordinario.—Y lo transcribo á V. S. para que se sirva inmediatamente comunicarlo al comandante general de Puebla para su satisfaccion, advirtiéndole que en este momento marchó para San Andrés con la sección de mi mando, á esperar los auxilios de boca y guerra que tengo pedidos, siendo el mas interesante que tornen para aquel punto las compañías de caballería que fueron á dicha ciudad á las órdenes del teniente coronel D. Manuel de los Ríos; todo lo que tengo el honor de comunicar, reproduciéndole las consideraciones de mi aprecio.—Y lo transcribo á V. E. para que se sirva elevarlo al alto conocimiento del Escmo. Sr. vice-presidente, protestándole con tal motivo las consideraciones de mi distinguido aprecio.—Dios y libertad. Puebla, setiembre 8 de 1833. Cosme Furtong.—Escmo. Sr. ministro de la guerra y marina.

PUEBLA, Agosto 29.

Muchos federalistas de esta ciudad, religiosos sin hipocresía ni fanatismo, dispusieron hacer un novenario solemne en el convento de Santa Clara, dedicado al Sr. S. Roque, implorando su mediacion para con Dios nuestro Señor, que nos libre de los estragos de la terrible epidemia que ya invadió, aunque benignamente, á esta hermosa ciudad. La procesión en que se llevó al Santo desde el convento de nuestra Señora de la Soledad en que estaba, fué edificante, lo mismo que lo han sido los ejercicios espirituales de mañana, tarde y noche; pero lo mas apreciable es que los predicadores que lo han sido eclesiásticos sabios y virtuosos, no han predicado mas que el Evangelio puro, exhortando á los fieles á la penitencia verdadera, que es la que destroza los corazones y no los vestidos, la que muere el corazón y no los semblantes. Al

contrario otros eclesiásticos en otros novenarios, (según se nos ha informado) abusando de su ministerio sagrado, no han hablado mas que de herejia, de ataques que suponen dados á la religion, de libertad é ideas liberales, de salir á pelear y derramar la propia sangre en defensa del dogma católico y de la iglesia perseguida, con otras especies que se ha dicho y parece con justicia que no son mas que comentarios ó explanaciones del primer artículo del plan de Arista. ¡Qué残酷! Convertirse de enviados para el consuelo de los fieles, en atizadores de la desastrosa guerra civil, que ha tomado el pretesto por quien la provocó; lo mismo que se trata de persuadir en los pólíticos. Suponemos que habiendo impiedad y herejia, fuera preciso declarar contra ella; pero ¡no sería en estas circunstancias necesario y conveniente usar de algunas precauciones oratorias; advirtiendo á los oyentes que las exhortaciones no servirían de escusa á los que ultrajan la religion, cuando se dice que la defienden? ¡Qué nada de lo que se decía era con el objeto de dividir los ánimos, que la obediencia al gobierno era un deber impuesto por el mismo Dios á todos los cristianos? Este sería el modo de combinar los extremos, de evitar el abuso de lo que se dice con buena intención, y de unir los ánimos; pues que “todo celo por la verdad que no es caritativo, dice San Francisco de Sales, nace de una piedad que no es verdadera.” Concluimos invitando al Sr. D. José Obando, que funge de gobernador, que cele y que contenga el mal, pues los frutos de las predicaciones de que hablamos, ya se experimentan en los pasquines que se fijan en las esquinas, y en que se lee defendamos la religion, muera el gobierno, y otras alarmas que traerán funestísimos resultados.

VERACRUZ, SETIEMBRE 1.<sup>o</sup>

Continuando nuestros ratiocinios sobre la educación, descenderemos hoy á la de las mujeres, tan abandonada por desgracia entre nosotros. Las mujeres, que con la leche de sus pechos, con sus cuidados, con sus tiernas caricias, nos alimentan desde la infancia y nos imprimen aquellas ideas que sirven de base á nuestra educación moral y civil, están condenadas á vivir oprimidas por la ignorancia y la mas ciega preocupación. El catolicismo del padre Ripalda, innumerables cuentos de viejas, el baile, la música, la

aguja, las visitas y las tertulias; he aquí por lo comun toda la ciencia que aprenden las jóvenes que deben gobernar las familias algún dia.

