


OBSERVATION TOWER AT ARMY POST, FORT SAM HOUSTON






MISSION CONCEPCION FOUNDED IN 1731 BY THE FRANCISCAN FATHERS NEAR THE HOT WELLS LINE





BUSINESS DISTRICT

The retail business section of the city is principally concentrated around the down town loop, which lies between Alamo Plaza and Main Plaza, connected by Houston and Commerce Streets. The hotels and theatres are in this district. All street car lines are routed on some part of this loop.

DEPOTS

The I. & G. N. and the S. A. U. & G. depot on W. Houston Street, is on the West End and the Prospect Hill car lines.

The S. P. and M. K. & T. depot on E. Commerce Street, is on the S. P.-M. K. & T. line.

The S. A. & A. P. depot at So. Alamo and So. Flores is on the Sap Depot, the So. Flores and the Collins Gardens lines.

RESIDENCE DISTRICT

Almost every car line in town leads to a beautiful residence district. Typical of the fashionable districts is Laurel Heights on the San Pedro line and Alamo Heights on the Alamo Heights line. The Sap Depot line passes through a section of very handsome old-fashioned homes.

STREET CAR SERVICE

The first cars leave the ends of every line at 6:00 A. M. or earlier, and each night at the 12.15 A. M. line up, the last cars leave the city for the end of each line. Most of the lines have a minimum headway of not less than 10 minutes.




WEST END LAKE. BOATING, FISHING AND PICNIC GROUNDS.

WEST END LAKE

West End Lake is a large, beautiful, artificial lake covering many acres. With its surrounding grove of trees, it makes an ideal place for a picnic and pleasure ground. Good fishing is enjoyed here almost the entire year and pleasure boats furnish opportunity for recreation and amusement.

There are a number of schools and colleges located near the lake among which are Peacock's Military Academy, Saint Louis College for Boys, San Antonio Female College and Marshall Training School.

The West End car goes to these points.

ARMY POST

Fort Sam Houston is the division headquarters and concentration camp of the Southern Division of the United States Army, and also the mobilization point for the National Guardsmen. When present plans are completed it will be the largest Post in the United States.

Dress parades, drills and band concerts furnish sight-seers an unusual opportunity to witness the United States Army at its best. From the Observation Tower in the Quadrangle a view of the entire Post, as well as of the city, is obtained.

The Army Post line runs direct to entrance.

BRACKENRIDGE PARK


Brackenridge Park is conceded to be one of the finest natural parks in the United States. It is a large tract of woodland park through which winds the San Antonio River. Many miles of beautiful driveways traverse the park from end to end, winding in and out through the grove of pecan and oak trees and along the banks of the river.

The park has many interesting and unusual features. Chief of these is Lambert's Bathing Beach, the delight of hundreds of bathers, who take advantage of the opportunity afforded for a plunge in the river daily, throughout the entire year. Free checking and dressing rooms have been provided by the city for the convenience of the bathers. The river has been deepened and widened at this point and a large sand beach provided. The picnic grounds in connection are furnished with rustic seats and tables, and grills have been built for those who wish to cook their lunches.


The Municipal Zoo in the park contains animals from all parts of the world, and is a delight to children and grown-ups.

Baseball grounds, tennis courts and golf course have been provided for the free use of the public.


This park is located on the Alamo Heights car line.

SAN PEDRO PARK

One of the most historic places in the city is San Pedro Springs Park. On this spot was located the first settlement of San Antonio. An old military block house still stands as a landmark of the early days. A small artificial lake in the center of the park is surrounded by a grove of giant pecan and oak trees. The park is one of the large play-grounds for the children and the bathing pools constructed for them are used daily throughout the year. Patriotic celebrations are usually held in this park.

Take the San Pedro or Beacon Hill car.




WINTER GARDENS A VIEW OF ONE OF THE WINTER GARDENS
ON THE COLLINS GARDEN LINE


WINTER GARDENS

The Winter Gardens furnish a novel and interesting sight to visitors, especially those from the north. This large tract of garden land has been subdivided into small farms of twelve acres each, and these are rented to tenants. Fruits, berries and vegetables are grown in great variety the entire year. Water from a large artesian well on the property is used for irrigation and domestic purposes. This well has a flow of over a million gallons of water a day. A network of small irrigation canals may be seen from the car line.

These gardens can be reached by the Collins Garden line.

THE MISSIONS

The old Missions should be seen by every visitor. Nearly 200 years old, they stand to-day a fitting monument to the days of Spanish occupancy.

Mission Concepcion, a half mile west of the Hot Wells car line, on Mitchell Street, is in an excellent state of preservation, and services are still held in it.

The San Jose Mission three-quarters of a mile west from the Hot Wells, is one of the best examples in existence of the old Spanish architecture.

HOT WELLS

A place of unusual interest to visitors is the Hot Wells resort with its large bathing pools, ostrich farm, out-door cafe and pavilion. The Hot Wells car goes direct to entrance.


TERRELL'S WELLS

San Jose Beach is situated five miles southwest of the city. This pool is very large and has a beach of gulf sand, brought from the coast. Running water is supplied from the Terrell's Wells and canvas awnings protect the bathers from the sun.

The South Flores line connects with the San Jose car.
