








Patio of a Residence

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Convent and School, "My Lady of the Lake"








SAN ANTONIO was founded more than two hundred years ago by the Franciscan Monks. Coming up from Mexico they claimed the country for Spain, laboring to convert the native Indians to Christianity. The early history is a series of battles with vicious savages and wild beasts. The chain of Missions on the outskirts of the present town were connected by an underground passage with the chief Mission "San Jose," where grain and supplies were stored in the old granary. It is said the Monks made use of this tunnel to work on the superstitions of the Indians, appearing in the different Missions without visible means of travel.




Arches, San Jose Mission

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


S AN ANTONIO has been under six flags, the Spanish, the French, the Republic of Texas, the Mexican, the Confederate and the American, or Union. The story of the struggle which threw off the Mexican yoke is a thrilling one. One of the best-known events was of the Alamo, where 183 men withstood an army and gave up their lives for liberty. In all the annals of history there is no story of heroism more superb. Davy Crockett and Bowie both died with the fall of the Alamo.

Concepcion Mission






OMMERCIALLY San Antonio is of no mean importance. The center of a contributing territory as large as the State of Ohio, it has developed more rapidly than any other city of the Southwest. The soil immediately north and west is very rich. Well populated, chiefly by thrifty German farmers who settled on this land some sixty years ago, it has, through their industry, been transformed from a region given over to sheep and cattle raising into a rich agricultural country. Between San Antonio and the Rio Grande, 152 miles away, in the past few years the country has been wonderfully developed through irrigation, both from artesian wells and streams flowing to the Gulf. Last year there was shipped to market from this district over 3,000 carloads of Bermuda onions alone, as well as 1,000 cars of other vegetables. Only a few years ago nothing but mesquite and cacti flourished in this desert land, which has now begun indeed to "blossom like the rose." The manufacturing interests of San Antonio are of considerable importance. It supports six National, three State and four private banks, with deposits amounting to fifteen million dollars annually.

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SPLENDID TRAIN SERVICE

THE IRON MOUNTAIN ROUTE (including the St. Louis, Iron Mountain & Southern, the Texas & Pacific and the International & Great Northern railways) operates two fast through trains daily between St. Louis and San Antonio, connecting with all trains arriving at and departing from Union Station in St. Louis. These trains afford tourists from and to points in the North and East a continuous and practically a through service from their homes to San Antonio. These trains are equipped with the latest design of electric-lighted sleepers and dining car service a la carte. The sleeping car on train leaving St. Louis in the morning starts from Chicago via the Chicago & Alton R. R. midnight train, thus giving through sleeping car service, Chicago to San Antonio. Close connections are made in St. Louis, both morning and evening, by the trains on all other Chicago-St. Louis lines.

Representatives of these companies at Union Station in St. Louis give special attention to lady passengers, children and invalids, and may be freely called upon for information and assistance. The train employes are courteous and accommodating and strive to make the journey pleasant.


The route follows the Mississippi River for more than twenty miles south of St. Louis and thence through the famous Ozark Mountains and on to Little Rock, the capital and metropolis of Arkansas.

Passengers taking the Iron Mountain Route to San Antonio have the privilege of stopping off at Little Rock or Benton, from which a side trip can be taken to the famous Hot Springs of Arkansas for a slight additional cost. This is one of the world's famous resorts and anyone passing so near should by no means miss it.

From Memphis on the east and Fort Smith, Kansas City, St. Joseph and Omaha on the west and north, a service is operated which furnishes prompt connections at Little Rock with the through trains to San Antonio, all intermediate points being thus brought into convenient reach.