Una madre se considera vigilante y celosa de su casa cuando aflige á su inocente hija por bagatelas que debiera enseñarle á despreciar. En lugar de alimentar su corazon con los saludables consejos de la virtud, de hacerla entender los deberes que ha de observar algun dia, de fortalecer su entendimiento con raciocinios capaces de hacerla buena madre, la educacion que ordinariamente le dá, no tiene al parecer mas objeto que inspirarla el gusto de la moda y el de la vanidad, hacerla cuidar de las gracias de su cuerpo, y abandonar enteramente los adornos del alma. El modo comun de educar á las niñas dá á entender que la naturaleza les niega el don de la racionalidad. La ocupacion á que se les destina, es el adorno y las modas, y no se les conversa mas que de bailes, de tertulias y espectáculos: la desenvoltura es una máxima que se les enseña para ganar el aprecio y las adoraciones del otro sexo; y se les imprimen todas las ideas capaces de irritar las pasiones, en lugar de inspirarles el horror del vicio y de las acciones dishonestas.

No es de admirar, pues, que las mujeres criadas con estas lecciones impudentes, cometan yerros muy trascendentales á su honestidad, y carezcan de las virtudes necesarias para contribuir á la felicidad suya y de los demás. Parece que hay un temor fundado de que las cualidades morales del espíritu perjudiquen á los adornos visibles del cuerpo. ¡Triste error! ¡No vale mas ilustrar el entendimiento, que es el realce de la hermosura, el que fortalece la virtud y hace durables los encantos de la vida? Una joven entendida, bella y virtuosa, es el objeto mas interesante que la naturaleza puede presentar á nuestra vida.

No recibe este seco encantador, destinado á las delicias que disfruta el hombre, de cultivar su entendimiento y su razon: de esta manera ejercerá un dominio alhagüeño, en lugar de ese poder tan propenso al odio cuando se acaba la ilusion. Entónces las mugeres se grangearán los rendimientos sinceros, los homenages racionales, y abandonarán al olvido ese imperio esímero que ahora fundan en sus atractivos tan fáciles de marchitarse.

Nadie negará que de las costumbres de las mugeres nacen los hábitos que influyen en la suerte de los hombres. Por consiguiente, debe todo convencernos que mas cuidado en la educacion de esa mitad estimable del género humano, traeria una mudanza feliz y provechosa para la otra. Creemos, pues, que el estado fijará su atencion con interes en esa materia, y que proveerá lo que convenga á efecto de procurar la ilustracion de las mugeres, como que su trato, sus atractivos, sus cuidados y su natural ternura contribuyen no poco á la sociabilidad de las costumbres.

## ESTADO DE MICHOACAN.

MORELIA, SETIEMBRE 2 DE 1833.

Aunque en nuestros números anteriores nos ocupamos con sumo dolor de anunciar al público los estragos que hiciera en esta capital la desoladora epidemia que hoy afflige á muchos puntos de la república, no habia distraido nuestra atencion la muerte de algunos individuos en particular, á causa de que el cielo con benignidad habia preavido del terrible azote las personas que por su educacion, talentos y posicion que guardan en la sociedad moreliana, es igual la falta que produce su inexistencia al agudo sentimiento que al contemplar dilacera el corazón de todo buen ciudadano interesado en el lustre y mejoras de la misma sociedad; y sin embargo de que han sido de dos á tres de esta clase las que con suma perdida de Michoacan han desaparecido de nuestra vista, solo ocupará por esta vez las columnas de este periódico la temprana y desgraciada muerte del señor ministro fiscal de la Escma. Audiencica del estado licenciado D. Miguel Maceo, que acaeció á las tres y media de la tarde del viernes 30 de agosto último, en la casa morada del Escmo. Sr. gobernador. ¡Ah!

