Dear Mr Owens:

Your letter of February 23d, reached <sup>me</sup> on the 24th and I am very sorry, that I could not fill your order, on account that you did not state the approximate quantity of fish and oysters you wanted, and as I was afraid that I would ship, or too much or not enough, I decided to inquire first. I showed your letter to Mr Gallagher and he immediately wired you by Federal Telegraph, requesting you to wire as to the quantity, but we never got a reply.

On Saturday it seemed to me to be too late to ship any, as I supposed that you wanted the fish for Sunday noon. When you want something for Sunday noon, we will have to buy on Fridays and it will reach El Oro on Saturday afternoon.

Relative to cost of articles, there is no need of remitting any amount, we will bill the cost as advance charges and this will save you the trouble of remitting.

I regret very much, that I did not have the opportunity to be serviceable to you, and you will find that it was not my fault. Anything you may wish, I will be always glad to attend to your requests. Believe me