¡Qué podremos decir que haga un cabal y merecido elogio de jóven tan recomendable? A los treinta años que poco mas contaria de su lozana edad, habia despegado de un modo extraordinario los talentos de que lo dotara la naturaleza; sus conocimientos nada comunes, tanto en el foro como en política, la viveza y energía de su carácter, agregada á la noble finura de los sentimientos de su alma, hacian desde luego el mejor panegiris de su amable personal, y no podia oirse la cultivada locucion de su voz, sin inspirar en el corazon del que lo escuchaba las sensaciones mas puras del cariño, con cuyas ventajas, rara vez reunidas en un objeto, se habia consagrado exclusivamente á la santa causa de la libertad, trabajando en una manera asidua é infatigable en restaurar á Michoacan, al lado del ejecutivo, de la situacion agonizante á que lo han reducido los implacables enemigos del pueblo. No se afanaba por otra cosa ni otra cosa se oia sonar en su boca, que grandiosas proposiciones relativas á la defensa y seguridad del estado, á la mejora de públicos establecimientos y á todo aquello que tendiera á dar vida y ornamento á esta interesante porcion de la república mexicana, de que se sigue que todo ciudadano que davares, ama

que todo ciudadano que deveras ama a su patria, no puede menos que con llorosos ojos considerar la perdida irreparable que se ha tenido en la desaparicion de este joven colmado de virtudes, y nosotros por nuestra parte dedicamos á sus merecimientos los tiernos recuerdos que demanda la sincera amistad con que quiso distinguirnos y que se llevó á la lugubre mansión del sepulcro, en menos de nueve horas que duró su enfermedad, desde el primer ataque hasta el asaroso momento de su espiracion lamentable.


*En México, Colombia, Perú, Guatemala y Chile.*—De dos, á saber: cámara de diputados y senado.

Los legisladores americanos, conociendo los inconvenientes que trae el reducir á una sola cámara la representación nacional, la dividieron en dos, según se hizo en la república Anglo-estadounidense, y según lo han hecho otras naciones europeas, persuadidas que en ello se impedían los arrojos del patriotismo exaltado, y se balanceaba el equilibrio del poder legislativo. En la Península se hizo por el contrario un ensayo opuesto con la constitución de Cádiz, prescindiendo de lo que habían establecido los antiguos legisladores, y los resultados quizá no han acreditado de acertada la novedad. Siquiera hubiérase suplido el inconveniente con haber dado forma de senado al consejo de estado, ó á la diputación permanente, y se habría corregido el defecto cometido. Pero la estructura del consejo distaba mucho del objeto, y la de la diputación circunscribia á un círculo tan pobre sus funciones, que la imposibilitaba de obrar, haciendo al mismo paso concebir á los ciudadanos ideas equivocadas de su influencia y autoridad. Reducida la representación nacional á una sola cámara y en la cesación de sus sesiones á donde acudía el gobierno con las dudas ó dificultades que le ofrecía la ejecución de sus deliberaciones? Para conocer el vacío de la ley fun-

damental en esta parte, y lo que facilita las operaciones gubernativas un senado bien constituido, es preciso haber sido secretario del despacho en la Península durante la época constitucional. Decretos importantes han quedado alguna vez entorpecidos, porque habiéndose cometido una conocida equivocación en las cortes al estenderlos, el ministro carecía de facultades para enmendarlos ó explicarlos y cerradas las sesiones, no había autoridad alguna investida con poder suficiente para ejecutarlo, ni aun interinamente.

Cuando los ruidosos sucesos de julio de 1822 en Madrid, se tocó mas de lleno la falta de una corporación senatoria. En medio del cruento aprieto en que los sublevados pusieron á las cortes y á la nacion, ¿qué hace el consejo de estado? Se preguntaban todos. ¿Qué hace la diputación permanente? ¿Por qué no toman providencias? Pero ¿qué podía y debía hacer el primero, cuando la ley lo reducía á la clase pasiva de asesor del monarca, y en los casos en que requeriera su dictámen? ¿Qué debía escogirse á la segunda, ceñida por la institución de elegir todos los ca-

**IV.—BASE DE LA REPRESENTACIÓN NACIONAL.**—*En España.*—La población de españoles y extranjeros naturalizados, en razón de un diputado por cada 70.000 almas.

*En el Perú.*—La población en razón de un diputado por cada 120.

*En México.*—Id. uno por cada 80.000.

*En Colombia.*—Id. uno por cada 300 hasta que el número de diputados llegue á 100. En llegando á 150 en razón del aumento que haya adquiriendo la población, se elegirá uno por cada 400; y cuando exceda, uno por cada 500.

*En Guatemala.*—Id. uno por cada 300.

*En Chile.*—No baja el número de 50, ni pasa de 200 aunque progrese la población.

Si en los gobiernos representativos la bondad de su constitución sigue la razón directa del número de diputados del congreso, siendo más popular aquel que le reuna mayor, deberemos reconocer ventajas sobre todos á él de Colombia, cuyas bases están más sabiamente combinadas que las de los demás estados de América. La constitución chilena en esta parte presenta una exclusiva opresora. Prohibir que el número de diputados exceda de 200 por más que la población progrese, en nuestra opinión es un contra-principio político de fatal trascendencia.

En la mencionada constitución de Chile, ha llamado grandemente nuestra atención el nombre que se da á los representantes del pueblo. En los tiempos antiguos se llamaban *procuradores*, es decir, *poder habientes del pueblo*, y tanto en la constitución de Cádiz como en las que se han sancionado en América se les da el título de *diputados*, mas en Chile llevan el de *consultores*. „La cámara nacional, dice el artículo 60, tit. 9, es la reunión de consultores nacionales en una asamblea momentánea.” La letra de la ley indica que el pueblo ejerce en aquella república una soberanía fantástica, ó que se le lisonjea con decir que ésta reside esencialmente en él, al paso que se le limita á la clase de consejero, cuando trata de explicar sus facultades soberanas por medio de sus apoderados. Mas claro: en la república de Chile el pueblo es *moralmente soberano*, y asesor de otro cuando trata de llevar á efecto este atributo. Complicación original, que no presentó hasta aquí la organización de ningún gobierno libre. *Pedimos por merced*, decían los procuradores de las cortes de Castilla, cuando discutían los intereses de la nación, reducidos á la clase de consejeros, porque el ejercicio de la soberanía no residía plena y absolutamente en sus manos.

II.—Haber mejorado una posesión rural; ser maestro ó oficial examinado en arte ó industria, cuyas primeras materias las produzca el país; concurrir al establecimiento de fábricas; al de compañías de agricultura, minas ó comercio; proporcionar ocupación útil á las mujeres y mendigos.

III.—Ocuparse algún tiempo en la instrucción gratuita moral, científica ó industrial; trabajar un escrito, ó hacer un descubrimiento que contribuya á la prosperidad nacional; estudio de medicina, filosofía moral y ciencias naturales; haber sido declarado benemérito por sus costumbres en los institutos de educación; dedicarse á mejorar la moralidad religiosa y el culto sagrado.

IV.—Desempeñar graciosamente comisiones laboriosas por encargo de las autoridades públicas; servir útil y gratuitamente en las administraciones del estado; desempeñar sin interés las funciones municipales ó departamentales.

V.—Contribuir con su caudal, talentos ó trabajo personal á alguna obra pú-

blica; tener parte gracia y considerable en los caminos, puentes, calzadas y demás obras que faciliten el trabajo.

VI.—Contribuir graciosamente y de un modo considerable al establecimiento y mejora de cárceles, correcciones, hospicios, institutos de beneficencia y obras de policía, comodidad, aseo y ornato; ocuparse en el servicio de personas miserables, de enfermos é impedidos.

VII.—Contribuir graciosamente á cualquier gasto fiscal ó público.

VIII.—Ser padre de más de seis hijos legítimos.

A excepción de Guatemala, en todas las constituciones se requiere como calidad precisa para obtener el importante cargo de diputado, la mayoría de edad, fijada en los 25 años. La de Chile guarda en esto un profundo silencio, á pesar de la larga enumeración que hace de las circunstancias que deben adornar á los elegibles.

Vemos con placer que los legisladores americanos han mirado como base precisa para el nombramiento la de los haberes procedentes de fincas ó industria, y lo han calificado de tan obsolutamente preciso, como que han señalado las sumas sin que los detuviera el inconveniente de la poca divisibilidad de las propiedades y del atraso de la industria; consideraciones que hicieron á los legisladores de Cádiz diferir á una época incierta el plazo en que debía tener lugar en la Península una calidad obsolutamente indispensable, para que los congresos nacionales se compongan de individuos verdaderamente interesados en el bien público, alejando de la influencia legislativa á los proletarios, que jamás pueden mirar con verdadero apego los intereses públicos.

De la comparación de las constituciones resulta, que la de Cádiz limita la acepción de la propiedad de un modo que aleja de las asambleas nacionales á muchos hombres útiles, de cuya cooperación el estado debía sacar ventajas considerables.... Para ser diputado, dice el artículo 92, se requiere tener una renta anual proporcionada, procedente de bienes propios: decisión demasiado vaga por no especificar la suma, que parece escluir á los dueños de fábricas y artes, y á los comerciantes y á los hombres dedicados á las profesiones científicas. Las constituciones de América han mejorado esta parte, admitiendo á todos á la participación del honor del congreso, y fijando la cantidad.

Cuanto esta conducta hace altamente recomendable la sabiduría de los legisladores ultramarinos, apartando de ellos las acusaciones de ignorancia con que los sectarios del despotismo procuran, aunque en vano, desacreditarlos, otro tanto es digno de elogio el acierto con que los de Chile han fijado las calidades precisas de los diputados. Aunque los artículos de su constitución pertenecen á la parte reglamentaria, agena de esta clase de leyes, y aunque algunas de las cualidades descubren demasiada generalidad, se resienten de alguna inexactitud, y quizás reducen demasiado el número de los elegibles, nosotros no podemos menos de alabar la idea que se han propuesto sus

autores, que deja libre al mérito el acceso á los escaños de la legislatura, aleja las pretensiones desmedidas del egoísmo, estimula á los hombres á distinguirse por acciones útiles y benéficas, y hace al congreso depositario de la ilustración y honradéz nacional.

### NUEVOS APUNTES PARA LA HISTORIA DEL SEÑOR PORTUGAL.

Gobierno del estado.—Si entre los motivos que obligaron á esta guarnicion al paso que manifiesta la proclama de V. S. y desenvuelve el plan que se ha servido remitirnos, no se descubriera el de sostener los fueros y privilegios del estado eclesiástico, nos prestaríamos á concurrir á la junta á que V. S. se ha servido convocarnos; mas versándose aquellos intereses, nuestra delicadeza nos impide el sufragar para la elección del jefe político que conforme al mismo plan, debe regir interinamente este estado, y á cuyo efecto se dirige la expresada junta. *Por lo demás, nos animan los mismos sentimientos que á V. S., por la consecución y consolidacion de la paz, y estamos pronos á cooperar en cuanto podamos, y no se oponga á la lenidad de nuestro estado, para adquirir un bien tan apreciable en lo moral y en lo político.*

Sírvase V. S. recibir los testimonios de nuestra consideracion y aprecio.—Dios guarde á V. S. muchos años.—Morelia 26 de mayo de 1833.—José María Rayón.—Pablo Domínguez.—Señor comandante D. Ignacio Escalada.

¿Qué contestará el señor obispo de Michoacán á los terribles cargos que le resultan por la infidencia de unos hombres á quienes llamaba *medio de virtudes*? Si hemos de juzgar por analogía, creemos que S. R. es uno de los cooperadores en la actual revolución, y que no había mucha inexactitud en aquellas expresiones tuyas que tomamos por hijas de un corazón recto y virtuoso: *Mis eclesiásticos no observarán otra conducta que la que vean en su prelado.* Cuando el Sr. Portugal decía esto, ya estaba indefectiblemente en su conocimiento la anterior contestación que sus *ejemplares curas* dieron á Escalada, adhiriéndose á su revolución y en la que *ofrecieron cooperar en cuanto pudieran*: si lo ignoraba (lo que nunca concederemos) ellos son unos hipócritas detestables que no escrupulan engañar á su prelado y defensor *tan bueno*. ¡Cuántas inducciones muy naturales pueden sacarse de este nuevo descubrimiento! Es preciso no alucinarse, ni prodigar consideraciones á hombres vendidos á un principio extranjero; ellos nada perdonan para hundirnos en el abismo, y volvemos al yugo español. Firmeza; mucha firmeza, y hacerles sentir todo el peso de las leyes: ni la religión autoriza traicio-

nes, ni sus ministros están esentos de dar el cuñío al verdugo: la ley es una para todos; ¿por qué se ha de aplicar al desvalido, y ha de dejarse el puñal en manos de quien puede hacer los más formidables destrozos? Doblemos la rodilla ante el sacerdote que en la casa del Señor ejerce los sacrosantos misterios; pero aquél mismo sacerdote respete y obedezca ante un tribunal la autoridad del magistrado, **QUE NO EN VALDE TRAE LA ESPADA.**

### FANATISMO.

La idea de fanático y la de loco se asocian como sinónimas, porque en efecto, ¿qué otra cosa es un fanático sino un hombre que ha perdido la facultad de hacer razonamientos rectos y que mira los objetos de una manera diversa de lo que son en sí? Este trastorno mental lo persuade de que el hombre objeto de su encono lleva á cuestas la maldición de Dios, que es familiar del demonio, que su existencia en la sociedad es más contagiosa que la fiebre amarilla, que ha perdido todas las garantías, que es una acción meritaria asesinarlo, en suma los españoles hacen creer que tenía cola y una noche les era bastante para recorrer todo el universo con la velocidad del pensamiento, llevando tras si cuantos males son imaginables. Preguntamos: ¿no se parecen los caprichos de este héroe fabuloso á los gigantes, castillos, ejércitos y doncellas desvalidas que revoloteaban en el miserable cerebro de D. Quijote?....

De tantas extravagancias formaba en otros tiempos nuestro clero un dogma religioso, y la inquisición quemaba al que no creía tamaños desatinos: semejantes necesidades contribuían eficazmente á su sistema político y financiero, porque nos conducían cual rebaño de ovejas: amenazando con el infierno, nos inspiraban aversión á la libertad, como hermana del demonio, creaban el odio contra los extranjeros como hijos de Satanás, y percibían gruesas sumas por conjuros y desencantamientos.

Es cierto que nuestra revolución política ha proscripto muchas de estas patrañas, pero fueron muy hondas las raíces del fanatismo para arrancarlas del todo: todavía los infames asesinos creen dirigido su puñal por la mano del Eterno, ó afectan creerlo para perpetrar atrocidades venganzas; pero el loco por la pena es cuerdo, y no estamos en el caso de que ellos cubran de infamia el nombre mexicano con actos de la más estúpida barbarie. Rasgos de fanatismo son los acontecimientos de Zacualpan y un ejemplar de escarmiento debe curar esa debilidad cerebral, para que la vindicta pública tenga su debida satisfacción y los extranjeros y mexicanos una garantía. Hay cierta clase de delitos que aunque comunes, demandan presta represión por las circunstancias que los modifican y el que nos ocupa es uno de ellos.

**DEMÓCRATA.**—**Día 11.**—Análisis de un folleto desatinado de Oaxaca, impreso por los defensores de la religión y fueros que han jurado *contra federación ó muerte*: el desagradecido doctor Quiñones emigrado de Guatemala es su redactor, en consonancia con el otro su compañero Betancourt: según de estilo, inventan millares de triunfos conseguidos por Aristóteles y desastres en nuestras armas: forman un grande elogio del *valiente y equitativo* Canalizo, que según los dogmas de la religión pronunciada, saquea, mata e incendia como los jesuitas, *ad majorem Dei gloriam*.—En los periódicos de Norteamérica se vaticina feízmente de nuestra revolución y de los progresos que podemos hacer en la carrera comenzada, planteando reformas útiles que reclaman las luces del siglo y la felicidad nacional.

Los gabinetes de Viena, San Petersburgo y Berlín, han celebrado una estrecha alianza, no solo para los casos ordinarios de policía, sino particularmente para contrarrestar cualesquier planes de Inglaterra y Francia que tiendan á propagar las ideas liberales, y á sacar de la opresión á los pueblos de Europa.
